4.1 Closing date for entries

Tuesday, 12 March 2013 at 17h00 (local time).

4.2 Entry procedure

Entries must be submitted as specified in Article 21 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

The entry form is available on the organiser's website www.rallydeportugal.pt under the competitors' section and can be completed electronically.

In compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code, foreign entrants/drivers must be in possession of the approval of their own ASN which must be attached to the entry form or produced at administrative checks at the latest. With the submission of the entry form, each foreign entrant and/or driver/co-driver declares that he/she is in possession of this authorisation.

The entry application will only be accepted if accompanied by:

- The total entry fees or a receipt issued by the competitor's National Sporting Authority
- Photocopies of the Competitor, Driver and Co-Driver Competition licences
- Photocopies of the Driver and Co-Driver driving licences
- One passport photo for each member of the crew.
- Photocopy of 1st page of the car homologation form for the entered car.

4.3 Number of entrants accepted

The maximum number of entrants will be 90. If more than 90 entries are received the organiser reserves the right to decide which entries among the non-priority drivers will be accepted.

4.7 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- to candidates whose entry has not been accepted
- in the case of the rally not taking place

5. INSURANCE

5.1 A third party liability insurance is compulsory. The organiser provides a third party liability insurance, whose taker is FPAK (Federação Portuguesa de Automobilismo e Karting) with the cover per accident limited to 20.000.000€ in corporal damage or 6.000.000€ in material damage.

The insurance will come into effect from scrutineering and will cease as following:

- At the end of the rally or at the moment of retirement.
- Disqualification or exclusion.
- Time limit for appeal.
- End of Technical Scrutineering.
- End of Podium Ceremony

During the Free Practice / Qualifying Stage / Shakedown the rally cars will be covered by the above insurance.

- **5.2** In case of an accident, the competitor or his representative must notify the Clerk of the Course in writing as quickly as possible and within 24 hours. He must explain the circumstances under which the accident occurred, eventual causes and consequences. Likewise he must mention the names and addresses of any witnesses. He must also mention the names and addresses of any eventual injured people.
- **5.3** Competitors are reminded that only damage caused to third parties by the Organisers and the entered drivers is covered by the insurance policy taken by the Organisation. Injury to the drivers themselves or damage to participating cars is not covered by this insurance.
- **5.4** Entrants and competitors are free to take on at their own convenience any individual insurance policy that they deem fit, independently from the above mentioned liability insurance.

- **5.5** By submitting their entries, the competitors, drivers and car owners waive any claims or rights to pursue action for damages in connection with the event against the organiser.
- **5.6** The service vehicles, even those bearing special plates issued by the Organisers, may never be considered as official participants in the rally. They are therefore not covered by the insurance policy of the rally and remain the sole responsibility of their owner.

6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATON

6.1 Organisers advertising

The organiser's advertising is detailed in Appendix 4 of these regulations.

6.2 Rally plates & Identification numbers

As detailed in Appendix 4 of these regulations. Identification numbers and rally plates must be affixed to the car for scrutineering and must be visible for the duration of the rally.

6.3 Advertising restrictions

No political, religious or abusive advertising. Tobacco or tobacco products is forbidden.

7. TYRES

7.2 Studded tyres

The use of studded tyres is prohibited.

7.3 Tyre Marking

Tyre marking zones will be organized after the TC OUT of the Service Park. Tyres to be used during shakedown will be marked at the exit of Service Park (tyre marking zone), when applicable.

7.4 Tyre Barcode

As per 2013 WRC Sporting Regulations Art.60.4 and 62.1 each tyre must have a specific permanent moulded bar code number supplied by an approved FIA bar code supplier.

The tyre bar code must always be visible from outside the car.

8. FUEL

All Priority drivers must use FIA fuel as provided by the FIA appointed supplier (see Art. 58 & 59 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations).

For environmental and safety reasons all competitors must refuel in the designated refuel zones. Refuelling is not allowed in the Service Park (no refuel from cans, drums or similar).

8.1 Ordering procedure

Competitors must order their fuel requirements using the order form which is available on the official Vodafone Rally de Portugal website: www.rallydeportugal.pt under the section: Competitors/ Forms. This form should be sent to: Email: w<u>rcfuelorder@vitalequipment.co.uk</u>

Competitors are responsible for settling direct with the supplier, all matters relating to supply and payment. The price of the fuel is \in 5.48 per litre.

8.4 Fuel for Non-priority drivers

Non-priority drivers may either use

- FIA fuel, following the same conditions and rules as the Priority drivers. Cars equipped solely with FIA specific refuel couplings and using fuel as per WRC Art. 59.1.2 must transport the adaptor in the car and show it at the pre-event scrutineering.
- Commercial fuel supplied by Vital Equipment in all RZs mentioned in the itinerary and in article 8.3 of these Supplementary Regulations, except in RZ11 and RZ13 where competitors must fill up in the gas station (Oleofat) close to the Vital Equipment operation.

In order to access to Vital Equipment service, competitors must buy in advance fuel coupons from the organiser. Fuel coupons will be available from the Rally HQ (Algarve Stadium) and must be paid in cash. Credit cards and bank cheques will not be accepted. Further details will be given in Rally Guide-2.

9. RECONNAISSANCE

9.1 Procedure for registration

Reconnaissance registration will take place at the Accreditation Centre at Algarve Stadium according to the rally program. A reconnaissance registration form must be completed before commencing reconnaissance. This will be available in Rally Guide 2 and at www.rallydeportugal.pt

For priority 1 & 2 drivers, a team member, duly designated in writing, can collect the materials. The other crews must register in person.

Competitors will be issued with three reconnaissance numbers (that must be fixed to the rear window & rear side windows) and one windscreen plate.

Should a crew's reconnaissance car be replaced for any reason, the secretariat must be informed of the details of the replacement car.

A reconnaissance record card will be supplied which must be carried in the car for the duration of the reconnaissance. This card will be stamped appropriately recording every run on each special stage. Failure to produce this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance.

Reconnaissance record cards must be returned to the Rally Office on Wednesday 10 April from 15h00 to 20h00.

No record card will be supplied for the reconnaissance of SSS5.

9.2 Timetable

Reconnaissance will take place according to the schedule in Appendix 2.

9.3 Participation in Reconnaissance Only

Any driver holding the appropriate international licence and not entered in the rally may apply to take part in reconnaissance of all special stages except SSS5 (super special stage). The regulations must be respected in their entirety. The Organiser must approve the application.

A Reconnaissance Registration Form can be found in Rally Guide 2 and on www.rallydeportugal.pt. The fee for taking part in Reconnaissance only is \in 1,000.

9.4 Restrictions

See also article 25 in the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

- **9.4.1** Competitors are permitted a maximum of two passages over each special stage (except SSS5) during reconnaissance. For reconnaissance purposes, all stages run more than once in the rally are considered to be one special stage.
- **9.4.2** Unless a lower limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the road book or in a bulletin, the maximum speed on special stages during reconnaissance is:
 - All special stages excepting the super special stage (SSS 5): 90 kph
 - Super Special Stage (SSS 5): 60 kph

- **9.4.3** Under no circumstances may competitors drive in the opposite direction of the rally traffic, unless instructed by an official of the event or the police. Competitors may only enter a special stage through the start and exit through the finish.
- **9.4.4** The fitting or carrying of radar detection equipment is not permitted.
- **9.4.5** Reconnaissance outside the schedule as set by the organiser is considered a very serious offence and will be reported to the Stewards who may apply a penalty.

9.5 Reconnaissance of SSS5

For each crew, the reconnaissance of the super special stage will take place between TC4A and TC4B (8 minutes). The rally cars shall be used for this purpose. Each crew will be allowed to complete 2 laps of the circuit ($2 \times 1,09 \text{ km}$). Crews are authorised to check in before time at TC4B without incurring any penalty.

10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

10.1 Documents to be presented

At administrative checks the following documents will be checked and entry form details verified:

- Valid entrants license
- Valid driver and co-driver competition licenses
- Valid driver and co-driver passports or identification
- ASN authorisation for foreign drivers, if required
- Valid drivers' driving licences
- Rally car's registration papers
- Car insurance cover certificate
- Car owner authorisation to participate in the rally
- Correctness of all other information given on the entry form.

10.2 Schedule

<u>P1 & P2 drivers</u> (by appointment) Monday, 08 April: 15.00h / 21.00h Tuesday, 09 April: 08.00h / 20.00h Wednesday, 10 April: 09.00h / 12.00h

<u>P3 and non-Priority drivers</u> (at same time of reconnaissance registration) Monday, O8 April: 15.00h / 21.00h Schedule to be published in a bulletin.

11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

11.1 Venue and timetable

Algarve Stadium (exact location on Rally Guide 2)

Wednesday, 10 April

08.00h / 13.30h: Scrutineering and component sealing for WRC P1 entered by a Manufacturer or WRC Team (by appointment)

15.00h / 23.00h: Scrutineering and component sealing for P1 not entered by a Manufacturer or WRC Team, P2, P3 & non-priority drivers (individual times to be confirmed in a bulletin)

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team.

All cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials, and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighing.

The crew must show the car's complete certified homologation form.

The Manufacturers or WRC Teams registered in the Championship may present a signed Certificate of Technical conformity.

Scrutineers may require to identifying the car. The chassis and cylinder block may be marked.

After scrutineering, if a car is found not to comply with technical and/or safety regulations, the Stewards may set a deadline before which the car must be made to comply or may refuse the start.

11.2 Tranverse Mud Flaps

Fitting of transverse mud flaps is compulsory and must comply with Appendix J, Article 252.7.7.

11.3 Windows

The use of silvered or tinted films is authorised. All films must allow the occupants of the car to be seen or have an opening for the same purpose.

11.4 Driver's safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FLR intended to be used must be produced at scrutineering. Compliance with Appendix L Chapter III will be checked.

11.5 Installation of Safety Tracking Equipment

All competitors must make provision in their cars for the installation of a Safety Tracking System and emergency button.

Installation instructions will be available at <u>www.rallydeportugal.pt</u> and in Rally Guide 2.

The correct functioning and installation of the equipment will be checked at scrutineering.

12. OTHER PROCEDURES

12.1 Ceremonial start procedure and order

Date and time: Thursday, 11 April from 20.30h (podium at Vilamoura Marina).

The suggested itinerary from the service park to the holding area located in front of Tivoli Marinotel will be given in Rally Guide 2.

Rally cars must enter the holding area according to a schedule to be published in a bulletin. A representative of the team may deliver the car.

Entering the holding area outside the indicated time window will incur a cash penalty of $250 \in$.

The holding area will be under vigilance. Access to the holding area is limited to team members and media representatives with appropriate identification.

The ceremonial start will be given in the following order, all in one minute intervals:

- Group 1 P1 & P2 drivers in the reverse order of the start list for Section 1
- Group 2 P3 drivers in the order of the start list for Section 1
- Group 3 All the other drivers in the order of the start list for Section 1

Time cards will not be issued.

Crew members must wear their approved overalls at the ceremonial start.

After the podium procedure, each car and crew must follow the itinerary given in Rally Guide 2 until they join public traffic road (Vilamoura Marina exit gate) from where the itinerary is free (although suggested in Rally Guide 2).

12.2 Official start

The official start of the rally will be at TCO.

12.3 Start order for the rally

As per article 45.3 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

12.4 Time card change during the rally Time cards will be issued at the following time controls:

QS0 / TC0 / TC4B / TC5A / TC5D / TC8A / TC11A / TC11D / TC13A.

12.5 Parc Fermé before SSS5

Article 42.5 of WRC 2013 Sporting Regulations will not apply in the Parc Fermé between TC4B and TC5.

12.6 Super special stage procedures

SSS5 (Lisboa) will be run under Super Special Stage regulations (2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations – article 41).

SSS5 will consist on 3 laps to a circuit of approximately 1,09 km (total length of 3,27 km).

The organisers reserve the right to "match" competing vehicles for the super special stage on grounds of public interest. The starting order for SSS5 shall be communicated to the crews at their arrival to TC4B (Communication by the Clerk of the Course).

The start will be given in heats composed by 2 or 3 cars. The cars will stand before the starting line (position A in the first row, B in the second row and C in the third row). The start intervals between these cars will be 15 seconds (hits composed by 3 cars) or 30 seconds (hits composed by 2 cars).

The start for each car will be given according to article 12.7 of these supplementary regulations, excepting that the 30 seconds to the start light indication will not be shown. The cars on the second and third start rows (positions B & C) must move up respectively to positions A & B when the car in front has cleared the start position. The instructions by the marshals/ timekeepers on-site must be respected.

The maximum time allowed to complete SSS5 will be 6 minutes. Any crew who fails to complete SSS5 within this maximum time or does not start SSS5 will occur in the penalties laid down in article 46.2 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

If the running of SSS5 is interrupted, this will be signalled to the drivers by showing yellow flags.

When given this signal, the driver must immediately reduce speed and follow instructions of any marshals or other officials. Failure to comply with this rule will entail a penalty at the discretion of the Stewards.

If the super special stage is interrupted or stopped for any reason, the dispositions of article 39 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will apply.

12.7 Starting system of special stages

The standard light sequence mentioned in article 37.2 and Appendix VII of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations be used.

Should this start system fail the start will be given as specified in article 37.3 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations with the use of a start flag to the give the starting signal.

12.8 Permitted early check-in

Crews are authorised to check in before time without incurring any penalty at the following time controls TC4B / TC5A / TC5C & TC1IC (as per article 51.2.4 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations).

12.9 Car Wash facilities

An official car wash facility will be available

- before TC QS1A / TC5A / TC8A / TC11A / TC13A / TC15A.
- immediately before RZ4

The exact location of the car wash facilities will be shown in the road book.

12.10 On-board cameras

As per article 65.1 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations the entrant of any car which carries an on-board camera must have the prior agreement of the Promoter.

Authorised cameras will be identified by an adhesive decal and must be mounted in the car at the time of scrutineering.

Competitors wishing to use a camera must supply the following information to the Promoter <u>(rally@thesportsman.de)</u> at least one week before the start of reconnaissance: entrant name, car number, entrant address & use of footage.

12.11 Passing of food/drink at RZ2 & RZ3

The passing of food and/or drink to the crew by one of the team members that may access the refuelling zone (article 58.2.7 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations) is permitted at RZ2 and RZ3.

12.12 Power Stage

With reference to article 13.3 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, SS15 (Almodôvar 2) will be run as the «Power Stage».

The cars to contest SS15 with 3 minute interval between each car and the start order of these cars (normally the top cars in reverse running order) will be determined by the Organiser in conjunction with the Promoter.

All remaining competitors will start SS15 in their order of arrival at TC15.

The competitor with the current fastest time on SS15 must wait at the Power Stage Arch until a faster time is recorded.

Any car held will be allocated a delay time which will be noted on the time card and added to the target time for the road section to TC15A.

12.13 Finish procedures

The rally will conclude at TC15C.

From this point, all cars are subject to Parc Fermé rules until the Parc Fermé is opened at the instruction of the stewards.

The finish ceremony and prize giving will take place at the Service Park. The highest National crew and WRC support championships winners will pass over the finish ramp only if they check-in at TC15C before 16.30h.

In the event a car is not driveable for the above procedure, this must be reported to the Clerk of the Course and the crew members concerned must still attend the podium finish ceremony.

12.14 Final Parc Fermé

Provided that the results have become final and the stewards have authorised the Parc Fermé to be opened, all cars must be removed from Parc Fermé at the latest 22.00h on Sunday, 14 April.

Only upon presentation of the Parc Fermé pass issued with the rally materials may a car be removed from the Parc Fermé by the drivers or their representatives.

12.15 Official time used during the rally

Official time throughout the entire rally will be that of GPS (UTC time + offset to local time).

12.16 Organisers' promotional activities

11 April (Thursday) 'Meet the Crews' / Autograph Signing Session (Vilamoura Marina) 12 April (Friday) 'Meet the Crews' / Autograph Signing Session (Centro Cultural Belém)


