1. INTRODUCTION / WELCOME

It is my pleasure to welcome You to Estonia, the country where rally has been an attraction for decades. Estonian rally drivers and competitions are well-known all over the world and we work hard to be known for good competitions as well. This year we host a round of European Rally Championship for the third time and it is our aim to offer great weekend to competitiors as well as spectators.

Organising a round of European Rally Championship expands the limits of so many things starting from the organising team and budget and ending with the emotion that one of the biggest autosport events in the Baltics brings. We expect the number of spectators to grow and thus give a boost to the positive emotions of the drivers.

I believe the roads of our Special Stages are the best in Estonia and we have tried to keep them similar to the stages of the previous years. Nevertheless, we have included some new narrower and trickier sections to make the stages more challenging for the drivers and more thrilling for the spectators.

auto24 Rally Estonia is also a round of FIA European Historic Sporting Rally Championship where we have seen and will see history of the autosport. Remember those Audis, Ford Escorts, Lancia's Fiats etc. Although speed-wise they are not similar to FIA ERC cars there is always something that attracts rally fans.

This year's addition to the rally is special Open class. The aim of the Open class competition is to offer to former and present powerful and extraordinary cars and drivers a possibility to take part in auto24 Rally Estonia and to bring more spectacularity and emotion into the rally.

In 2010 the first event was run at Otepää and South-Estonian roads. In 2013 auto24 Rally Estonia was a candidate event for the FIA ERC series and in 2014 we hosted the FIA ERC series for the first time as an official round. And it was a great honour for us as auto24 Rally Estonia was awarded Rally of the Year in FIA ERC in the end of the season. Starting grom year 2012 auto24 Rally Estonia has been a round of FIA European Historic Sporting Rally Championship.

- Alternatively, a Competitor may send the fully completed entry form to the Permanent Secretariat or by e-mail to entry@rallyestonia.ee . In this case, the entry form must reach the Organisers before the closing date and time for entries at 18:00 on Monday 27 June.
- If the application is sent by e-mail or filled in at www.rallyestonia.com, the original fully completed and signed entry form and payment, must reach the Organisers by 18:00 on Friday 1 July.
- A copy of the valid Competitor's licence and first driver's competition licence must accompany the entry form.
- Details concerning the co-drivers can be specified at the administrative check of the crew.
- By signing the entry a participant allows to publish the information mentioned in this entry application in media.
- The entry application will only be accepted if duly completed and accompanied by the bank transfer of the total
 amount of the entry fee. Payment of the entry fee will only be accepted by bank transfer to the Organiser's bank
 account.

5. SERVICE PARK

5.1 LOCATION AND SERVICE SPACE

The Service Park is located at Otepää Tehvandi Sport Center. The same Service Park will be used during Free Practice / Qualifying Stage and Shakedown.

Surface: tarmac and gravel.

There will be a Regrouping Area/Technical Zone, Tyre Marking Zone and a Refuelling Zone.

There is no flexi-service nor Remote Service Zone during the competition.

If a Competitor has multiple competition cars to be located together in Service Park, the application for consecutive Service Areas must reach the Organiser by Wednesday 6 July at 18:00 at the latest.

In agreement with the Organiser, Competitors may order additional service space with the price of 20 EUR/m²+VAT, in case there is still additional space available in the Service Park.

Competitors may order electricity with the price of 30 EUR+VAT for the Priority drivers and 55 EUR+VAT for all other drivers. The Service Park Order form will be published in appendix to Rally Guide.

Layout of Service Park displaying Service space designated to each competitor, will be published on Official Notice Board and Virtual Notice Board (www.rallyestonia.ee).

5.2 SERVICE PARK RULES

In Service Park, the following rules apply:

- All crews are obliged to have a liquid-proof tarp of minimum 3x5m under competition cars.
- Drilling or any other damages to the surface of the Service Park have to be avoided.
- Teams are asked to bring weights for fixing their tents.
- Each competitor is liable for the damages to the Service Zone allocated to them.
- After the rally, the Service Park has to be handed over in tidy condition.
- The crews are responsible for the removal of their waste and sewage.
- A minimum of two 6kg fire extinguishers are required in crew's service area.
- Catering within the Service Park

Using open fire (grill, log fire) in Service Park is prohibited.

Apart from the provision of a catering service for the drivers and service crew personnel of a team, any other form of catering or sale of food and beverages in the Service Park is prohibited. The only exception is where a written agreement has been entered into between a team and the organisers.

Competitors who fail to comply with Service Park rules are subject to a penalty starting from 300 EUR up to exclusion.

5.3 ACCESS TO SERVICE PARK

Two service vehicles per ERC1 and one service vehicle per all other competitors are allowed in Service Park. The vehicles must be clearly identified by a "Team" sticker issued by the Organiser and affixed on the windscreen.

Team / VIP plates (stickers) must be affixed to the upper side of the windscreen on the right (passenger) side. Removal of the sticker is prohibited until the end of the rally.







Reconnaissance cars and VIP vehicles are not allowed to enter Service Park. Nearby Parking area will be available for the other registered vehicles (Recce/VIP).

5.4 AVAILABLE SERVICES

The following services will be arranged at the Service Park (without charge):

- Toilets and garbage area
- Rally Car washing area
- General lighting
- Wireless Internet access for teams

The following paid services may be ordered by using the order form enclosed in Appendix:

- Extended service area
- Power supply
- Personal toilet

5.5 SECURITY

Overnight guarding of the Service Park will be arranged by the Organisers, however the Organisers are not responsible for any losses, thefts or damages etc. – all items are left at their owner's risk.

6. TYRES

6.1. NO OF TYRES AND TYRE MARKING PROCEDURE

Eligible tyres

In addition to complying with Art 60 and Appendix V of the 2016 Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, the following quantities are confirmed for use (FIA ERC article 62.1.):

For Competitors eligible to take part in Free Practice/Qualifying, tyres will be taken from the overall quantity as per ERC Art.62.1.

For Competitors taking part in the Shakedown, tyres will not be marked.

All tyres used must be readily available commercially and must comply with FIA-RRSR, Appendix V.

Type of tyres for ERC Junior competitors will be specified by a Bulletin. .

- Tyre marking is obligatory for all the competitors.
- All tyres must have a specific moulded barcode number supplied by the 2016 FIA-approved barcode supplier.







During the tyre marking procedure crews and up to one team member must give the Scrutineers any assistance required. The cars must be presented at the tyre Marking Zone with their spare wheels placed with the outer part of the rim on top, and if needed, unfastened, to facilitate the procedure. Following the marking, and before the cars departure from the tyre marking area, crews, or their team member, must properly fasten the spare wheels as required.

Tyre Marking during the rally

Tyre marking for the tyres that will be used during the Free Practice/Qualifying Stage will take place after the exit TC from the Service Park at Otepää. All tyres (including spare tyres) will be marked.

A tyre Marking Zone will be after Start Podium in Tartu. During the rally the Tyre Marking Zone will be after the exit TC from the Service Park at Otepää.

One team member for each crew may assist during the marking. This team member must enter and leave the Tyre Marking Zone at the same time with the car. In the Tyre Marking Zone after Start Podium no team members are allowed to assist the crew.

6.2. MEANS OF CONTROL

At any time during the rally, controls may be carried out to check the conformity of the tyres.

6.3. VEHICLE EQUIPMENT

Each entering vehicle is allowed to carry, on-board and properly fixed, a maximum of two spare wheels.

6.4. SANCTIONS

Any breach of the tyre regulations will be reported to the stewards, who may impose a sanction as provided for in Articles 12.2 and 12.3 of the Code.

6.5. TYRES USED FOR RECONNAISSANCE

Only E- or DOT-approved homologated road legal tyres are allowed. Retreaded tyres are forbidden for reconnaissance. Any treatment (ie. removing or damaging) on road tyres side markings or texts is not allowed.

6.6. NATIONAL LAWS OR SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

The use of studded tyres is prohibited. The use of tarmac tyres is prohibited.

6.7. TYRE PROVIDERS

List of fuel providers will be updated.

7. FUEL

7.1. FUEL USE

It is mandatory for participants to use Fuel in accordance with FIA Appendix J.

Cars of priority drivers and of drivers entered in the ERC Junior Championship specifically must be fitted with FIA specified fuel couplings (see FIA Technical List No 5).







7.2. REFUELLING

- All Competitors may only refuel in a Refuelling Zone (RZ). There will be a Refuelling Zone marked in the Road Book:
- Free Practice/Qualifying Stage and Shakedown: after the exit TC from the Service Park at Otepää.
- During the rally after the exit TC from the Service Park at Otepää.

Refuelling at the exit of the service park

Competitors' cars may be refuelled from drums/cans with commercially available fuel and two team members with team passes may access the RZ to assist each crew. The use of plastic canister is forbidden at RZ-s.

Refuelling procedure

Only crew members and support personnel are responsible for compliance with fire safety regulations during the refuelling.

During the whole event (Free Practice, Qualifying Stage and Shakedown included) FIA ERC Junior competitors must use fuel only from Statoil pump fuel station which is situated at Võru Str. 250 in Tartu, GPS coordinates 58°20'34′′ 26°42'53′′.

The fuel that FIA ERC Junior competitors must use is Miles Plus 98 and filling of the canisters is allowed starting from 9:00 on 12 July 2016. Service crews are obliged to fill this fuel in their own canisters. **During the rally, refuelling of the competition cars is allowed only in the Refuelling Zone at the exit of Service Park.**

7.3. FUEL PROVIDERS

List of fuel providers will be updated.

8. IMPORT OF VEHICLES AND SPARE PARTS

- Competitors coming from the European Union do not need to make any special custom clearance for temporary import of cars and equipment with the purpose to participate in auto24 Rally Estonia.
- Entrants from outside the European Union have to report to the customs at arrival in Estonia.
- Please contact the Custom authorities in Estonia well in advance, on telephone Estonian Tax and Customs Board (Narva mnt 9j, 15176 Tallinn) Phone: +372 880 0814 for current information about the correct procedure.

9. HELICOPTERS

In accordance with the FIA guidelines on helicopter use, all helicopters flying in the support of the rally must be registered with the Organisers.

Only helicopters registered with the organisers will be permitted to fly within the airspace and land at the service areas or other ERC sites during the rally.

12. RECONNAISSANCE

12.1. RECONNAISSANCE REGISTRATION

Reconnaissance registration will take place at the same time with administrative checks as follows:

Wednesday 13 July 15:00 – 20:00 Thursday 14 July 07:00 – 10:00

Location: Rally HQ, Tehvandi Sport Center, Otepää

12.2. RECONNAISSANCE SCHEDULE

THURSDAY, 14 JULY

Time: 8:00 – 21:00

SS 2/4, SS 3/5, SS 6/8, SS 7/9, SS 11/14, SS 12/15, SS 13/16

Free Practice / Qualifying Stage / Shakedown

Reconnaissance on SSS1 Tartu City Stage and SS10 Elva City Stage is allowed from Wednesday 13 July 15:00 until Friday 15 July at 12:00.

Reconnaissance on the route on the territory of Tehvandi Stadium complex (Special Stages to Regrouping, Regrouping to Service Park, Service Park to Refuelling Zone) is allowed on Friday 15 July starting from 7:00.







12.3. REGISTRATION FORM

The duly completed reconnaissance registration form, including details of the reconnaissance car, driver and co-driver and accommodation during the rally, has to be submitted during the registration or sent by e-mail to karmen@rallyestonia.ee before registration.

The form is available in appendix to the Rally Guide, published on website www.rallyestonia.com under section Competitors – ERC – Documents – Forms.

12.4. CHECKING OF RECONNAISSANCE CARS

Reconnaissance cars will be checked after collecting reconnaissance materials in front of Rally HQ and also during reconnaissance. Reconnaissance cars must comply with Art.25.1 of FIA RRSR.

If, for any reason, a crew is forced to replace the reconnaissance car during the reconnaissance, the secretariat (phone: +372 73 55 101) must be informed about the details of the new reconnaissance car. Failure to follow this procedure will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance.

12.5. RECONNAISSANCE IDENTIFICATION

The crew will receive identification for their car (2 number stickers). The number stickers must be fixed to the top right of the front windscreen and rear right side window during reconnaissance at all the times.

Each crew will be issued with a reconnaissance card valid for the passages through each Special Stage. The card will be given to Competitors after checking of the recce car. This card must be carried in the reconnaissance vehicle (accompanied by a personal ID document) and must be shown during reconnaissance to Organisers and police. Failure to hand in this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance.

12.6. NUMBER OF PASSAGES

Reconnaissance is permitted a maximum of 2 passages over each Special Stage (Special Stages run twice are considered to be one Special Stage). SS 2/4 and SS 7/9 are considered to be different stages.

After finish of SS 2/4, cars must follow the liaison section given in the Road Book.

12.7. NUMBER OF PERSONS ON BOARD

During each passage through a Special Stage, a maximum of 2 persons (the crew) are permitted in the car.

12.8. SPEED LIMIT

All reconnaissance of the Special Stages has to be done at reasonable speed in accordance with Estonian traffic rules. The maximum speed set for the reconnaissance of the SS is 80 km/h, except for those areas in which there are speed limit signs or in built-up areas (50 km/h or 30 km/h) or other limitations marked in the Road Book.

12.9. RESTRICTION OF RECONNAISSANCE

Any driver, or his co-driver, or any other team member who has entered or intends to enter the rally and who wishes to drive 3 months ahead the rally on any road which is or might be used as a Special Stage in that rally, may only do so after he has obtained written permission from Clerk of the Course. Failure to respect this rule shall result in the driver being reported to the Stewards. The restricted roads will be published on website www.rallyestonia.com.

12.10. RADAR DETECTION EQUIPMENT

The fitting or carrying of radar detection equipment during reconnaissance (or any other time in road traffic) is not permitted. Infringements will be reported to Stewards.







12.11. RALLY-SAFETY-TRACKING-SYSTEM (GPS-TRACKING)

The Organiser will provide a rally-safety-tracking-system, which has to be used during reconnaissance in the reconnaissance car and during rally in the competition car.

- Safety and tracking equipment principles. Safety and tracking equipment will be connected with monitoring station which will store all the transferring data. All data will be also stored into the safety and tracking equipment. The device has autonomous power supply, which will maintain the functioning of the equipment during all the event. The device has "SOS" and "OK" buttons installed. Every device has its unique serial number, which will be assigned to every crew. Geographical position of every crew will be monitored during the reconnaissance and the rally at Rally Headquarters.
- The deposit for safety and tracking equipment. Every competitor during the issue of safety and tracking equipment has to pay 200 EUR deposit. Deposit will be returned to the competitor after returning the equipment on time and in proper condition.
- The procedure of issuing and returning of safety and tracking equipment. Safety and tracking equipment is issued during administrative checks. Collection of the equipment: The crew has to uninstall the equipment by themselves GPS units and brackets must be disassembled from the rally cars by the crew after time control TC 16A IN, in the Regrouping & Technical zone. In case of retirement, the GPS will be given to the GPS unit's team in Rally HQ by Sunday 17 July 17:00 at the latest.
- The use of safety and tracking equipment. The competitor is responsible for installing of equipment and putting the information sticker by himself. The same device is used during the reconnaissance and the event. Competitors must have installed the speed control and safety tracking devices in reconnaissance cars before reconnaissance starts. During the reconnaissance the device has to be installed in visible place that marshals and other rally officials could identify it. The crew which will not use the device during reconnaissance, has not installed device or has dismantled the device during the rally will be fined (1000 EUR) penalty and must install the device immediately. For repeated infringement the competitor will be fined (290 EUR) penalty.
- Safety and tracking equipment including the information sticker has to be installed into the rally car according to the scheme specified in appendix to Rally Guide 2. The system will be installed to the rally cars by the crews before Rally Start. Crews taking part in Free Practice/Qualifying Stage must present the fitted GPS tracking device at the exit TC of Service Park, between Tyre Marking Zone and Refuelling Zone. If crews wish to participate in Shakedown they must arrive at the start of Shakedown with checked system. Crews taking part in Shakedown must present the fitted GPS device at the same place. Competition cars not equipped with the GPS tracking device will not be allowed to start. Crews not taking part in Free Practice / Qualifying Stage / Shakedown, must present the fitted device to the Scrutineers in pre-start holding area on Friday 15 July from 18:00 until 19:00.
- Competition cars not equipped with the GPS monitoring device will not be allowed to start.
- Any attempt to tamper with, to manipulate or to interfere with the tracking device fitted to the competition car or any device that fails to record a trace due to external interference will be reported to the Stewards who may impose a penalty up to exclusion.
- Any competitor retired from the rally should report to rally headquarters on the reason, time and place of retirement by the phone number specified in the safety and tracking (GPS) equipment sticker. Also the retired competitor must return the time card to the nearest TC marshal at the end of the special stage or to return to the Sweeper car which follows after the last competitor.

In case the competitor gets into accident, causing spectators or competitors injury, the crew member must immediately inform not less than 3 following crews about the accident by showing "SOS" sign and contact by the phone number specified in the safety and tracking (GPS) equipment sticker with Rally Headquarters.

Wrong "SOS" and/or "OK" signal transmission will be reported to the Stewards who may apply a penalty.







13. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

Pre-rally Scrutineering venue: Weizenbergi 63a, Kanepi (the relevant road book will be published in appendix to Rally Guide2)

Date: Thursday 14 July at 13:00-22:00 Scrutineering, sealing & marking of components for all drivers.

Any crew taking part in the rally, or their representative must arrive at the Scrutineering and present the car in accordance with the timetable to be issued in a Bulletin. Any lateness entering to pre-rally Scrutineering area will be sanctioned with a fine of 30 EUR for each 10 minutes delayed. Driver and co-driver are not required to attend Scrutineering.

- Transversal Mud-flaps. It is mandatory for all participating cars to be equipped with transverse mud-flaps (all wheels) in conformity with Appendix J (Art. 252.7.7).
- Drivers' safety equipment. At Scrutineering competitors must produce all items of protective clothing, underwear, including helmets and a FIA approved head restraint (FHR, formerly called HANS) intended to be used. Compliance with Appendix L Chapter III will be checked.
- Special requirements. Please be reminded, that each competing car must be equipped with a first aid kit, 1 reflective warning triangle, 2 belt cutters, "OK/SOS" sign, general circuit breaker, anti-torpedo tabs.

An example of anti-torpedo device:



13.1 PREPARATIONS FOR SCRUTINEERING AND SEALING

- Read carefully Article 11 of the Supplementary Regulations!
- In reference to the FIA RRSR, articles 26 and 63 concerning the use of mechanical components, sealing and marking, all competitors are asked to carefully read these articles.
- These regulations order competitors to prepare for sealing:
- turbochargers/compressors and air restrictors valid to ALL competitors;
- engine block valid to ALL competitors;
- all transmission units (front/central/rear differentials and gearboxes, the ones installed and spares) valid to FIA/ERC priority drivers and ERC Junior Championship Drivers.
 - The competitors must themselves make all the preparations for sealing before arriving to the scrutineering, i.e. they have to drill the holes for the sealing wires and they must have a reliable wire installed in these holes. Wire shall go through at least two bolts. The wire may be wrapped for a maximum of 20 mm, and an excess of at least 20 cm of the unwrapped wire must be available. This way the scrutineers only have to check the parts and







the wires, as well as do the actual sealing. The sealing holes on the engine block (solid part in block) should be placed so that the seal is easily accessible and visible when opening the bonnet.

- All underbody protection hindering these operations must have been removed from the car before coming to the scrutineering. Anyhow, these items must be carried with the car for the purpose of weight checks. If sump guards or shields are not removed, car is not allowed to continue the scrutineering.
- Car will not be allowed to enter scrutineering area, if sealing wires are not installed beforehand.
- FIA watermarked & stamped copy of homologation form must be presented in the scrutineering. Note, that printed copies are not accepted. As an addition, the original homologation document of homologated rollcage must be available, with matching numbers. Special effort is aimed to rollcage structure and weldings (compliance with specs/drawings and welding of whole perimeter of the tube).
- All cars having a non-standard catalytic converter must have the catalytic converter homologation document with the car.
- An FIA technical passport is mandatory for S2000, R5, Super 1600 and RGT cars.
- Please note that there is no time to fix non-conformities in the scrutineering, so make sure everything is in order when arriving to scrutineering! In case of any doubts, rather ask us before coming to scrutineering!

- The use or carring of any radar detection equipment onboard of any car (reconnaissance car, competition car, team/service vehicle) is forbidden by law and may be penalised by police.
- Minimum two (2) 6 kg fire extinguishers per competing car are required in crew's area in Service Park.

13.2 SAFETY TRACKING SYSTEM

See Art.12.11 above

13.3 ON-BOARD CAMERA

- If required by the ERC Promoter, an entrant must carry an on-board camera or other recording device. This will be fitted by the ERC Promoter and approved by a Scrutineer.
- The competitor of any car, which carries an on-board camera, must have the prior agreement of the ERC Promoter. Authorized cameras will be identified by an adhesive decal and must be mounted in the car at the time of Scrutineering.

Competitors wishing to use a camera must supply the following information to the ERC Promoter at least one week before the start of reconnaissance: competitors name, car number, entrant address and use of footage (Art 65.1 FIA RRSR) to the following e-mail address: antonios argyropoulos@discovery.com .

13.4 FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

Final Scrutineering

Date: Sunday 17 July starting from 18:00.

Venue: Veho Eesti AS (Citroen Centre), Tähe 110, Tartu

Competitors who will be selected for final Scrutineering (Stewards' decision) are requested to provide proper equipment (including all sealed spare parts) and mechanics at the Final Scrutineering venue.

Each selected car will be driven to and from Final Scrutineering by a designated member of the team (who must be present at the finish), and accompanied by an official.

In case of a protest, the said car will be checked at the same venue.







14. FREE PRACTICE, QUALIFYING STAGE AND SHAKEDOWN

14.1 DATE AND TIME

A Free Practice/Qualifying stage for FIA and ERC priority drivers will take place at Vana-Otepää – Kintsli road. The Qualifying Stage becomes a Shakedown Stage for non-priority competitors after Qualifying is complete. **Shakedown is free of charge for participants**.

The Service area will be the same as during the rally, at Otepää Sport Center.

Time: Friday 15 July

- Free Practice at 10:00-12:30
- Qualifying Stage at 13:00
- Shakedown at 15:15-16:15

14.2 FREE PRACTICE / QUALIFYING STAGE

Free Practice and Qualifying stage will be organised according to Art.30 of 2016 FIA RRSR - ERC

Participants

All FIA and ERC Priority drivers (registered drivers) who have passed Scrutineering. Competition numbers and advertising plates must be affixed to the cars. Driver and co-driver are obliged to wear safety equipment as for the Special Stages during the competition.

Location

Vana-Otepää – Kintsli, 4.05 km from Service Park. Distance of the Stage is 2.95 km.

** Specific map issued in appendix to Rally Guide 2.

Reconnaissance

Reconnaissance on Free Practice/Qualifying Stage/Shakedown will be on Thursday 14 July at 8:00-21:00, max. 2 passages

Running of Free Practice

The eligible drivers may complete a maximum of 2 passages of practice within the timeframe specified in the Programme. Drivers will start Free Practice with 1-minute intervals.

Breakdown during Free Practice

A competitor whose car is unable to complete the Free Practice Stage will be required to wait for the organisers to recover the car to the end of the Stage after the free practice session has finished.

Running of the Qualifying Stage

After the 2 passages allowed for practice, Priority drivers will start the Qualifying Stage in the order of the current European Rally Championship classification for Drivers with a 2-minute interval between each car. A starting list will be published on Friday 15 July at 8:00.

The procedures stipulated for the start of a Special Stage will apply.

The driver and co-driver entered must be on board the car throughout the Qualifying Stage. After Qualifying Stage and Parc Fermé, Priority drivers may also participate in the Shakedown Stage

Breakdown during Qualifying Stage

Any car which breaks down during the Qualifying Stage or during the following road section will be recovered to the Parc Fermé by the Organisers once the Qualifying Stage has finished.

Any driver who does not participate or does not correctly complete the Qualifying Stage will be seeded last on the start list, amongst the Priority drivers. If more than one driver does not complete the Stage, start positions will be chosen in the order of competition numbers.

Parc Fermé after the Qualifying Stage

Any service on a car once it has started the Qualifying Stage is prohibited. All cars which participate in the Qualifying Stage must immediately and directly be brought to the Parc Fermé at Tehvandi Sport Center Stadium, Otepää and remain there until released by the Stewards.







Attribution of starting positions

The top 15 competitors entered with cars of class RC2 or RGT will choose their start position for Leg 1 Section 2 according to the results of the Qualifying Stage (FIA RRSR-ERC Art 30.8). The selection of the start order will take place on Friday 15 July at 18:00 on Podium at Town Hall Square, Tartu.

Late or early check-in

Any late or early check-in to the time control preceding the start of the Qualifying Stage (TCQS) will be considered as an incorrect participation and Art. 30.6.2 of the FIA ERC, will apply.

False start

Any false start during the Qualifying Stage, particularly one made before the signal has been given, will be considered as an incorrect participation and **Art. 30.6.2** of the FIA ERC will apply.

Service

From the beginning of the timetable for Free Practice until the individual start time of the Qualifying Stage, service may only be carried out in the Service Park (the same Service Park as during the rally, at Tehvandi Sport Center)

14.3. SHAKEDOWN

The Qualifying Stage becomes a Shakedown Stage after Qualifying is complete.

Shakedown is free of charge for participants.

Number of passages is not limited during Shakedown. Exact location and all other information about Shakedown will be published in appendix to Rally Guide 2.

Participants

All drivers who have passed Scrutineering. Competition numbers and advertising plates must be affixed to the cars. Driver and co-driver are obliged to wear the safety equipment as for the Special Stages during the competition

No previous registration is needed.

Location

Vana-Otepää – Kintsli, 4.05 km from Service Park. Distance of the Stage is 2.95 km.

Reconnaissance

Reconnaissance on Free Practice/Qualifying Stage/Shakedown will be on Thursday 14 July at 8:00-21:00, max. 2 passages

Service

Service Park will be the same Service Park as during the rally, at Tehvandi Sport Center.

Disclaimer

Any person on board the car during shakedown who is not entered for the rally must have signed the disclaimer – issued in appendix to Rally Guide 2 - Forms (www.rallyestonia.com/competitors) – accompanied by photocopy of Passport or Identity Card, waving the Organisers as well the driver and/or a competitor of any consequence that may result from an accident.

15. START PROCEDURE

Before Ceremonial Start there will be an autograph signing session for invited drivers. The list of drivers will be published in a COC communication.

The start list for the Ceremonial Start will be published on Friday 15 July at 17:00.

The start interval for the Ceremonial Start and SSS 1 will be 1 minute for all crews.

Crews will start the Ceremonial Podium in the sequential order of competition numbers (Car no.1 is first to drive over the Ceremonial Podium, followed by car.no.2, 3 etc)

The Ceremonial Start will take place on Friday 15 July at 19:00 on Podium in the centre of Tartu.







A Holding Zone will be organised before the Start Podium.

Competition cars must be present in this Holding Zone at 18:00. Cars may not be transported to the Holding Zone on trailer, but they may be unloaded from the trailer in the area shown in appendix to Rally Guide 2.

From the moment Competitors arrive at the Holding Zone, repairs or any assistance will not be allowed.

All crews must wear overalls during the Ceremonial Start.

After the Podium Ceremony, Tartu City Stage will follow.

After completion of the City Stage, cars will be driven straight to the overnight Parc Fermé.

16. FINISH PROCEDURE

After the final Special Stage all crews will continue to Service Park and from there to the end of rally Podium Finish in Tartu. The finish of the rally will be at TC 16D. From there, Competitors must follow instructions of the officials and Road Book to drive over the Finish Podium and to Parc Fermé. Cars to be expected for Final Scrutineering will be collected and guided by the officials from the Parc Ferme.

Prizes for all Competitors/crews will be awarded on the Podium. For the first, second and third in the overall classification an "Olympic-style" podium will be used.

After the Podium Ceremony, cars will be driven straight to the final Parc Fermé.

The drivers expected to attend the Press Conference will be guided to Atlantis Conference Centre at 17:45 for the Press Conference.

Removal of cars from the Final Parc Fermé

Cars may be removed from final Parc Fermé once the Stewards authorise its opening. Provided that the above takes place as scheduled, all cars must be removed no later than 21:30 on Sunday 17 July. In order to collect their cars, drivers or their authorised representative must present the "Removal of car from the final PF" document issued by the Organisers to the marshal in charge. This document will be distributed to Competitors when entering the final Parc Fermé.

17. PR-ACTIVITIES

Before Ceremonial Start there will be an autograph signing session for invited drivers. The list of drivers will be published in a COC communication.

During 3 rally days there will be a rally entertainment area close to the Podium area in Tartu, featuring an entertainment programme, shows, competitions etc. There will be an EXPO-area of auto24 Rally Estonia cooperation partners and a Kids' Playground Area – entertainment for the whole family.

18.3 MEDIA CENTRE, SATELLITE MEDIA CENTRE

19. POLICE, MEDICAL AND SAFETY SERVICES

- If You are in Estonia and need to call the police, fire or rescue services and ambulance, please dial the emergency call number 112 (available even if the SIM-card is not installed).
- Calls to phone number 112 are free of charge.







- Our police are there to help you. Don't hesitate to approach them if you are worried. Most speak English well or, if they don't, will quickly find a colleague who does. The Estonian Police are trained to give first aid.
- In case you need health care while staying in Estonia
 - Only the necessary medical care is reimbursed (which has become necessary during your stay in Estonia).
 - Check if the provider of health care service has a contract with Estonian Health Insurance Fund (private care is not refundable).
 - Present your European Health Insurance Card.
 - In case you do not have a European health insurance card, request your institution of the place of residence to fax the Certificate provisionally replacing the European health insurance card.
 - In case you do not have a European health insurance card and it is not possible to get the Certificate provisionally replacing the European health insurance card, the doctor has a right to present you the bill.
 - Make sure you get the so called doctor's explanation form. (list of the health care services received).
 - In case of reimbursement, present the paid bills, documents of payment and doctor's explanation form to institution of the place of residence. More information: +372 669 6630.
 - * Emergency medical care unit: L. Puusepa Str. 8, Section G1. Phone +372 731 8195, +372 731 8202 The accident ward and the emergency medical service unit are open 24/7. In Tartu, both the emergency medical care unit and the accident ward are located in Puusepa St. 8. In the case of emergency treatment, you may always go to the emergency reception or call an ambulance.
- Charges are made to non EU citizens but unless you are critically ill and have to stay in hospital, these will usually be so low that you will not need to claim them back on insurance.

Traffic

- Visitors need driving licence, provided it is valid for the class of vehicle they wish to drive.
- The maximum speed limit is 90 km/h, in residential areas 50km/h, unless otherwise indicated.
- The use of front and rear seat belts is compulsory.
- The blood/alcohol limit in Estonia is 0 milligrams of alcohol per litre of blood (zero tolerance). Driving while under the influence of drugs and alcohol is prohibited and strict penalties are in place for anyone caught doing so.
- It is illegal for drivers to use a mobile phone without a hands-free device and holding a telephone in hand while the vehicle is moving.
- Headlamps must be on at all times while driving.
- Don't cross the road unless the pedestrian light is green. Even if you think it is safe to cross on the red light, you never know where traffic may come from. Do wait the necessary few seconds and then You will be absolutely safe.

The city of Tartu

The university city of Tartu sits on the Emajõgi river. The large student population and wealth of museums means that the city is always alive with interesting and new events to entertain you.

Come to Tartu and see the famous kissing sculpture, meet the Tartu ghost (perhaps) and use it as a base for your South Estonia explorations.

Tartu is Estonia's second largest city (population: 97 570 inhabitants) and also the oldest one in the Baltic States – first mentioned in 1030.

Tartu has always been the intellectual capital of Estonia. It is the cradle of the Estonian Song Festival, Estonian Theatre and the Estonian State. In the period Estonians call "The national awakening" Tartu was known as the Athens of the Emajõgi River ("Mother River") and until now the city has retained its intellectual and bohemian ambience.

<u>Tartu University</u> is one of the oldest universities in Northern Europe (founded in 1632) and has produced many eminent scientists and scholars of international repute such as Baltic German biologist Karl Ernst von Baer and famous Russian semiotician and culturologist Juri Lotman. Tartu still has a very large student population and the best time to meet them is in spring, where The Student Spring Days combine youthful exuberance with academic traditions.

Perhaps you will encounter the "Tartu Ghost" – a mysterious being that makes you spend too much time and come back to Tartu over and over again. Where does the Ghost live? Nobody knows, but you can feel its presence almost everywhere- in the city district *Supilinn*, ("Soup Town"), on <u>Toome Hill</u>, in the cosy little cafeterias and in the University. Local people also say that time flows slower in Tartu.

Decorated with terra cotta details, Tartu's St. <u>John's church</u> (Jaani kirik) is considered a prime example of European Gothic architecture. The nearby <u>St. Anthony's Court</u> (Antoniuse Õu) acts as a marketplace where Estonian craftsmen sell a range of goods from pottery to leather to cloth artwork.

Theatre performances, concerts, festivals, conferences happen all year round. Tartu is a hot bed of creative and scientific culture: with high quality promenade concerts, the Emajõgi River Summer theatre, the Hanseatic Days and various music events – you'll never get bored. Tartu is also home to more than 20 museums.

Tartu is a city for everybody- families, intellectuals, <u>backpackers</u>, <u>romantic couples</u>, <u>people interested in culture and art</u>-you name it! There are always reasons to come back – not least to warm up your relationship with the Tartu Ghost.

The town of Elva

Elva - a lovely summer resort with beautiful nature and stunning wooden architecture, is located only twenty minutes drive from Tartu and little more than two hours drive from Tallinn.

Within easy reach and well worth exploring there are beautiful natural surroundings characterized by the clear watered lakes, picturesque riverbanks, peaceful forest parks and pinewoods.

Elva is famous for its lakes, such as Verevi, Arbi and Paisjärv. These are favourite swimming spots for many.

Elva is unique to its forest parks and abundance of pines: a third of the total territory of the town lies under forest parks and nearly 90% of the trees growing there are pines.

A dominant element in Elva is the train station which today is a visitors' information center and which used to be an important trade route in the past centuries.

Detailed information on hikes on foot or by bicycle can be obtained from the visitors' information center. The Elva river, with old water mill sites and rapid banks, is popular for canoeing. In winter skiers can participate in the Tartu Marathon, belonging to the Worldloppet series. Its 60 km track from Otepää to Elva can be cycled through on mountain bikes in summer.

The Municipality of Otepää

Otepää is a small town set in the hills of south Estonia.

It is the most well-known winter sports centre in the Baltics and the Winter Capital of Estonia. Otepää got its name, which in Estonian means "bear's head" after the shape of the castle hill - which reminds you of a bear's head. It's also where in 1224, Bishop Hermann started building the first known brick castle in Estonia, The Stone Fort.







In summer you can hike along the paths of the Otepää Nature Park, see the landscape of rolling hills and lakes, romantic winding village roads and small rivers. Beautiful views open from observation towers on top of Tehvandi and Harimägi hills. You can also take part in different sports or simply have a good time at lake Pühajärve, which is a jewel among Estonian lakes. Pühajärv was also the first Estonian lake to earn the Blue Flag in 2000.

Those who believe in supernatural power should pay a visit to the so-called "energy pillar" in Otepää. It is believed that when you touch it, it will give you a great shot of energy and good health.

In wintertime Otepää is a winter sports paradise for skiers, snowmobile riders and for anyone who enjoys the snow: there are slalom slopes equipped with elevators and lots of cross-country tracks.

Tehvandi Centre is recognised as an all year round training area among high level sportsmen and Kääriku has, for more than half a century, been a favourite of Estonian winter sports fans. Otepää and its surroundings are where Estonian Olympic medalists (such as Jaak Mae, Andrus Veerpalu and Kristiina Šmigun) have lived and trained.
