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1 PRESENTATION / WELCOME

1/1 A word from the President

It's also a challenge in terms of innovation as the FFSA makes it a point of honour to come up with something new every year, and a route that's worthy of the reputation that Rally France has now earned.

The Federation cannot take up this challenge without the involvement of the local authorities and private partners who I would like to thank for their loyalty. I'd also like to associate the services of the state with which we work in close collaboration.

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1/2 The stakes

Year V

With close on 90 crews entered for the 2013 event the rally was a big sporting media, economic and popular success.

It was notable for the world title of Sébastien Ogier-Julien Ingrassia, World Rally Champions on the first day of the event, who then went on to score victory. It was also marked by the adieux of local lad Sébastien Loeb to the WRC and Sébastien Chardonnet's title (FFSA French Rally Team) in WRC 3 and that of Swedish driver Pontus Tideman in the Junior category.

The 2014 Rally France-Alsace will count for the FIA World Rally Championship titles for drivers and manufacturers as well as the WRC 2, WRC 2 Production Car Cup, WRC 3 and WRC Junior championships.

The 2014 event run between 3-5 October will be marked by innovation. There will be a few changes to the route, which are currently being decided by the organization, although most of the special stages will still take place in the Bas-Rhin, Haut-Rhin and Vosges departments.

The Zenith in Strasbourg remains the nerve centre of the event and will house the main infrastructures of the rally: service park, parc fermé, HQ, press room, merchandising area, exhibitors' village, responsible mobility village, Platinum Paddock Club, finishing ceremony, etc.

The action will begin on Thursday, 2 October with the traditional shakedown in the Haute-pierre quarter in Strasbourg. It will continue in the Wacken-Europe quarter, the heart of Strasbourg, with the autograph signing session by the professional crews and the regional amateur crews in the Maison de la Région, followed by the start ceremony with several car events and spectacular shows. After the ceremony the crews will head for the Strasbourg Zenith where they will park in the service park.

The crews will set off along the roads of the Bas-Rhin and the Vosges for a loop consisting of three special stages to be covered twice, a total of 114,75 timed km. The layout of SS 1-4 "Col de la Charbonnière" is completely new over the first 7,5 km and then identical to 2012 over the final 3,36 km.

SS 2-5 "Vosges - Pays d'Ormont" is a real sporting challenge and really sorts out the men from the boys in the first leg. This is the longest stage in the rally identical to 2013, so it's of crucial importance for the crews.

SS 3-6 "Pays de Salm" is 95 percent similar to 2010 and 2011 as out of the 9,59 km of the stage 9,08 km remain unchanged.

SSS 7 Strasbourg hasn't undergone any real changes compared to last year except that the finish has been moved. To add to the spectators' pleasure the crews will reconnoiter the layout in their race cars before the start of a 100 percent nighttime superspecial.

The second day in the Haut Rhin will be the busiest of the event with 125,50 timed km and Colmar will still be the hub. The drivers will do battle on SS 9-12 "Soulterezzen - Le Grand Hohnack," and SS 8-11 "Vallée de Munster." The first five km of the latter have been changed with the start in Luttenbach-près-Munster.

SS10-13 "Pays Welche - Riquewihr" is completely new and the 21,49 km stage represents a big challenge for the crews because of its variety, length and difficulty. At the start of the stage the cars will be faced with narrow, twisty sections and they will finish on rapid winding forest roads that will test their technical skills to the utmost.

After two loops broken up by a regrouping and service halt in Colmar, where there will be an exhibitors' village for the first time, the crews will set off for SSS 14 Mulhouse, a completely new superspecial still in the Palais des Sports quarter. After this stage it's back to Strasbourg with a halt at the Sélestat passage control where the ambiance around the podium will be enlivened by a giant screen, a commentator and various forms of entertainment.

The third leg consisting of 63,38 timed km will be run for the first time around Saverne in the Bas Rhin.

After crossing Wimmenau the crews will start SS 15-17 "Forêt de la Petite Pierre" in Wingen-sur-Moder to head on to Erckartswiller along narrow forest roads. This very technical stage will end with a very fast road section.

SS 16-18 will start to the south of Saverne not far from Stambach where the cars will use the prestigious route des Châteaux over quick and twisty sections to reach Reinhardsmunster. This stage will continue over a much wider and faster section of road to Wangenbourg-Engenthal. The crews will have a quick break in the Saverne regrouping park after SS16 and 17 before setting off for the last stage SS18, the Powerstage.

After the third day of stages the crews will follow a liaison section bringing them back to the Zenith in Strasbourg where the finishing ceremony will take place.

5/4 Service park rules and environmental requirements

5/4/1 Environmental requirements

The emptying of waste water, the washing of cars and the driving of stakes into the ground are not permitted in the Service Park. Any infringement will be reported to the Stewards who may apply penalties.

The Rallye de France-Alsace impact on the environment is one of the main organiser's priorities.

As per each year a diagnosis of the greenhouse gas (GHG) footprint is done. We kindly ask you to fill the relevant form (Appendix 6/10) and to return it to the Rally Office (Zénith) no later than Friday, 3 October at 20:00.

5/4/2 Rules

Only vehicles carrying a 'Service' or 'Auxiliary' plate may enter the Service Park. Such vehicles may not be driven in the lanes used by competing cars during a period extending from 15 minutes before the due check-in time of the first competitor at "TC SP in" to the last competitor's check-in time at "TC SP out".

Vehicles carrying a "Service" plate may only be parked in its allocated area in the Service Park. Such vehicles are not allowed to access in the "Auxiliary" car park.

Vehicles carrying an "Auxiliary" plate or "Route Notes Cars" plate may only be parked in the parking P6 designated for this purpose.

Reconnaissance's cars will be permitted to use the parking P6 until Wednesday, 1 October; after that they will not be permitted to use anymore this parking except carrying "Auxiliary", "Route Note Car" or "Meteo" plate.

Any vehicles or trailers found parked outside the zones in which they are permitted or which fail to respect the published timetable will be towed away immediately.

Dismantling:

For safety reasons, dismantling competitors' service structures in the Zenith SP is not permitted before 16:30 on Sunday, 5 October, after the public has cleared the service park.

Any team which breaks this rule will be fined 500 €.

In case of retirement during the rally, the team concerned must firstly obtain a dismantling authorization from the Service Park Coordinator.



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6 TWO-WAY RADIOS

The use on French territory of radio transmission equipment is subject to prior approval of temporary use of frequencies by the Autorité de Régulation des Communications et des Postes (see application form in appendix 6/5 on website).

9 HELICOPTERS

9/1 Registration procedure

In accordance with FIA safety regulations and with the requirements of the civil aviation authorities, all helicopters participating in the rally must be duly registered with the Organizer.

Beside organiser's helicopters (organisers, safety and television), the only helicopters being accepted will be Manufacturers' helicopters for aerial work mission (managers & medias transport).

The registration Form (Appendix 6/2 on website) must be forwarded before Friday, 22 August 2014.

The fee due to the Organizer is €2 500 which amounts to €3 000 with VAT (20%). A 10% fee will be charged for cancellations.

Pilots of registered helicopters will receive a 'Helicopter Guide' containing the rules, a traffic manual, maps of the special stages, authorised dropping zones with their GPS points and overflight areas.

12 RECONNAISSANCE

Registration and materials

Reconnaissance will take place on Tuesday, 30 September, and Wednesday, 1 October, in accordance with the schedule specified in the Supplementary Regulations.

All crews taking part in reconnaissance must complete the registration form (Appendix 6/3 or 6/4 on the website) and return it to the Rally Office, following the procedure specified on the form.

They must register with the Rally Office at Administrative Checks on Monday, 29 September, from 14:00 to 21:00 (by arrangement for Manufacturer & WRC Teams, or by appointment for other crews) in order to obtain the necessary materials.

Each crew will be given 'Reconnaissance' stickers, as well as a specific reconnaissance control card.

"Reconnaissance" stickers have to be fixed on reconnaissance cars on the windscreen, rear side windows and rear window.

The reconnaissance control card must be shown and endorsed by the marshals (identifiable by a tabard) at each stage start (in order to gain access to the special stage or shakedown) and at the Stop Point.

On completion of reconnaissance, this reconnaissance control card must be returned to the Rally Office (Zenith) no later than 19:00, Wednesday, 1 October.

14 SHAKEDOWN

A shakedown session will be organised for all drivers registered to the Rallye de France-Alsace on Thursday, 2 October, with the following schedule:

08:00 / 09:30 Mandatory shakedown for P1 & P2 drivers
09:30 / 11:30 Optional shakedown for P1, P2 & P3 drivers
11:30 / 14:00 Optional shakedown for non-priority drivers

Shakedown will take place in Strasbourg - Parc des Sports - Hautepierre.
Special Stage safety arrangements will apply.
The start is located at about 200 m from the service park.

Shakedown takes the form of a loop to be completed 2 times, as outlined in the road book (1 complete loop + $\frac{3}{4}$ of a 2nd loop). The total distance of shakedown is 3,80 km.

The road section to go back to the Service Park is about 3,7 km (depending on competitor's location in the service park).

A 4,36 km long additional and optional road section may be used before the shakedown start in order to warm up the car; it must be strictly used under road traffic rules.

A 9,74 km long optional liaison for trip calibration is available.

Any person on board the car during shakedown who is not entered for the rally must have signed a disclaimer provided by the organiser.

A competitor whose car breaks down during the shakedown shall nevertheless be required to attend the ceremonial starts as outlined in FIA-WRC Art 29.4 & 43.

18/2/1 Principles

1. A maximum of three representatives (journalists and / or photographers) per publication may be accredited for the Rallye de France - Alsace 2014.
A maximum of one pass will be issued to websites (photo tabards are not issued to websites).
2. Agencies must meet the same criteria as publications. The central offices or premises of the main international agencies will be accredited by the FIA.
3. To be accredited, a media must have a distribution that meets the criteria of quality and quantity of the FIA.
4. The advertising, public relation, marketing agencies, etc., shall in no case be accredited as media, and organizers will not issue accreditation to representatives (press officers or otherwise) of sponsors, suppliers, manufacturers, drivers, etc...
5. A media holding a permanent pass issued by the FIA and wanting to apply for additional accreditation for journalists and / or photographers must make additional applications directly to the FIA (on headed paper + accreditation form). www.fia.com
