Entries must be submitted as specified in Article 21 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations. The entry form is available on the organiser's website www.adac-rallye-deutschland.de under the competitors' section and can be completed electronically.





In compliance with Article 70 of the 2013 FIA International Sporting Code, foreign competitors/drivers must be in possession of the approval of their own ASN which must be attached to the entry form or produced at administrative checks at the latest. With the submission of the entry form, each foreign competitor and/or driver/co-driver declares that he/she is in possession of this authorisation.

- <u>Legal entry:</u> Crew entered by a person who is not member of the crew or entered by any other legal entity.

4.6 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- To candidates whose entry has not been accepted.
- In the case of the rally not taking place.

5. INSURANCE

Description of insurance cover:

The organiser provides a third party liability insurance with the cover of €10 million lump sum for the event for personal injuries, property damage and pecuniary loss.

The insurance will come into effect at the start of the rally and will cease at the end of the rally or at the moment of withdrawal or retirement of the crew. The liability insurance for the road sections between the special stages will nevertheless only be granted subsidiary and exists only for competitors' cars which do not comply with the minimum cover prescribed in the motor vehicle liability insurance regulations for the Federal Republic of Germany.

By submitting their entries, competitors declare that a car owner's liability insurance with a minimum liability insurance cover for the vehicle to be used exists without restriction.

More details are available upon request.

A copy of a corresponding confirmation of the competitors' insurance, the international insurance card ("green card") or the pink border insurance confirmation must be submitted together with the entry form or be produced at administrative checks at latest.

Competitors are reminded that the reconnaissance is **not** covered by the above insurance and competitors must make their own arrangements.

Competitors'/drivers' statements regarding the exclusion of liability

The participants (competitors/drivers/co-drivers) take part in the event at their own risk. They bear the sole responsibility under civil and criminal law for any damage caused by them or the vehicle used, if no exclusion of liability is agreed. By submitting their entries, the participants waive any claims or rights to pursue action for damages in connection with the event against:

- the FIA, the DMSB and/or its affiliated and member organisations, the Deutsche Motor Sport Wirtschaftsdienst GmbH, their presidents, executive bodies, managing directors, secretaries general, members and full-time employees
- the ADAC e.V., the ADAC Beteiligungs- und Wirtschaftsdienst GmbH and other affiliated and associated companies of the ADAC e.V., the Freizeit- und Wirtschaftsdienst GmbH, ADAC Mittelrhein e.V., the ADAC local and regional clubs, the promoter/series organiser, and their presidents, directors, managing directors, secretaries general, members and full-time employees
- the Organiser, the Officials and Delegates, road owners, government agencies, racing services and all other persons involved with the organisation of the event.
- the organisation responsible for the construction and maintenance of roads, where damage is caused by the condition of the roads (including accessories) used during the event and





– any agents or other persons employed to perform an obligation on behalf of the above persons and entities, except for damage or harm to life, body or health resulting from the deliberate or negligent breach of duty by the group of persons released from liability, their legal representatives or agents and except for any other damage resulting from the deliberate or grossly negligent breach of duty by the group of persons released from liability, their legal representatives or agents.

Against

- the other participants (competitors, drivers, co-drivers, passengers, course car drivers and co-drivers), their assistants, the owners or registered keepers of other vehicles
- their own competitors/drivers (barring any other special agreements between competitors and driver/s and/or passenger/s) and their own assistants;

they waive claims for any kind of damage originating in connection with the event (tests/reconnaissance, shakedown, special stages to achieve maximum speeds or shortest driving times, road sections), except for damage or harm to life, body or health resulting from the deliberate or negligent breach of duty by the group of persons released from liability, their legal representatives or agents and except for any other damage resulting from the deliberate or grossly negligent breach of duty by the group of persons released from liability, their legal representatives or agents.

The exclusion from liability shall become effective for all parties concerned upon submission of the entry form to ADAC or the Organiser.

The waiver of liability applies to claims for any legal reason whatsoever, including but not limited to claims for damages based on contractual and non-contractual liability and to claims from tortuous liability. Implied exclusions from liability shall remain unaffected by the above non-liability clause.

By submitting their entry, the competitors/registered owner(s)/drivers/co-drivers acknowledge that motor vehicle insurance (motor vehicle third-party liability, Casco comprehensive/collision damage coverage) does not cover any damage or claims incurred during special stages or the shakedown. They undertake to pass this information on to the owner of the vehicle used.

Release from claims of the vehicle's owner

If the competitor or the driver/co-driver are not themselves owner of the competition car, they must make sure that the waiver which is printed on the entry form is signed by the car owner.

In the case that, in contrast to this obligation, if the above mentioned declaration was not signed by the car owner, the competitor and driver/co-driver discharge all persons and posts mentioned in the above article from any claim by the car owner by exception of intentional or gross negligence.

With regard to claims against the other participants (competitor, driver and co-driver), their assistants, the owners of the other cars, the own competitor, drivers, co-drivers and own assistants, this release refers to damages arising in connection with the special stage(s) on which the highest possible speed or the shortest driving time should be achieved or with the test(s)/reconnaissance. With regard to claims against other persons or bodies, this release refers to damages arising in connection with the event as a whole.

Responsibility, amendments of the regulations, cancellation of the event

The organiser reserves the right to modify the present regulations if considered necessary for reasons of safety, force majeure or upon instruction of the authorities or to cancel the event in case that extraordinary circumstances should arise, without any obligations for indemnification, intention and gross negligence excluded. Furthermore, the promoter/organiser holds liability only in case that exclusion from liability is not mentioned in the Regulations or entry form.

6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

6.3 Identification Numbers

Rally plates and competition numbers will be provided by the Organisers, in accordance with Article 18 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations and as detailed in the Appendix 4.

The rear window panel as per Article 18.3 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations shall be positioned at the top of the rear window, centred right (seen in driving direction).

Service and support vehicle car plates must be placed on the top right corner on the inside of the windscreen.

6.4 Restrictions on advertising

No political, religious, social or abusive advertising. Advertising for private betting and gambling offerers without permission for Germany is prohibited.

Publicity on tobacco is forbidden. This is a restriction self-imposed by the German tobacco industry.

Special attention is also drawn to the new Appendix V of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations regarding the use of free tyres (Tarmac Tyre Regulations)!

As per WRC Art. 62.1, each tyre must have a specific permanent moulded bar code number supplied by an approved FIA barcode supplier. These bar codes will be used to check that the same tyres remain fitted to a particular car between tyre changes and that competitors are not exceeding the maximum quantities allowed.

7.2 Tyre Fitting Zones

A remote tyre fitting zone will be established after TC0, after SS 10 and after SS 13 respectively (exact locations see Itinerary and Road Books).

At these tyre fitting zones:

- a) No work other than the change of wheels by the crew alone will be allowed, using solely the equipment on board
- b) A wheel/tyre marking and bar code reading zone will be established at the exit of each tyre fitting zone. Notwithstanding Article 60.4 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, the access of team members in this zone is not permitted.
- c) Up to eight (8) tyres for each car from the total quantity available for use throughout the event may be transported by each entrant to these tyre fitting zones (Road Books will be published in Rally Guide 2) under the following conditions:
 - The maximum length of the transport vehicle for any car is 7 m.
 - Each transport vehicle must be fitted with a TFZ sticker with start number (windscreen), supplied by the organiser.
 - The transport vehicles may access the zone itself only upon instruction of the marshals on-site.
 - The transport vehicles must clear the zone immediately and with no hesitation after their rally car has left
 - The tyres for entrants who are required to use tyres from an FIA nominated tyre company will be transported by the respective tyre company so that the aformenetioned provisions do not apply for these entrants. Details will be published in a Bulletin.
- d) It is compulsory for all cars to pass through the tyre fitting zone and stop at the tyre marking zone after TC 0, even if wheels are not changed.
- e) Competitors who do not change wheels in the tyre fitting zone after SS 10 and/or SS 13 are permitted to go straight at Road Book box 44 in this road section.

7.3 Shakedown tyre marking

Tyres to be used during shakedown will be marked at the shakedown start, where applicable.





8. FUEL

All FIA Priority drivers must use the FIA fuel as provided by the FIA appointed supplier which is Petrochem Carless, who have authorised Vital Equipment Ltd to carry out fuel ordering, supply and refuel services. The cost of the FIA fuel including taxes and refuel services is € 5.48 per litre, dispensed into rally cars. For further information, see Articles 58 and 59 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

8.1 Ordering procedure

All competitors using FIA fuel must place their fuel order directly with Vital Equipment Ltd, by e-mail to **wrcfuelorder@vitalequipment.co.uk** or by fax to +44 1981 241169. The order form issued by Carless-Vital Equipment including payment details by bank transfer is available on the event website: www.adac-rallye-deutschland.de.

It is a condition of supply that payment must be received in full before delivery can be made. The balance of non-used fuel will be credited after the rally.

8.2 Closing date for ordering FIA fuel

See point 3 of these Supplementary Regulations.

8.3 Dispensing method for non-priority drivers

Non Priority drivers may use either FIA fuel following the same conditions and rules as the Priority drivers, or commercially available pump fuel, dispensed only from pumps at filling stations marked in the Road Book. Should a particular car not be able to cover the distance between two corresponding filling stations due to the individual fuel consumption and the individual fuel tank capacity, FIA fuel may be ordered and refuelled at the FIA refuel zones (deadlines for ordering must be respected!!).

8.4 Technical requirements

According to article 59.3.2 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, all competitors are required to fit FIA specified refuel couplings, except non priority drivers using a car which retains the standard tank. Cars of priority drivers specifically must be fitted with FIA fuel sample couplings (Art. 59.3.5). Cars equipped solely with FIA specified refuel couplings and using fuel as per Art. 59.1.2 must transport the adaptor in the car and show it at pre-event scrutineering (Art. 59.3.7).

8.5 Fuel and refuelling procedure for FIA Junior WRC

Will be published in a Bulletin.

9. RECONNAISSANCE

9.1 Procedure for registration

Prior to reconnaissance, all crews must complete a registration form and collect a reconnaissance pass and a recce vehicle identification at the Rally Headquarters Trier (see Article 3.2). The material will be given to the drivers personally or to a representative duly certified in writing at the Rally Secretariat.

The recce pass form issued by the organiser must be returned at the Rally Headquarters Trier or at the service park Headquarters Trier until **Wednesday**, **21 August 2013**, **13:00hrs**, at the latest. The identification number panels (small format) must be affixed to the upper side of the windscreen and of the rear window, in the centre. The fluorescent orange numbers issued must be placed at the top of both rear side windows. All identifications must be kept visible for the whole duration of the recce period.

9.2 Specific and/or national restrictions – speed limit on special stages

9.2.1 Direction

Each crew may drive the special stages only in **the same direction as the rally**, unless permitted to drive in the opposite direction for very short sections if published in a Communication by the Clerk of the Course. The crews must always enter and leave the special stages through the start and stop controls.





9.2.2 Respect of traffic laws and driving behaviour

All Road Traffic Laws must be strictly observed and the safety and rights of other road users must be respected during reconnaissance. All crews must drive in a manner that does not endanger or inconvenience other traffic or people living near the stages. Competitors must bear in mind that the special stages are not yet closed to public or residential traffic during recce.

9.2.3 Number of persons on board

During each passage through a special stage, a maximum of 2 persons (the crew) are permitted in the car.

9.2.4 Maximum speed

At all times the maximum speed on special stages will be 90 km/h unless a lower limit is indicated by traffic signs, by signs placed by the organiser or in the Road Books.

9.2.5 Reconnaissance pass

Crews must stop at the start and at the stop of each special stage where a rally official will endorse the crews' reconnaissance pass and at any other location where instructed.

9.2.6 Reconnaissance vehicles

All cars used for reconnaissance must comply with the prescriptions of Article 25.1 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

9.2.7 Service during reconnaissance

In compliance with Article 25.4.6 of the 2013 WRC Sporting Regulations, each authorised vehicle will be provided with one "RECCE SERVICE" car pass supplied by the organiser.

9.2.8 Participation in reconnaissance only

Any driver wishing to take part in reconnaissance only (see also Art. 25.5 of the 2013 WRC Sporting Regulations) must complete an application form which is available from the organiser and pay a fee of 1.000 € for taking part in this reconnaissance. The form should be returned until the entry closing date.

9.3 Installation of speed control checking devices

In accordance with Article 25.4.4 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, all the cars of priority drivers (P1, P2, P3) must carry recce GPS recorders on board during reconnaissance. Location and times for collection and return are specified in Article 3.2. Should non priority drivers be required to carry GPS recorders on board this will be communicated in a Bulletin. The use of such recorders may involve a fee. The FIA may also require any other drivers to carry recce GPS recorders.

10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

10.1 <u>Original</u> documents which must be presented:

- Competitor's international licence
- Driver's and co-driver's international competition licences
- Driver's and co-driver's valid driving licences
- Driver's and co-driver's passport or identification
- ASN authorisation for all foreign competitors
- Completion of all details on the entry form.
- Rally car insurance cover certificate (see Article 5 in the present Regulations)
- Rally car registration papers

After completion of administrative checks, competitors will receive a signed Administrative Clearance Form which must be submitted at scrutineering.





10.2 Timetable

See point 3.2 in these Regulations.

11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

11.1 Scrutineering venue and timetable

See point 3.2 of these Regulations. A detailed timetable will be published in a Bulletin. The layout of the scrutineering area will be published in Rally Guide 2.

For scrutineering, all cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials, and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighing. The homologation form of the rally car and certificates for the roll cage and fuel tank must be brought to scrutineering.

The bodyshell and engine will be marked and to facilitate this, each competitor must prepare their car (engine block) in order to fit a wire, a plate and a seal somewhere on the engine block (on a visible place when the front bonnet is opened).

11.2 Mud Flaps (Appendix J Article 252.7.7)

Mud flaps to prevent splashing towards the front in conformity with Article 252.7.7 of the Appendix J to the 2013 FIA International Sporting Code are authorised.

11.3 Windows/Nets (Appendix J Article 253.11)

The use of silvered or tinted films is not authorized.

11.4 Driver's safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and Front Head Restraint (FHR) intended to be used must be produced at scrutineering. Compliance with Appendix L Chapter III will be checked.

11.5 Noise level

In accordance with Article 252 of the Appendix J to the 2013 FIA International Sporting Code.

11.6 Special national requirements

N/a.

11.7 Installation of Safety Tracking System

Collection times for the Safety Tracking System are given in point 3.2 of these Regulations. Non-priority drivers may be required to leave a credit card deposit for the equipment in the event of loss / damage.

The Safety Tracking System must be fitted and connected in all competitors' cars before arrival at scrutineering where they will be checked. Installation instructions will be published in Rally Guide 2.

The Tracking units must be returned at the same location where they were distributed within 30 minutes of the results being declared final. In the case of retirement, all the tracking equipment must be returned to SIT Sports at the Service Park as soon as possible after retirement.

11.8 Fixing of On-board cameras

The fixings of camera and camera recorder must be able to withstand a deceleration of 25 g.

12. OTHER PROCEDURES

12.1 Ceremonial start procedure and order

12.1.1 "Paddocks Butzweilerhof" Cologne

On Thursday, 22 August 2013, all the rally cars must be brought to the "Paddocks Butzweilerhof" Cologne in due time so that they can comply with the below conditions. The "Paddocks Butzweilerhof"





will be open from 10:00hrs. A Road Book with the recommended route will be included in Road Book 1 (approx. distance: 201 km).

From arrival at the "Paddocks Butzweilerhof" until the rally start (TC 0), any work on the rally cars may only be performed by the crew members themselves, using solely the equipment on board which must thereafter remain on board and with no external physical assistance. External physical assistance and equipment is permitted for the sole purpose of uploading the cars from transporters and/or for light hand car wash, if necessary.

All rally cars will be assembled and lined up in the holding area "Butzweilerhof" from where they will be guided in groups to the ceremonial start (Cologne Cathedral – see 12.1.2, distance: 9.41 km).

To put together the groups of cars, all rally cars must be brought into the holding area "Butzweilerhof" respecting the following conditions:

- Each car must enter the holding area on Thursday, 22 August 2013, between 80 and 70 minutes before its individual ceremonial start time. All P1/P2 drivers with their cars will be required to be available for promotional purposes from 14:45hrs at the ceremonial start Cologne Cathedral so that a different time window, which will be published after the close of entries, will apply for these crews.
- The cars may be brought by a competitor's representative.
- All the drivers and their co-drivers must be on stand-by beside their cars from 15 minutes before the scheduled start time of their individual group for the transfer to the ceremonial start.
- The schedule with the departure times of the groups to the ceremonial start, which will be published in a Bulletin after the close of entries, must be considered as approximate times and may be adapted upon instruction of the marshals on-site.
- Access to the holding area is limited to team members and media representatives with appropriate identification.

During the transfer, the rally cars must be driven by their entered crew members and all the road traffic regulations must be respected. Should, as a consequence, a crew drop behind its group (e.g. red traffic lights), it shall continue on its own until Cologne Cathedral (a Road Book will be provided).

12.1.2 Ceremonial start Cologne Cathedral

Date and time: Thursday, 22 August 2013, from 16:00, podium at the Cologne Cathedral.

The ceremonial start will be given in the order of the start list for Section 1 but at one minute intervals for all cars. Time cards will not be issued.

Crew members must wear their approved overalls at the ceremonial start.

12.1.3 Start of the Rally (Harry-Blum-Platz)

The competitive element of the rally will start on Thursday, 22 August 2013, 16:15hrs from TC 0 Harry-Blum-Platz Cologne.

12.2 Finish procedure

The competitive element of the rally will conclude at TC 16C (Service OUT/Parc Fermé IN), except for FIA Junior WRC competitors for which the competitive element of the rally will conclude at TC 14C (Service OUT – Parc fermé IN), see modified Itinerary TC 14A to TC 14C.

From this point, all cars are subject to parc fermé rules until the parc fermé is opened at the instruction of the stewards.

After the conclusion of the Rally at TC 16C, all classified cars shall be driven in convoys escorted by the police from the Parc Fermé Messepark to the finish procedure at the podium Porta Nigra. Crew members must wear their approved overalls.

The exact time schedule for these convoys will be published in a Bulletin.

Access to the holding area in front of the finish podium Porta Nigra Trier will be limited to officials and to media representatives holding the appropriate pass.





After the podium procedure, competitors must drive their cars to a holding area adjacent to the Porta Nigra as instructed by the officials. Each crew may nominate a driver to drive the car under the organiser's supervision (convoy) from the holding area to the final Parc fermé Viehmarktplatz Trier and/or to final scrutineering.

In the event that the car is not driveable for any of the above procedures, this must be reported to the Clerk of the Course who will arrange transport by a recovery vehicle, if possible. In any case, the crew members concerned must still attend the podium finish procedure.

Only upon presentation of the parc fermé pass issued with the rally materials may a car be removed from the final parc fermé by the drivers or their representatives, once the stewards have authorised to open the final parc fermé.

FIA Junior WRC winner's ceremony/photo

After arrival at TC 14C (final parc fermé) the winning crew with car is required to proceed to the Support Championship village in the service park for a winner's ceremony/photo, accompanied by an official. It will be escorted back by the official to the final parc fermé or to the place of final scrutineering, as appropriate. The officials' instructions on-site must be respected.

12.3 Permitted early check-in

Early check-in without incurring a penalty is permitted at the end of Sections 1, 3 and 5 (TC 2D, TC 8D and TC 14D).

12.4 Any special procedures / activities including the organisers' promotional activities

Thursday 22 August 2013 15:00hrs Activity at ceremonial start Cologne

From 16:00h Ceremonial start Cologne

Sunday 25 August 2013 From 14:00hrs Ceremonial finish Trier

12.5 Official time used during the rally

The official time used during the rally is the speaking clock of the "Deutsche Telekom": Telephone 0180 4 100 100 (0.20 Euro per call).

12.6 Re-start after retirement - Rally 2

The Parc Fermé mentioned in the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Article 47.1 for all crews wishing to restart under Article 46 is the Regrouping Area **Messepark Trier**, same area as between TCs "Regroup Technical Zone IN" and "Regroup OUT – Service IN".

All these cars will re-start from TC 2F, 8Fand accordingly 14F (Service IN) where they must report at their scheduled time, calculated from the published re-start time plus the target time of 10 minutes to Service IN.

The Time Card for the Section in which the crew retired must be submitted to the sweeper car or to a marshal at an official control.

For FIA Junior WRC, Art. 46 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will only apply to sections 1 and 2/3 of the rally. FIA Junior WRC competitors retiring in sections 4 or 5 will not be classified. The time penalty as in Art. 46.2 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will be added to the fastest time achieved by a driver contesting the FIA Junior WRC.

12.7 Flexi Service

Flexi service according to Article 51 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will be used for Services A, D and G.

For FIA Junior WRC, flexi service will only be used for Service A and D where the below procedures will apply accordingly.

12.7.1 Road section after flexi service

As an exception to Article 51.2.2 and 51.2.3 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, from TC 2C/8C/14C (Flexi Service A/D/G OUT) the crews with both drivers on board are required to follow the Road-Book for the following road sections to the overnight Parc Fermé Trier Viehmarkt. Competitors are reminded that this road section is part of the official itinerary and that hence all the applicable regulations must be respected.





12.7.2 Flexi Service for P1 & P2 drivers

In accordance with FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art 13.4.4, P1 and P2 crews must be available for signing autographs in front of their team areas for at least 10 minutes following their arrival at their service bay. Accordingly, P1 & P2 crews shall check into service at TC2B, TC8B and TC14B at their due time and proceed to their service bay. Crews requiring to employ 'flexi-service' should then park their cars in their appropriate bay and submit their time card to the scrutineer in attendance without carrying out any work on the car. When ready to commence their 45' service, the scrutineer will note the start time on the card. It is the competitor's responsibility to inform the scrutineer when they are ready to commence their 45' service and to ensure that the scrutineer notes the time on the time card. The scrutineer will then hand back the time card to the competitor. Check in at TC2C, TC8C and TC14C will then follow standard procedure.

12.8 Service Park

12.8.1 Admission

Only cars carrying the appropriate car identification passes will be admitted in the service park. Any parking of service and/or auxiliary vehicles in the service park outside the designated service area allocated to each team is strictly prohibited.

12.8.2 Environmental prescriptions:

The compliance with the environmental and safety prescriptions (see also Supplementary Event Regulations) will be carefully checked by officials. Please make sure that all team members are aware of these prescriptions.

- The service park is located in a sensible water protection area. Both organiser and participants must undertake all efforts to protect the environment in particular water and soil.
- Cleaning of vehicle components Several facilities (water containers and water connection) will be available in the service park nearby the service park headquarters from Monday, 19 August 2013. Please bring your own high-pressure cleaners, if required. The use of high-pressure cleaners or water hoses for cleaning purposes is prohibited at all other locations in the area of the service park.
- The crews are obliged to put a sufficiently large plastic ground sheet under the competition car as long as service works are carried out on the car. The ground sheet must be sufficiently strong, have no damages and be tight, i.e. impervious to oil, fuel, cooling and brake liquids as well as to battery acid. Any residues such as water, oil, fuel, any other liquids, dirt and similar must be collected from the ground sheets, the use of wet vacuum cleaners is recommended, and be disposed environmentally-friendly (e.g. into the containers at the high-pressure cleaners facilities provided by the organiser).
- The crews are required to see that no substances hazardous to water pass over the edge of the ground sheet and into the ground, even in the case of rain.
- The service crews must be in possession of oil absorbing materials and have available a container for used oil and brake fluid at any time during the event.
- Due to official instructions, competitors must avoid any pollution of the environment. Any waste, wrapping material, spare parts, empty oil or colour tins, batteries, etc. must be collected and given to a waste disposal by the competitors themselves. Used oil must be collected and brought to the containers made available in the service park for this purpose.
- Containers with substances hazardous to water such as oil, fuel, cooling and brake liquids, chemical substances or cleaning agents must not contain more than 20 litres per unit. No more than 100 litres of the above substances may be stored inside a vehicle if no safety devices such as collecting tray are provided.

Any such empty containers must be disposed at the collection points for hazardous goods inside the service park and/or with Vital Equipment for fuel containing devices.





- To enable a smooth operation of the rescue teams in case of an accident, all containers with liquid and non-liquid chemicals (e.g. cleaning agents) must carry labels which clearly identify their contents.
- Smoking is forbidden at a distance of less than 10m from containers with inflammable contents (e.g. fuel for generators), even if the containers have been emptied. A solid barrier must be provided between the storage area of any such containers and eventual spectator areas before, during and after their use.

12.8.3 Cash Deposit

Each area in the service park must be left in a clean condition and without any rubbish. Before leaving the service park, each competitor must report to the service park headquarters staff during the service park opening hours to get clearance for the corresponding area. On Sunday, 25 August 2013, the staff will be available until 22:00hrs and on Monday, 26 August 2013, between 08:00 and 12:00hrs (or upon special agreement).

Please note that for this purpose, a <u>cash deposit</u> of 100 € <u>for each competitor</u> will be required <u>at Administrative Checks</u>. Each competitor will get a corresponding receipt and this deposit will be reimbursed by the service park HQ staff upon submission of this receipt and after clearance of the competitor's service park area.

12.8.4 Car wash facility

An official rally car wash facility will be available on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday each time prior to the cars entering the regroup area/service park Trier. See Road Books for exact locations.

12.8.5 Fuel tank calibration zone

For the use until Wednesday, 21st August 2013, a fuel tank calibration zone nearby the refuel area at the service park Trier will be provided. Any emptying or refilling of fuel in the area of the Messepark Trier may only be carried out in this zone and under the competitors' own responsibility.

12.9 Route Note Cars

12.9.1 General

As detailed in the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Article 11.4.

12.9.2 Identification

All these cars will be identified by the organiser.

12.9.3 Registration

The registration form for these cars must be submitted to the organiser as detailed under point 3.2 of these Regulations.

12.9.4 Special prescriptions

- A speed limit of 90 km/h is imposed in the special stages. All national traffic rules must be respected on the special stages and on the road sections between the special stages. The route note car crews must proceed with care, at a reduced speed, in the same direction as the rally.
- The competitors concerned will be informed on a compulsory meeting with the route note car crews. It is sufficient if one representative of each team attends.
- Any infringement of these provisions will result in the immediate withdrawal of the specific identification issued by the Organisers, without prejudice to any other sanction imposed at the Stewards' discretion.

12.9.5 Organiser's Route Note Car

The organiser will provide a route note car for all the other crews. It will deliver any important information on the special stages which might be useful for the drivers. The organiser and/or the drivers of this route note car may however not be held responsible or liable in relation to the quality, correctness and/or





completeness of the delivered information. The time window for this car may vary from the time schedule issued by the organiser for the other route note cars.

12.10 Regroupings Bilstein (TC11A-TC11B) & Eurostrand Leiwen (TC15A-TC15B)

12.10.1 Team personnel

No team personnel will be allowed at or in these regroupings.

12.10.2 Start order Power Stage

The re-start order at regrouping Eurostrand Leiwen OUT, followed by the Power Stage, will defined in co-ordination with the WRC Promoter.

13. IDENTIFICATION OF OFFICIALS

The post chiefs and other officials will be identified as follows:

Post Chiefs: White tabards, "CONTROL" in red letters
Special Stage Commanders: Red tabards, "STAGE CHIEF" in white letters
Track Marshals: Yellow tabards, "MARSHAL" in black letters
Spectator Marshals: Blue tabards, "SAFETY" in black letters
Yellow flag Marshals: Yellow tabards with black radio point symbol
Green tabards, "TIMEKEEPER" in white letters

Competitors' Relations Officers: Red tabards, "RELATIONS OFFICER" in white letters

14. PRIZES

General Classification

The crews first, second and third overall plus the winning manufacturer will receive ADAC Honorary Cups.

Class Classification

30 % of the starters in each class which are not at the same time overall or FIA Support Championship event winners will receive cups, provided that the minimum of 5 cars have been entered in the corresponding class. Should this number not be attained, the competitors in the class concerned are admitted in the next class up.

FIA WRC 2 and FIA WRC 3 Championships for Drivers and and FIA Junior WRC

The winning crew in each of these classifications will receive cups.

Other awards:

The organiser reserves the right to award additional prizes.

15. FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

15.1 Final Checks

Location: Autohaus Mercedes Hess Trier (Karl-Marx-Str. 62)
Time: Sunday, 25 August 2013, after the podium ceremony.

Saturday, 24 August 2013, after TC 14C (FIA Junior WRC, location: Heister Gruppe Ford,

Ruwerer Str. 21, Trier)

The cars selected for final scrutineering will be informed in writing. They are requested to provide proper equipment (including all sealed spare parts) and technicians at the final scrutineering venue.

15.2 Protest fees

Sum of the protest fee: € 1,000 (see Article 55.2 of the 2013 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations).

If the protest requires the dismantling and the reassembly of different parts of a car, the claimant must pay an additional deposit which will be determined by the Stewards of the Meeting.

15.3 Appeal fees

The international appeal fee (FIA) is: € 12,000.



All the competitors and drivers are reminded of the Appendix L to the 2013 FIA International Sporting Code, in particular regarding Chapter III – Drivers' Equipment (Helmets, flame-resistant clothing, frontal head restraint (FHR) and safety belts).

These regulations apply to Shakedown as well (helmet specifications, clothing comprising overalls, gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard.

Appendix 6: START LIGHT SEQUENCE

Start Procedure

Countdown:

30 seconds to GO - red zone and red light

10 seconds to GO – 1 (short) Beep + red zone and red light

5 seconds to GO - 1 (short) Beep every sec + yellow zone and yellow light flashing

"GO" Signal: Green light - Start Beep

After "GO" Signal: 20 seconds free start + green zone and green light





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
