#### 1.1 Route Changes for 2012

#### 4.2 Criteria for Acceptance of Entries

The maximum number of entrants will be 80 cars. If more than 80 entries are received the acceptance of entries will be at the discretion of the organisers. A reserve list of a maximum of 10 cars will be created.

To enable amateur crews to have the maximum time to prepare for the event, the first 30 eligible amateur entries received will automatically be accepted. The full entry fee must accompany the entry and this can be paid by credit card, cheque or bank transfer.

To be eligible for the amateur category:

- neither crew member may be entered on any priority list by the FIA or MSA for rallies in 2012.
- the vehicle is not the property of a motor manufacturer or importer.
- the entrant does not receive support from a motor manufacturer or importer or related sponsor.
- the vehicle must be entered by one of the crew members.

The organiser's decision on eligibility for this category will be final.

#### 5. Service Park

#### 5.1 Location

The Service Park will be located in the Cardiff Bay area around the Wales Millennium Centre. The postcode for this location is CF10 5AL; the GPS reference is N51 27.902 W03 09.800.

The Service Park will be open from Monday morning. Earlier access may be possible by prior arrangement with the organisers.









The service park has a surface of tarmac and level gravel. Security will be provided on site from Monday 10 September until Monday 17 September. If you require any additional private security on site please contact the Rally Office.

# 6. Two-way Radio

#### 6.1 Application Procedure

Ofcom is the regulator for the UK communications industries, with responsibilities across television, radio, telecommunications and wireless communications services.

Any radio equipment used by a competitor and/or the associated support teams in the UK, must be covered by a licence issued by Ofcom.

Its operation must be strictly within the terms and conditions of the licence. The installation or use of equipment without a licence, or outside the terms, renders the operator/installer liable to prosecution. Upon conviction the equipment is liable to forfeiture together with fines and/or imprisonment.

#### 6.2 Scrutineering

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To ensure that illegal equipment (or unauthorised frequencies) are not used during the rally, Ofcom staff will be inspecting competitors' radio equipment at the pre-event scrutineering and will also be present throughout the event itself to monitor and check radio equipment in the rally cars and service vehicles.

#### 6.3 Airborne and Other Requirements

If your requirements are not met by the above, particularly if you require airborne use, exclusive channels or continuous carrier, you should contact JFMG Ltd who distribute Programme Making and Special Events licences on behalf of the Secretary of State.

# 7. Import of Vehicles and Spare Parts

#### 7.1 Competitors from the European Union

Competitors coming from the European Union do not need to make any special customs clearance. They may use any vehicle in Great Britain for up to 6 months, provided that the vehicle is not brought with the intention of selling it. All vehicles need to have valid traffic insurance.

Tyres and spare parts can also be imported without clearance.

#### 7.2 Competitors from outside the European Union

Competitors coming from outside the European Union will have to report to customs on their arrival in Great Britain. Please prepare a list of all the tools and equipment you are bringing with you.

Wales Rally GB is round 10 of 13 of the 2012 FIA World Rally Championship and has to apply strict criteria for media accreditation set out by the FIA, the international governing body of motor sport.

Please read the following guidelines carefully and make sure all the information requested is supplied with your accreditation application and it is posted to the appropriate address. Failure to supply the requested information, or to sign the disclaimer, will delay the processing of your application.

Accreditation provides access to the media facilities in Rally HQ and the Service Park in Cardiff and designated areas in Special Stages.

News and information can be supplied, free of charge, before, during and after the event to journalists and publications who are unable to attend the rally, or do not qualify for accreditation.

Wales Rally GB is allowed nominate five (5) national/local radio stations to broadcast from the event. A Maximum of two (2) passes will be issued to each Station.

Applications should be submitted by Friday 10th August 2012 to allow time for approval.

#### 4. United Kingdom Print Media & Photographers

Applications must arrive prior to Friday 10th August 2012.

- 4.1. Information to be supplied with each application
  - a) A formal request for accreditation, written on the publication's official letterhead, signed by a Director of the publication or the Editor.
     Requests signed by clerical staff will not be accepted.
  - b) A completed Accreditation Form.
  - c) Written confirmation of the publications frequency and its circulation or readership figures.
  - d) A current and original copy of the publication.
  - e) Examples of all published material from 2011 Wales Rally GB, if either the applicant or the publication were accredited.
  - f) Requests from freelance Journalists/Photographers must be accompanied by copies of their published work during the last 12 months, specifying the names of the newspapers / magazines in which the work has been published.

NOTE: c) and d) do not apply to major International press agencies.

e) does not apply to publications applying for the first time.

#### 5. Guidelines and Information for Accreditation Applications

a) Up to a maximum of three (3) representatives per organisation will be considered for accreditation by the FIA.

A separate application form should be submitted for each person to be accredited.

- b) To be accredited, a publication must:
  - i) have a circulation size and quality that satisfies the criteria of the FIA.
  - ii) be on sale to the public.
- c) Accreditation for Press Photographers: The FIA provides 12 (twelve) photographer Tabards for UK-based Photographers. Priority will be given to national publications and agencies based on circulation, frequency and previous coverage of Wales Rally GB.
- d) Advertising, PR, marketing, or sponsor representatives are not eligible for accreditation.

Once applications have been processed by Wales Rally GB and approved by the FIA, a letter or email confirming successful accreditation will be sent to the applicant(s).

This letter must be produced when collecting passes at the event.

No pass(es) can be collected without this confirmation.

The electric current is 240 volts. Plugs and sockets are of a three pin design.

Smoking is not permitted by law in enclosed public places and workplaces in Wales.

#### **Seat Belts**

The driver and all passengers are required to use seat belts at all times.

#### Speed Limits (Cars)

Built up areas30mph (48kph)Main roads60mph (96kph)Motorways or Dual Carriageways70mph (112kph)

These speed limits are for cars; there are other limits for vans and goods vehicles.

There are also other limits indicated by traffic signs.

#### Mobile Telephones

It is illegal to use a hand-held mobile telephone whilst driving.

#### Alcohol

The Police can order Breathalyser tests of drivers. The maximum permitted level of alcohol in the bloodstream is 0.08%.

#### **Traffic Rules**

Drive on the LEFT, and overtake on the right.









#### **Motorway Tolls**

There are no motorway tolls once you have entered Wales. If you are driving to Cardiff from London there is a toll to cross the Severn Bridge on the M4 or M48. The toll is £6.00 for a car and can only be paid in cash. Toll charges for trucks and trailers will vary.




