### 4. ENTRIES

#### 4.I Closing date for entries

The closing date of entries is Monday 30 May 2016 at 18:00 hrs (local time).

#### 4.2 Entru procedure

Those who wish to take part in 73rd Rally Poland must fill in the electronic entry form published at www.rallypoland.pl duly completed before the closing date for entries. Entry form is available on the Organiser's website under the competitors section.

Manufacturers, WRC Teams, and drivers registered in WRC 2, WRC 3 and Junior WRC Championships make their entries by using the standard entry forms for their championships, which may be obtained from the FIA.

The entry application will only be accepted if accompanied by:

- The proof of payment of the total entry fee or a receipt issued by the competitor's National Sporting Authority
- Photocopies of the Competitor. Driver and Co-Driver Competition licenses
- Photocopies of the Driver and Co-Driver driving licenses
- Photocopy of 1st page of the car homologation form for the entered car.

Foreign drivers must be in possession of the approval of their own ASN which must be attached to the entry form or shown at administrative checks at the latest.





Original of entry form must reach the Organiser (Rally Office – address details in Art. 2.3) no later than Monday 6 June 2016

#### 4.3 Number of competitors accepted and classes

#### 4.3.I Number of entrants

Entries will be limited to 70 competitors.

The criteria for acceptance of entries will be in the following order:

- FIA PI drivers
- FIA P2 drivers
- FIA P3 drivers
- Drive DMACK Fiesta Trophy drivers
- Rest of the entries at Organisers sole discretion

No entry can be guaranteed before the entries closing date. After this date the Organisers will inform crews whose entry has not been accepted.

#### 4.3.2 Classes

With reference to Art 4 in 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulation, the classes will be divided according to table below. Cars entered in a class with less than 5 entrants will be elevated to the next class.

#### 4.6 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- · to candidates whose entry has not been accepted
- in the case of the rally not taking place

Organisers may refund 30% of the entry fee to those competitors who were unable to start the rally for reason of "force majeure" as agreed by the Stewards (certified by their ASN). This must be applied for in writing giving the reason for claim





including bank and account details.

### **» 5. INSURANCE**

#### 5.

The entry fee includes the insurance premium for the competitors' civil liability to third parties whose taker is PZM (Polish Automobile and Motorcycle Federation). Comprehensive vehicle insurance and personal accident insurance are the sole responsibility of the entrant / competitor.

### <u>5.2</u>

The cover of this Insurance is limited to €10,000,000.00 per accident, in corporal or material damage.

#### 5.3

The insurance will come into effect from scrutineering. It will cease at the end of the rally or at the moment of retirement or exclusion. During the Shakedown the rally cars will be covered by the same Insurance.

#### 5.4

In case of an accident, the competitor or his representative must notify the Clerk of the Course in writing as quickly as possible and within 24 hours. He must explain the circumstances under which the accident occurred, eventual causes and consequences. Likewise he must mention the names and addresses of any witnesses.

#### 5.5

By submitting their entries, the competitors, drivers and car owners waive any claims or rights to pursue action for damages in connection with the event against the Organiser.

#### 5.6

The service vehicles, even those bearing special plates issued by the Organisers, may never be considered as official participants in the rally. They are therefore not covered by the insurance policy of the rally and remain the sole responsibility of their owner. The same is valid for the cars used by the Competitors during reconnaissance, even bearing a serial number or an event specific sticker.

# » 6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

#### 6.I Organiser's advertising

The optional Organiser's advertising which will be affixed on Competitors cars will be communicated later by a bulletin.

#### 6.2 Rally plates & Identification numbers

The Organisers will issue Competition Numbers, according to Article I8 of the FIA WRC Sporting Regulations. These Competition Numbers, Rally Plates and Optional Advertising must be affixed on the car before pre-event scrutineering as shown





in Appendix 4 of these regulations and must be visible throughout the duration of the rally.

#### 6.3 Advertising restrictions

#### 6.3.1

No political, religious or abusive advertising. Advertising for alcoholic beverages and tobacco are forbidden. These laws apply to competing cars, service cars, team equipments and clothes.

#### 6.3.2

The Organizer of the 73rd Rally Poland and its commercial partner have the exclusive rights to run every kind of promotional, advertising and commercial activities in the Service Park, the Rally Fan Park, premises of rally HQ i.e. the area and surroundings of Hotel Gołębiewski and the entire route of the rally and the vicinity understood as the area remaining within the eyesight from the route of the rally. This applies to every portion of the road i.e. both the special stages and the road sections.

#### 6.3.3

Every promotional, advertising and commercial activity not authorized by the organizer or the commercial partner will be considered as the unauthorized activities.

#### 6.3.4

Each company interested in running any promotional, advertising or commercial activities at the 73rd Rally Poland should contact with the organizer and/or commercial partner with suitable advance and sign the agreement.

#### 6.3.5

The organizer has the right to undertake suitable legal action according to civil and sporting law in order to remove immediately every effect of unauthorized activities including any advertising medium and commercial or exhibit booth.

#### 6.3.6

Every competitor and every crew entered to the rally have the right to display the advertising media of their sponsors only on their vehicles (including the competing car), garments of the team members and within the area of their space in the service park provided that these media will be installed in such a way that they do not cause the danger to people and objects nearby.

#### 6.3.7

The Clerk of the Course has the right to bring every case of unauthorized activities to the Stewards who may impose the penalty on the competitor / team who was found quilty.

#### 7.3 Tyre Fitting Zone

Tyre Fitting Zone will be located in the city of Goldap. All Competitors are responsible for the transportation of their tires to TFZ. The target time for the TFZ will be IO minutes. One team personnel may be present in the zone for the changing of tyres and as allowed by Art. 60.8. of the 2016 WRC Sporting Regulations. More information regarding TFZ organization and transportation of the tyres to the Zone will be published in the Rally Guide 2.

#### 7.4 Tyre marking locations

All tyres used throughout the duration of the event, will be marked at the exit of the Refuel Zone (Mikolajki) and at the exit of the Tyre Fitting Zone (Goldap).

#### 7.5 Tyre Barcode

As per 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art.60.1.4, each tyre must have either:

- Two identical moulded barcode numbers (one on each side of the tyre / each barcode having a different colour as defined by the FIA) supplied by the 2016 FIA-approved barcode supplier, or:
- A single moulded barcode number supplied by the 2016 FIA-approved barcode supplier. The tyre barcode must always be visible from outside the car.

For environmental and safety reason all competitors must refuel in the designated refuel zones (RZ). In no case may drivers use their own refuel systems. Refuelling with petrol can, cask or similar materials is forbidden.

Only actions inside a RZ directly involved in the refuelling of the competing vehicle are permitted. The relevant personnel must be wearing clothing which will provide adequate protection against fire. See articles 58 & 59 of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.





#### 8.I Ordering procedure

Competitors must order their fuel requirements using the order form issued by Panta Distribuzione S.p.A. which is available on the official 73rd Rally Poland website: www.rallypoland.pl under the section: Competitors.

This form must be sent to: Fax: +39 0373 235123 E-mail: fuelorder@panta.it

Competitors are responsible for settling direct with the supplier, all matters relating to supply and payment. The cost of the fuel including refuel services is €5.00 per liter (VAT excl.).

#### 8.2 Closing date for ordering FIA Fuel

The closing date for ordering FIA fuel is Monday 06 June 2016

#### 8.3 RGT and non-priority drivers may either use:

- FIA fuel, following the same conditions and rules as the Priority drivers
- Commercial fuel available at filling stations marked in the road book. This fuel must be dispensed directly in to the competing cars from pumps of filling stations located on the itinerary and indicated in the road book.

#### 8.4

All Competitors are required to fit FIA specified refuel couplings, except non-priority drivers using a car which retains the standard tank.

#### 8.5

Cars equipped solely with FIA-specified refuel couplings and using fuel as per Art. 59.1.2 of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations must transport the adaptor in the car and show it at pre-rally scrutineering.

#### 8.6

No refuelling is allowed in the Service Park except if authorised as by Art 50. of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

#### 8.7

Cars of priority drivers specifically must be fitted with FIA fuel sample couplings (see FIA Technical List N°5). At any time, the car must contain at least 3L of fuel for sampling.





# » 9. RECONNAISSANCE

#### 9.I Procedure for reconnaissance registration

Reconnaissance registration will take place at the Rally Office on Monday 27 June 2016, from 16:00 to 20:00 hrs. A reconnaissance registration form including details of the car that will be used during reconnaissance must be completed before commencing reconnaissance. This form is available at www.rallypoland.pl

Pl drivers may send a representative (duly assigned by writing) to the registration for reconnaissance (administrative check for Pl will be carried out by appointment).

P2. P3 and non-priority drivers: both crew members must be present at the registration as the administrative checks for these categories will be carried out at the same time.

The reconnaissance numbers supplied during registration must be attached onto the reconnaissance car on the windscreen (co-driver's side) and rear side windows. They must be visible for the duration of the reconnaissance period.

#### 9.1.1 Participation in Reconnaissance Only

Any driver holding the appropriate international licence and not entered in the rally may apply to take part in reconnaissance of all special stages. The regulations on reconnaissance must be respected in their entirety. The Organiser must approve the application. A registration form for this purpose is available at www.rallypoland.pl The fee for taking part in Reconnaissance only is € 800.

The closing date for registration is Monday 13 June 2016.

#### 9.2. Programme

Reconnaissance will take place according to the schedule in Appendix 2.

Reconnaissance outside the schedule as set by the Organiser is considered a very serious offence and will be reported to the Stewards who may apply a penalty.

#### 9.3 Installation of speed control checking devices

All priority drivers and other crews selected by the FIA, will be required to use a speed control (GPS tracking system) to their cars during reconnaissance. The provider is SIT Sports. The use of such recorders may involve a fee. The name of the additional drivers required to carry GPS tracking system will be published by Bulletin. This tracking system will be available for collection at the Service Park (SIT Truck) on Monday 27 June 2016 between 16:00 and 20:00 hours. The equipment must be returned at the Service Park (SIT Truck) on Wednesday 29 June 2016 between 18:00 and 21:00 hrs.





#### 9.4 Restrictions and speed limit

#### 9.4.1

Competitors are permitted a maximum of two passages over each special stage during reconnaissance. All stages driven more than once in the rally will be considered as one stage for reconnaissance purposes. Under no circumstances may competitors drive in the opposite direction of the rally traffic, unless instructed by officials or the police. Competitors may only enter a special stage through the start and exit through the finish. Any infringement will be reported to the Stewards.

#### 9.4.2

The special stages will be open to normal traffic, therefore safety and rights of other road users must be respected. Competitors are reminded that vehicles may be travelling in the opposite direction.

#### 9.4.3

According to the Recce Road Book, Competitors may drive from the finish to the start of SS Stare Juchy using road which is a short part of this stage (in the opposite direction of the rally traffic). The speed limit on this part of stage during recce is 40 km/h (instructions will be given in the Road Book and Recce Road Book).

#### 9.4.4

Competitors must fully respect the Polish Traffic Law regulations. All competitors must note that there will be police controls to prevent speeding or other road infringements.

### 9.4.5 Speed limits

Maximum speed allowed during reconnaissance is 80 km/h on special stages, unless a lower speed limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the Road Book or bulletin.

#### 9.4.6

A reconnaissance record card will be supplied which must be carried in the car for the duration of the reconnaissance. This card will be signed appropriately recording every run on each special stage. Failure to produce this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance. Reconnaissance record cards must be returned to the Rally Office by IO:OO on Thursday 30 June 2016.

#### 9.4.7

Should a crew's reconnaissance car be replaced for any reason, the Rally Office must be informed of the details of the replacement car.





### » IO. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

Administrative checks will take place at the rally secretariat following the specified schedule (Art. IO.2 of these regulations). All competitors must pass administrative checks before proceeding to pre-event scrutineering.

#### IO.I Documents to be presented

At administrative checks the following documents will be checked and entry form details verified:

- Valid Entrants license
- Valid Driver and co-driver competition licenses
- · Valid Drivers' driving licences
- · Driver and co-driver passports or identification
- · ASN authorisation for foreign drivers, if required
- Rallu car's registration papers
- Car insurance cover certificate
- Car owner authorisation to participate in the rally (when the driver is not the car's owner)
- Correctness of all other information given on the entry form.

#### II.2 General

- Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team.
- Only one vehicle < 3.5 t delivering spare parts for sealing is authorised per Competitor.
- The crew must show the car's complete certified homologation form.
- The Manufacturers or WRC Teams registered in the Championship may present a signed Certificate of Technical conformity.
- All cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials, and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighing.
- Scrutineers may require to identify the car. The chassis and cylinder block will
  be marked with a special device and the competitor must prepare their car in
  order to fit a wire, a plate and a seal on the engine block (at a visible position
  to be seen when opening the bonnet).
- After scrutineering, if a car is found not to comply with technical and/or safety regulations, the Stewards may set a deadline before which the car must be made to comply or may refuse the start.

#### II.3 Transverse Mud Flaps

With reference to of Appendix J, Art 252, Art 7.7, the use of transversal mud flaps is mandatory.

#### II.4 Windows

The use of silvered or tinted films is not authorized in this rally.

#### II.5 Driver's safety equipment

Although drivers are not required to be present, all safety equipment including helmets and FHR (Frontal Head Restrain) intended to be used must be presented for checking during scrutineering. For specifications, see Appendix 5 - Safety Requirements.

#### II.6 FIA Safety Tracking System

All competitors must make provisions in their rally cars for the installation of the FIA Safety Tracking System and the emergency button. Installation instructions will be available at www.rallypoland.pl and in Rally Guide 2. The distribution of systems will take place in Service Park (SIT Truck) on Tuesday 28 June 2016 from 16:00 to 20:00hrs. Competitors will be requested to leave a deposit (credit card slip).

#### 11.6.1

The correct functioning and installation of the equipment will be checked at scrutineering.

#### 1162

According to Art. 40.3 and 40.4 of the 2016 FIA World Rally Championship Sporting Regulations, the crew must immediately push the OK/SOS button and comply with all other procedures as laid down in the Regulations in all cases when a car stops temporarily or definitively on a special stage.



### » I2. OTHER PROCEDURES

#### 12.1 Shakedown

PI drivers shall complete a minimum of 3 passages of the shakedown stage. For P2 and P3 and non-priority drivers a maximum of 3 passages is permitted over the shakedown stage.

#### 12.2 Autograph signing session

An autograph signing session will be organised at the Mikolajki Main Square on Thursday 30 June 2016 starting at 15:30hrs. Further details will be given in Rally Guide 2. Drivers required to participate will be announced by means of a bulletin.

#### **12.3 Ceremonial Start**

The ceremonial start will take place at the Mikolajki Main Square on Thursday 30 June 2016 starting at 16:00hrs. Ceremonial Start list publication will be published on Thursday 30 June 2016 at 12:30hrs. Further details will be given in Rally Guide 2.

#### 12.4 Start procedure and order

The official start of the rally will take place at the TCO (Service OUT) on Thursday 30 June 2016 starting at 18:45hrs. Competitors must check in at TCO at their published start times. Section I Time Cards can be collected at the TCO control table 10 minutes before the first car is due.

The start order for section I will be published on Thursday 30 June 2016 at 14:30hrs. The start for the rally (TCO) will be given in the same order as for the Super Special Stage (SS I). The start for the following sections will be given in accordance with Article 45.2. of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

#### 12.5 Super Special Stage, procedure and running order

SS I/IO/I8 (Mikolajki Arena) will be run under Super Special Stage regulations. At this super special two cars will start at the same time on parallel positions. The cars will follow the route of the stage, changing lanes in a tunnel/bridge combination and will cross the finish line at the same position where they started. At the Time Control before SS I/IO/I8 (Mikolajki Arena) competitors will be paired for the Super Special Stage. The instructions given by the marshals must be respected.

#### 12.5.

During SS I, the car which will be first on the Starting List will be directed to the right track, the second car will be directed to the left track. The same rule will apply to each pair of competitors.

#### 12.5.2

During SS IO/I8, the car which will come first to Time Control will be directed to the right track, the second car will be directed to the left track. The same rule will apply to each pair of competitors.

#### 12.5.3

If the running of the SSS is interrupted, this will be signaled to the drivers by yellow flag. When given this signal, the driver must immediately reduce speed and follow





the instructions of any marshals or other officials. Failure to comply with this rule will entail a penaltu at the discretion of the Stewards.

#### 12.5.4

If the super special stage is interrupted or stopped for any reason, Article 39. of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will apply.

#### 12.5.5

The maximum time for SS I/IO/I8 - Super Special Stage Mikolajki Arena is 5 minutes. Any car which fails to complete the Super Special Stage within this maximum time will be immediately removed to the road section after the STOP control by the Organiser. Time penalty will be added as in 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art. 46.2 and crew will be deemed to continue in Rally 2, respecting the requirements of WRC Art. 47 (unless the competitor notifies the Organiser otherwise).

#### 12.6 Power Stage

With reference of the Art. I3.3. in the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations SS 22 Sady -2 will be run as the "Power Stage".

#### 12.6.1 Starting Order

There will be a regroup before the start of the Power Stage (SS 22), as live TV coverage will be carried out. The start order for Power Stage (SS 22) will be determined by the Organiser in conjunction with the Promoter. All crews must be at organiser's disposal in the control area between TC2IA and TC2IB, IS minutes before their due time at TC2IB in order to be able to receive information of their UPDATED due time for the TC2IB, should this information deviate from that given at the time of their arrival to TC2IA.

#### 12.6.2 End of Power Stage

For the purposed of Live TV there may be interviews at the STOP control of the stage. The Organisers, in conjunction with WRC Promoter, may stop any car and its crew on the road section immediately after the STOP control of the stage, so that they can take part in media-related activities. These crews will be directed by officials at the STOP control of the stage. If necessary, additional time for the road section to TC22A will be given by an official at this location on the time card.

#### 12.7 Tyre Pressure Adjustment

Between TC2O and the start of SS 20 (Sady – I) the adjustment of tyre pressures by the crew is permitted.

#### 12.8 Finish procedure

The rally will end at TC22D (Finish - Holding IN). After this control a pre-finish holding area will be established and crews will be directed to the podium in the specified order outlined in Appendix IV of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations. The Podium Ceremony will take place at the Mikolajki Main Square on Sunday 03 July 2016 at 14:00 hrs. Further information will be given in Rally Guide 2.

#### 12.9 Official time used during the rally

The official time will be UTC/GMT + 2 hours (Summer DTS).



### 12.10 Change of time card during the rally

Timecard will be issued and/or changed at the time control at:

TCO, TCIB, TC5A, TCIOA for Flexi Service, TCIOD, TCI4A, TCI8A for Flexi Service, TCI8D, TC2OA and TC2IA.

### 12.11 Permitted early check-in

Crews are authorized to check-in early without time penalty at:

- TCIA (end of section I)
- TCIOC (end of section 3)
- TC I8C (end of section 5)
- TC22D (end of section 8)

#### 12.12 Starting system of special stages

The standard light sequence as describe in article 37.2 and Appendix VII of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will be used. If this start system fails the start signal will be given as specified in article 37.3 of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

#### 12.13 Re-start after retirement / Rally 2

Restart after retirement is permitted as stipulated under Art. 46 and Art. 47 of the 2016 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations. A crew which has failed to complete a section will be assumed to re-start the rally from the start of the next section following the overnight regroup unless they confirm otherwise with the Clerk of the Course by completion of the form located in the rear of the road book and lodging it with the Organizer as soon as possible before the publication of the re-start list.

#### 12.13.1

There will be no dedicated Parc Fermé for retired restarting cars. These will use the same Parc Fermé as for the rest of the event.

#### 12.14 Removal of the cars from final Parc Fermé

All cars must be removed from the final Parc Fermé within 60 minutes of the results becoming final and the Stewards have authorized the Parc Fermé to be opened. Beyond this time the Organiser will not be responsible for the cars. Only upon presentation of the Parc Fermé pass issued with the rally materials may a car be removed from the Parc Fermé by the drivers or their representatives.



## » APPENDIX 5 - SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

All entrants and drivers are reminded of the Appendix L to the 2016 International Sporting Code, in particular regarding chapter III - Drivers' equipment (helmets, flame-resistant clothing, frontal head restraint (FHR) and safety belts). These regulations apply to Shakedown as well.

Helmets

All crews must wear crash helmets which meet one of the standards listed in FIA Technical list no. 25. PI drivers must meet the FIA Standard 8860 - Advanced Helmet Test Specification (Technical list no. 33) - Strongly recommended for all drivers.

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR)

FHR systems approved by FIA are mandatory. Device has to be homologated according to the FIA Technical list no. 29.

Flame resistant clothing

All crews must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA8856 - 2000 standard (Technical list no. 27).

Drivers must be properly restrained in their seat by safety belts in conformity with the specifications of Appendix J for the vehicle concerned, at all times during an event when it is mobile on a special stage.

Safety equipment will be checked at scrutineering, and during the event.

Please refer to 2016 FIA International Sporting Code Appendix L Chapter III for complete information.

#### SIT Sports Tracking Unit

The SIT Sports Tracking unit must be fitted and connected in all competitors' cars before arrival at scrutineering, where it will be checked by SIT Sports engineers.

The tracking unit must be used together with the tracker base; this allows the quick fitting and removal of the unit. The unit and the base must be firmly mounted to a solid surface to avoid extreme shock or vibration excessive. Please be sure that the base preserves its original shock absorbing link pad, it also helps reduce vibration

IMPORTANT! Any problems must be dealt with during the 10' service so the unit has to be easy to reach and remove.



FIA Safety Emergency console

The FIA Emergency Console must be easily accessible by both the driver and the co-driver and fitted in a place where the lights, especially the Yellow Flag LED, <u>can immediately be seen by the crew while driving on stage</u>. The driver and the co-driver must be able to access the console with the seatbelt fastened.

#### Buttons, lights and Interface Description

- SOS switch: This switch (protected with a cover to avoid accidental use) must be activated in case of emergency in order to raise the alarm.
  - Deactivate the switch to cancel SOS if there is no emergency.
- Yellow Flag LED: this light will flash if Clerk of the Course activates the Electronic Yellow Flag. There is also a continuous beep when the light is on.
- 3. Console status (green light)
  - Light flashing slowly (100 ms ON/2sec OFF): console is ON and functioning normally.
  - Light flashing rapidly (300ms ON / 300ms OFF): emergency mode (SOS switch is activated).
  - Light off: console is turned OFF.
- 4. OK button (yellow flag confirmation)
  - Press the button to confirm to the Clerk of the Course that you have seen the Yellow Flag.
  - If stopped on stage and there is no emergency, press the button.



#### **Antennas**

The SIT Sports Tracking unit needs three antennas: UHF, dual GPS-GSM and GPS2 Antennas. UHF and dual GPS-GSM antennas must be installed on the roof of the car and the GPS2 antenna inside the car with a clear view to the sky, i.e. attached to the rear window. Please check the following drawing and install the antennas according to the recommended set-up:





IMPORTANT! All the antennas should be separated at least 700 mm from any other antenna (live TV patch, live TV UHF antenna, voice radio VHF antennas, etc.).

The antenna cables should be routed away from the vehicle wiring when possible.

UHF Antenna. Should be installed centered in the middle of the roof.



A hole should be made to fix the antenna on the roof.

IMPORTANT! Carefully match the PL259 antenna connector antenna to the radio and do not use any adaptor or connector.

If there is any excess coax cable do not coil the cable. Coiling coax cable will cause transmit problems and limit radio range.




Installation

SIT Sports will provide with only one 'Y' power splitter cable, the main end of this cable should be connected to the tracking box and the two other ends to the safety console and power supply (+VCC, Ground and Ignition).

Please ensure direct connection to power (+12VDC) before the circuit breaker with a 5A fuse protection. The ignition line must supply +12VDC too (it can be connect to the same terminal that +VCC).

Do not cut, shorten or bend the cable especially near the connector.

Wiring and power supply

- The red and blue wires should be directly connected to the battery before the master switch.
- The yellow wire must be connected to 12 volts (it can be connect to the same terminal that VCC - red wire - ).

During installation, try to route the DC battery leads, the antenna lead or any accessory wires away from the engine compartment, ignition or alternator wiring.

Higher frequency electrical interference caused by electric motors can be suppressed directly at the motor terminals.

Please pay special attention to the grounding. It is important to guarantee a good ground in the UHF antenna. This grounding practice is especially important when there are other sensitive electronic components (e.g. MCUs, analog circuits) as the noise induced in the ground loop by the ground current can be significant if not taken care of properly

#### IMPORTANT REMARKS

In order to reduce the level of RF interference, please observe the following precautions when you install.

- Place the tracking unit as far away from the motor as physically possible.
- · Keep the antenna cable separated from the engine compartment and power cables.
- · Place all antennas away from the motor.
- Install the UHF antenna as far as possible away from the ECU and sensors of the vehicles electronic system.
- Install the antenna feeder at least 200 mm (7.87in.) away from the ECU and sensors of the vehicles electronic systems.
- Avoid winding the antenna feeder together with the other wiring as much as possible, and also avoid running the antenna feeder parallel with other wire harnesses.
- Check that the UHF antennas is correctly adjusted and recheck the RF ground system, the RF grounding system is highly recommended to be separately from the DC or electrical ground.
- Please inform about any other mobile communications system installed that may be affecting the UHF communication.
- Check the grounding you are using.

Please also remember:

The SIT Sports tracking unit and base must be fitted and connected before arrival at scrutineering where it will be checked by SIT Sports engineers.

If you retire from the rally you must return all tracking equipment to SIT Sports at the Service Park as it was given to you, as soon as possible.

Any damage to the system will have to be paid for by the competitor. A complete price list is available from SIT Sports.

The SIT Sports Tracking unit, base, transponders and any other loaned equipment must be removed during the final service and returned to SIT Sports within 30 minutes of the closing of the final Time Control.
