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1. Introduction

Route Changes for 2011

- The Service Park will be located at the Royal Welsh Showground, Builth Wells. This is the location that has been used for Remote Service in recent years and all competitors will service inside the buildings on the site.
- The Shakedown, to be held on Wednesday afternoon, and Scrutineering will take place at Builth Wells.
- The FIA pre event press conference will be held in Builth Wells.
- The rally will start in Llandudno on the North Wales coast on Thursday afternoon. There will be 3 special stages on Thursday with a Remote Service and overnight halt in Llandudno.
- The overnight Parc Fermé on Friday and Saturday will be in Cardiff. The Finish will also be held in Cardiff on Sunday afternoon.
- Rally HQ will be located in the Wales Millennium Centre in Cardiff Bay.
- Early check in will be permitted at the Parc Fermé on Friday and Saturday evening.
- Reconnaissance will take place on Monday and Tuesday.

Changes to the Special Stages from 2010

Thursday 10 November

All the special stages on this day are new. The first two stages will be held on asphalt roads at the Great Orme (last used on this event in 1981), the other stage will use the gravel roads of Clocaenog Forest which were last used on this event in 1996.

Friday 11 November

All the special stages on this day are new. The stages in Dyfi Forest were last used by the rally in 1996 and Dyfnant Forest was last used in 1997.

Saturday 12 November

The special stages in Hafren, Sweet Lamb and Myherin are exactly the same as used last year.

Sunday 13 November

The special stages at Halfway, Crychan and Monument are all revised from last year and will, generally, run in the reverse direction. Halfway and Crychan will again include a mixture of asphalt and gravel roads.

4.2 Criteria for Acceptance of Entries

The maximum number of entrants will be 80 cars. If more than 80 entries are received the acceptance of entries will be at the discretion of the organisers. A reserve list of a maximum of 10 cars will be created.

To enable amateur crews to have the maximum time to prepare for the event, the first 30 eligible amateur entries received will automatically be accepted. The full entry fee must accompany the entry and this can be paid by credit card, cheque or bank transfer.

To be eligible for the amateur category neither crew member may be entered on any priority list by the FIA or MSA for rallies in 2011. The vehicle is not the property of a motor manufacturer or importer. The entrant does not receive support from a motor manufacturer or importer or related sponsor. The vehicle must be entered by one of the crew members. The organiser's decision on eligibility for this category will be final.

5. Service Park

5.1 Location

The Service Park is located in the Royal Welsh Showground in Builth Wells. The postcode for this location is LD2 3SY; the GPS reference is N52 09.384 W3 24.318

The Service Park will be open from Monday morning. Teams will be permitted to park their vehicles on site on Sunday evening in preparation for set up on Monday.

A Rally Office will be open in the Hafod Hendre building at the Service Park from Monday 7 November until Sunday 13 November. This office will operate a duplication of the official notice board at Rally HQ in Cardiff.

The service park has a surface of tarmac. Security will be provided on site from Monday 7 November until Monday 14 November. If you require any additional private security on site please contact the Rally Office.

6. Two-way Radio

6.1 Application Procedure

Ofcom is the regulator for the UK communications industries, with responsibilities across television, radio, telecommunications and wireless communications services.

Any radio equipment used by a competitor and/or the associated support teams in the UK, must be covered by a licence issued by Ofcom.

Its operation must be strictly within the terms and conditions of the licence. The installation or use of equipment without a licence, or outside the terms, renders the operator/installer liable to prosecution. Upon conviction the equipment is liable to forfeiture together with fines and/or imprisonment.

6.2 Scrutineering

To ensure that illegal equipment (or unauthorised frequencies) are not used during the rally, Ofcom staff will be inspecting competitors' radio equipment at the pre-event scrutineering and will also be present throughout the event itself to monitor and check radio equipment in the rally cars and service vehicles.

6.3 Airborne and Other Requirements

7. Import of Vehicles and Spare Parts

7.1 Competitors from the European Union

Competitors coming from the European Union do not need to make any special customs clearance. They may use any vehicle in Great Britain for up to 6 months, provided that the vehicle is not brought with the intention of selling it. All vehicles need to have valid traffic insurance.

Tyres and spare parts can also be imported without clearance.

Competitors coming from outside the European Union will have to report to customs on their arrival in Great Britain. Please prepare a list of all the tools and equipment you are bringing with you.

11. Reconnaissance

11.1 Registration

A reconnaissance record card will be supplied which must be carried in the car for the duration of the reconnaissance. This card will be stamped appropriately recording every run on each special stage. Failure to produce this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance. Competitors will be issued with 3 reconnaissance numbers that must be fixed to the rear windscreen and rear side windows.

11.2 Number of passages

Competitors are permitted a maximum of two passages over each special stage venue during reconnaissance.

11.3 Speed Limit and Direction of travel

The maximum speed limit will be 80kph. The fitting or carrying of radar detection equipment during reconnaissance is not permitted.

Competitors are reminded that the roads are not closed during reconnaissance and vehicles may be travelling in the opposite direction to rally traffic. Under no circumstances may competitors drive in the opposite direction of rally traffic unless instructed by an official of the event.

11.4 FIA tracking

The FIA will require a certain number of competitors to install a tracking system to their vehicles during the reconnaissance. Further details will be given in Rally Guide 2.

11.5 Sanctions

For all infringements of the reconnaissance regulations the penalties are at the discretion of the Stewards. In any case, the Organisers must forward to the FIA the names of each competitor and driver committing an offence, in order to monitor regular offenders.

News and information can be supplied, free of charge, before, during and after the event to journalists and publications who are unable to attend the rally, or do not qualify for accreditation.

3.1. UK Based Radio Stations

- b) A completed Accreditation Form (See Page 4).

 - c) Written confirmation of the publications frequency and its circulation or readership figures.
 - d) A current and original copy of the publication.
 - e) Examples of all published material from 2010 Wales Rally GB, if either the applicant or the publication were accredited.
 - f) Requests from freelance Journalists/Photographers must be accompanied by copies of their published work during the last 12 months, specifying the names of the newspapers / magazines in which the work has been published.
- NOTE: c) and d) do not apply to major International press agencies. e) does not apply to publications applying for the first time.

5. Guidelines and Information for Accreditation Applications

- a) Up to a maximum of three (3) representatives per organisation will be considered for accreditation by the FIA. A separate application form should be submitted for each person to be accredited.
 - b) To be accredited, a publication must:
 - i) have a circulation size and quality that satisfies the criteria of the FIA.
 - ii) be on sale to the public.
 - c) Accreditation for Press Photographers: The FIA provides 12 (twelve) photographer Tabards for UK-based Photographers. Priority will be given to national publications and agencies based on circulation, frequency and previous coverage of Wales Rally GB.
 - d) Advertising, PR, marketing, or sponsor representatives are not eligible for accreditation.
- Once applications have been processed by Wales Rally GB and approved by the FIA, a letter or email confirming successful accreditation will be sent to the applicant(s).

This letter must be produced when collecting passes at the event.

No pass(es) can be collected without this confirmation.

The Police can order Breathalyser tests of drivers. The maximum permitted level of alcohol in the bloodstream is 0.08%.

Traffic Rules

Drive on the LEFT, and overtake on the right.

There are no motorway tolls once you have entered Wales. If you are driving to Cardiff from London there is a toll to cross the Severn Bridge on the M4 or M48. The toll is £5.70 for a car and can only be paid in cash. Toll charges for trucks and trailers will vary.

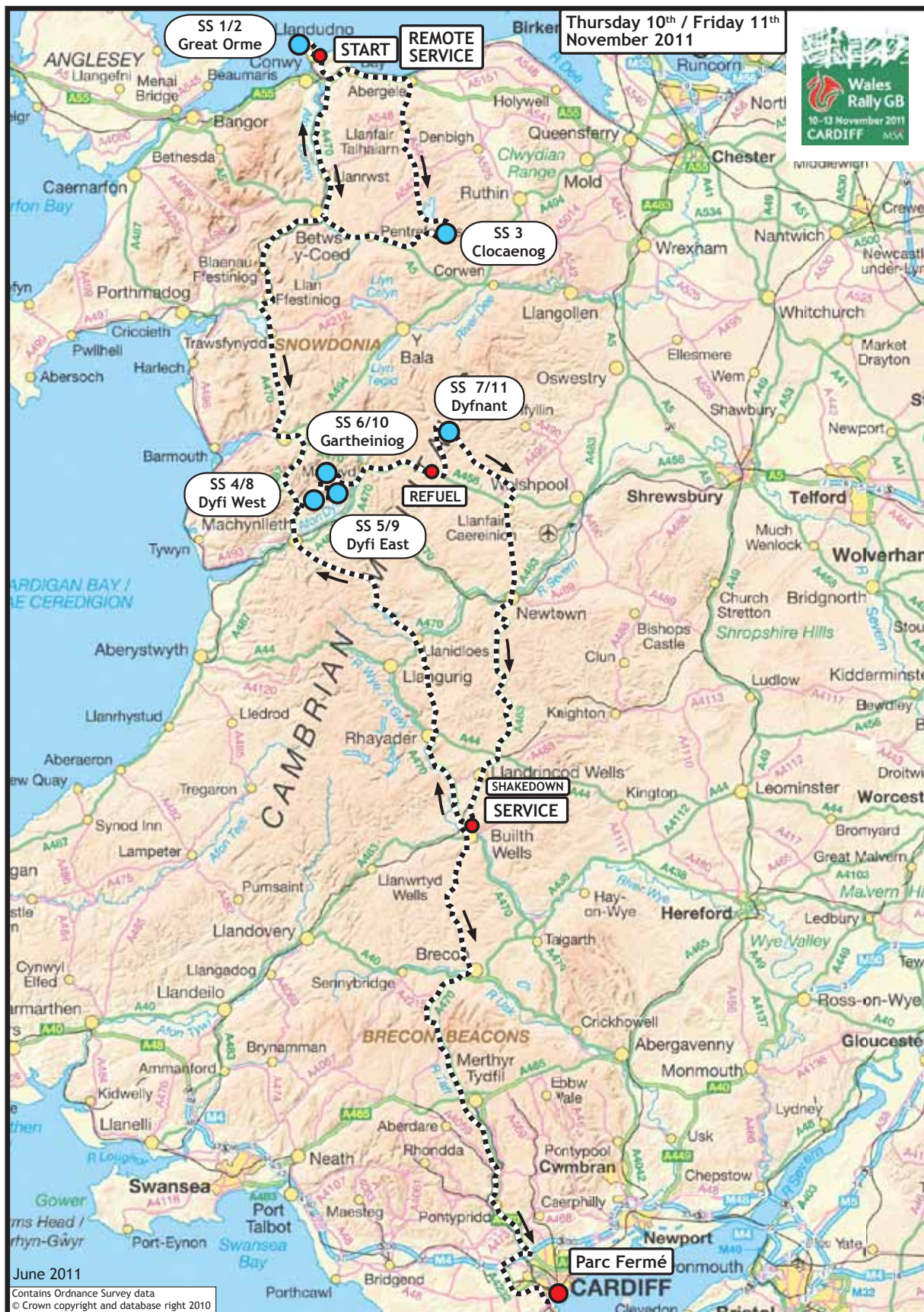

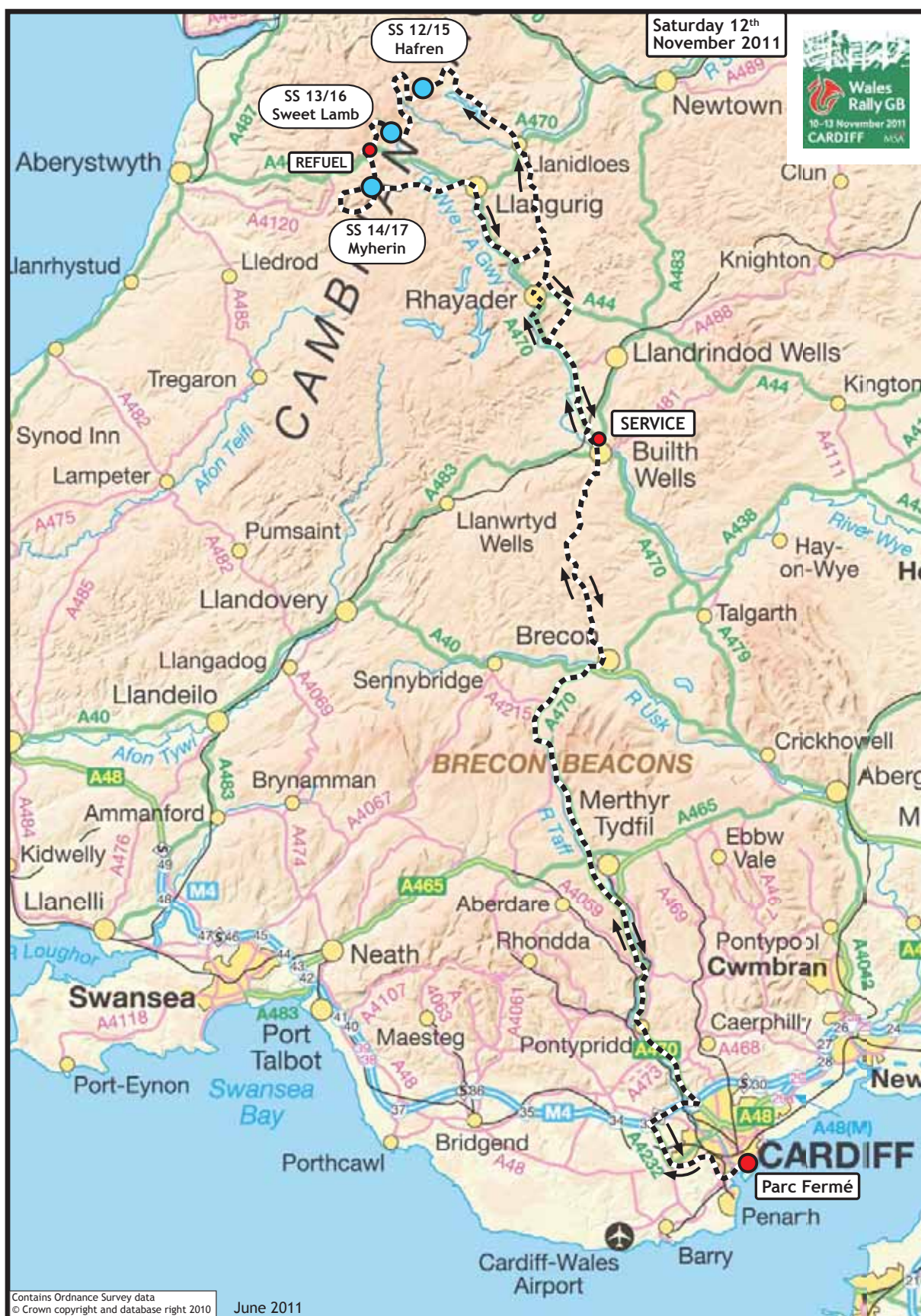
