1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Rally México 2018

This rally will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the 2018 FIA World Rally Championship Sporting Regulations and these Supplementary Regulations.

Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated Bulletins (issued by the Clerk of the Course or the Stewards).

Additional information will be published in Rally Guide 2, to be issued on February 6th 2018. The 2018 FIA World Rally Championship Sporting Regulations can be found at: www.FIA.com

1.2. Road Surface

- The Rally stages will be run on gravel.
- The Super Special Stages (Stages 9/10 & 17/18) will be run on mixed surface, 20% gravel and 80% asphalt.
- The Street Stage GTO (SS 1) will be run on cobblestone and concrete. [2.53 km]
- The Street Stage León (SS 5 & 19) will be run on pavement. [1.11 Km]

1.3. Distances

This Rally will have a total Itinerary distance of 1055.88 kilometres, of which 344.49 kilometres will be Special Stages. (33%)

For the NACAM Rally Championship Itinerary, only sections 1 to 4 of the itinerary will be run for a total of 225 kilometres of Special Stages.

4. ENTRIES

4.1. Closing Date for Entries

Competitors wishing to take part in the 2018 Rally Guanajuato México must submit their entry form duly completed before Tuesday, February 6th, 2018 at 18:00 hrs. (GMT - 6 hrs.).

4.2. Entry Procedure

Those wishing to take part in Rally Mexico 2018 must register and fill in the electronic entry form available at https://registrations.fia.com/wrcmex duly completed before the closing date for entries. The entry will only be accepted if accompanied by the total amount of the Entry Fee. To be accepted, competitors must send a proof of payment of the entry fee by e-mail to the secretary of the event (entries@rallymexico.com) by the closing date of entries. Foreign drivers must submit an approval from their ASN in the same e-mail.

The entry application should be accompanied by:

- The total entry fee
- Photocopies of:
 - FIA Licence of the entrant and both members of the crew
 - Drivers Licence of the crew members
 - First page of the homologation papers of the car with the number, group and cylinder capacity

Manufacturers, WRC 2 and WRC 3 entrants who wish to score points, must make their entries by using the electronic standard rally entry form for their championships available in the FIA application at https://registrations.fia.com

In the case the Driver and Entrant are the same person, both licences (Driver & Entrant) must be sent and presented at registration.

4.3. NACAM Championship

Competitors wishing to enter Rally Guanajuato Corona as a NACAM Championship competitor, please refer to the NACAM Championship regulations and specific documentation for entries, fees and specific regulations.





4.5. Number of Entrants Accepted and Classes

4.5.1. Number of Entrants

The maximum number of entries is **60**. If more than 60 entries are received, the Organisers will create a reserve list.

Entry applications outside the FIA Championships (WRC, WRC 2, WRC 3 and NACAM Rally Championship) will be confirmed after the entry closing date.

The criteria for acceptance of entries will be in the following order:

Priority 1 Drivers, Priority 2 Drivers and Priority 3 Drivers

The Organisers reserve the right to accept all other entries according to the driver results and the capacity / conditions of the vehicle entered.

4.5.2. Accepted Cars & Classes

Cars are eligible to enter as stipulated in the Article 4.5 of the 2018 WRC Regulations. All vehicles must comply with the provisions of Appendix J 2018.

4.8. Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- To participants whose entry has been rejected
- In the case of the rally not taking place

Organisers may refund 30% of the entry fee to those competitors who were unable to start the rally for reason of "force majeure" as agreed by the Stewards (certified by their ASN).





INSURANCE

Competitors and crews (driver and co-driver) are covered for public liability under a master policy held by Rallymex S.A. de C.V. for \$ 10,000,000.00 U.S. Dollars revolving coverage for any one accident or instance. The coverage includes special stages as well as road sections. The coverage will come into effect at the start of the rally and will include the Shakedown. It will cease at the end of the event or at the moment of retirement or exclusion. Full details can be obtained upon request from the Organisers.

Service vehicles and reconnaissance vehicles, including those bearing official plates issued by the Organisers, may never be considered as official participants of the rally. Therefore, they are not covered under the insurance policy of the rally and will remain the sole responsibility of their owner.

Comprehensive vehicle insurance and personal accident insurance are the sole responsibility of the entrant / competitor. As per article 2.5 of the 2018 FIA World Rally Championship Sporting Regulations, international crews are required to "have taken out an international insurance policy covering their repatriation, if necessary, after an accident".

Proof of insurance for reconnaissance cars must be shown upon registration for reconnaissance. Liability and third-party insurance as a minimum are compulsory for all crews under Mexican law.

Insurance sales are available at the secretariat during reconnaissance registration.





6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

Organisers Advertising

Rally Plates and Optional Advertising must be affixed on the car before scrutineering as shown in Appendix 4 of these regulations.

Restrictions

The advertising of alcoholic beverages is limited according to the Mexican legislation to alcoholic beverages under 22% in volume. Such brand logos may appear on the competition and service vehicles, as well as on drivers' overalls during the event.

Identification Numbers

The Organisers will issue Competition Numbers, according to Article 18 of the 2018 FIA WRC regulations. These Competition Numbers must be affixed on the car before pre-event scrutineering as shown in Appendix 4 of these regulations and must be visible throughout the duration of the rally.

8. FUEL

8.1. Ordering Procedure

All FIA Priority Drivers must use the FIA fuel. The supplier appointed by the FIA for 2018 is Panta Distribuzione S.p.A.

The order form issued by Panta with payment instructions is available on the event website: https://www.rallymexico.com/en/documents-competitors/

The cost of the fuel including refuel services is €5.00 per litre (Excl. taxes), dispensed into rally cars.

It is a condition of supply that payment must be received in full before delivery can be made. The balance of non-used fuel will be credited after the rally.

8.2. Closing Date for Ordering FIA Fuel

All competitors using FIA fuel must place their fuel order directly with Panta no later than Wednesday January 23rd, 2018. The order form must be e-mailed to fuelorder@panta.it or faxed to +39 0373-235123

8.3. Fuel Distribution

Non-Priority drivers may use either FIA fuel, following the same conditions and rules as the Priority Drivers, or commercially available pump fuel, dispensed directly into competing cars from pumps at filling stations nominated in the Road Book or when distributed from a centralised system by the organiser where filling stations are not available.

Refuel and Remote Refuel zones are as detailed in the Rally Itinerary.

For environmental and safety reasons, no refuelling is allowed in the Service Park (no refuel from cans, drums or similar) except if authorised as by Art 50 of the 2018 WRC Regulations.

8.4. Refueling

All drivers must comply with article 59.3.7 of the 2018 WRC Sporting Regulations.





9. RECONNAISSANCE

9.1. Registration Procedure

9.1.1. All entrants taking part in the reconnaissance must register at the Rally Secretariat to get all the necessary documentation before starting reconnaissance. Registration for reconnaissance can be completed according to the following schedule:

For priority 1 drivers, a team member duly designated can collect the materials. Other crews must register in person.

9.1.2. The reconnaissance ID sticker supplied during registration must be attached onto the reconnaissance car on the inside of the windshield (co-driver's side) and must be visible for the duration of the reconnaissance period.

9.2. Specific Restrictions

- 9.2.1. On special stages, the speed limit is 90 km/h unless traffic signs or lower limit zones are indicated in the reconnaissance Road Books. Additional lower limit zones may be issued before the start of reconnaissance. Competitors are reminded that stages will be open to normal traffic during reconnaissance and that they must drive in a manner that does not endanger or inconvenience other traffic or people living near the stages.
- 9.2.2. The maximum number of passengers on each special stage for reconnaissance is limited to two per entered crew. This is controlled by means of a Reconnaissance ID Sticker and a Reconnaissance Card which must be shown at the SS Start, SS Finish and if requested, to Reconnaissance Control Crews along the route.
- 9.2.3. All stages driven more than once in the rally will be considered as one stage for reconnaissance purposes.
- 9.2.4. For reconnaissance, only two passages will be allowed on each lane of the Super Special Stage.
- 9.2.5. Under no circumstances may crews drive in the opposite direction of the rally in the special stages according to the schedule, unless directed by the Organisers or authorities. Entering and leaving the special stage elsewhere than through Start and Finish controls is prohibited.
- 9.2.6. Special ID stickers will be issued for service vehicles used during reconnaissance as per WRC Reg. Art. 25.4.6.





9.3. Speed control checking devices

All crews will be required to use a special system for controlling the speed throughout reconnaissance by means of GPS.

This tracking system will be handed out at the Rally Secretariat.

The equipment will be available for collection at the Secretariat on Monday March 5th between 16:00 and 18:00. The equipment must be returned at the Rally Secretariat on Wednesday March 7th between 19:00 and 21:00 hrs.

10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

Administrative checks will take place at the rally secretariat following the specified schedule (Art. 3 of these regulations). All competitors must pass administrative checks before proceeding to pre-event scrutineering.

10.1. Documents to be Presented

The following documents will be checked:

- FIA licence of the entrant and both members of the crew
- Valid Driver's Licence for both members of the crew
- Driver and Co-Driver passport or Identification
- ASN Stamp or letter of authorisation for foreign competitors
- Information given in the entry form

10.2. Timetable

11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

Before pre-event scrutineering, competition numbers, rally plates and optional advertising, if accepted, must be affixed on the car.

11.1. Scrutineering Venue and Timetable

- 11.1.1. Sealing of parts and delivery of Scrutineering Certificates for Manufacturer cars will be held in each individual team service areas from 10:00 to 13:30 on Wednesday March 7th following a schedule published in a bulletin.
- 11.1.2. Checking of the Weight for Manufacturer cars will take place on Wednesday March 7th from 12:00 to 14:00.
- 11.1.3. Priority 2, Priority 3 & Others.

Sealing and marking of components will be performed during Pre-event Scrutineering starting at 15:00 Hrs on Wednesday March 7th in the Scrutineering Hall in Rally Campus according to a specified schedule drawn up and published in a bulletin before the event.

11.2. Transverse Mud Flaps

The use of Transverse Mud Flaps is mandatory as per Art. 252.7.7 of Appendix J of the FIA Sporting Code – Mud flaps.

11.3. Windows / Nets

The use of tinted or silvered windows, according to Appendix J, Art 253 Art 11, is authorized. Silvered or tinted films fitted on front side windows must have an opening equivalent to a circle of 70mm diameter in order to allow the occupants / content of the car to be seen.

11.4. Driver's Safety Equipment

Although drivers are not required to be present, all items of clothing and equipment in compliance with Appendix L Chapter III -including helmets and FHR (Frontal Head Restrain) intended to be used - must be presented during scrutineering.





12. OTHER PROCEDURES

12.1. Ceremonial Start Procedure and Order

The start of the rally (TC0) will take place at the Rally Campus Service OUT control on Thursday March 8th, 2018 starting at 18:15 hrs. There will be no holding area prior to the start of the rally. Competitors must check in at TC 0 at their published start times. Section 1 Time Cards can be collected at the TC 0 Control table 15 minutes before the first car is due.

From TC0 competitors will proceed to Silao, where a pre-start ceremony will take place between TC 0A and TC 0B. From there they will proceed to TC 1. There will be no escort for competitors to enter Guanajuato.

The ceremonial start will take place after the STOP control of SS1, at the "Alhondiga de Granaditas" in Guanajuato, after the "Street Stage GTO". The start interval will be 3 minutes for all competitors in section 1. The start order for the ceremonial start and until the overnight park fermé (Section 1, TC 1A) will be at the discretion of the organizers in the interest of spectators and television. The start order will be as WRC Art. 45.2 for the rest of the rally.

12.2. Time Card Changes during the Rally

Time Cards will be issued or changed at the following time controls for the start of each section:

TC 0, TC 1B, TC 5B, TC 10D, TC 13B, TC 19B, TC 21B

12.3. Finish Procedure

The rally will end at Time Control TC 22C (Service H Out - Finish Area In) After this control a pre-finish holding area will be established and crews will be directed to the podium in the specified order outlined in Appendix IV of the WRC regulations at the appropriate times.

12.4. Permitted Early Check-In

Competitors are allowed to check in early without incurring a penalty at:

- "Overnight Regroup IN" control (TC 1A and 19A)
- "Flexi-Service OUT Parc Fermé IN" controls (TC 10C and TC 18C)





12.5. Super Special Stage Procedure and Running Order

On SS 9/10 and 17/18, cars will run two at a time. At the start of stages 9 and 17, the two cars will be placed side by side in separate lanes, A and B. The first car entering the start area will be directed to lane A, the second to lane B. After completing the stages, the cars will be immediately directed to the starting gate, switch lanes and start stages 10 and 18 respectively.

The Organisers may, at their discretion, pair drivers on the stage in the interest of the spectators and television. This pairing may change the running order of the day. On Friday, there will be a 30-minute holding area between the Time Control and the first Stage Start where any changes in running order will be made. On Saturday, the holding time will be 20 minutes. The running order established from this point will remain the same throughout the remainder of the section. Refer to Rally Guide 2 for procedure diagrams.

There will not be a Time Control between special stages 9 & 10 in Section 3 and stages 17 & 18 in Section 5. Therefore, these stages will be considered as two parts of a single Super Special Stage. The road section between the finish of the first stage of the pair and the start of the second stage is enclosed within the control area and considered as Parc Fermé (WRC Reg. 2.10) where no repairs or assistance may take place.

Any crew unable to complete any of the Super Special Stages will be penalised as stipulated in Art. 46.2 of the 2018 WRC Regulations.

Should a car fail to complete any of the Super Special Stages within 4 minutes from his stage start time, the Organisers will **immediately** remove it to the road section after the STOP control. In this case, the competitor will be allocated a time of 4 minutes for each Super Special Stage that was not completed within the allowed time. If the competitor fails to complete the first stage of the Super Special in the allowed time, he may be allowed to start the second part of the Super Special Stage at the officials' discretion.

If the running of the Super Special Stage is interrupted, this will be signalled to the drivers by red flags shown by properly identified marshals.

When given this signal, the driver must immediately reduce speed and follow the instructions of the marshals or other officials. Failure to comply with this rule will entail a penalty at the discretion of the Stewards. (Article 40.5.3 of the 2018 WRC Regulations).

If the display of the red flags is caused by one of the two cars blocking the stage or delaying the other competitor, the provisions of WRC Regulations Article 39 will apply.





12.6. Special Procedures / Activities

A spectator autograph session will be organised for 30 minutes during the Regroup between 21A and 21B. All priority drivers are required to attend.

12.7. Official Time used during the Rally

Start Intervals

The start intervals between all cars from the start of Section 2, and for the remainder of the rally, will be 3 minutes.

Time

The official time throughout the rally will be that of the NIST Stations WWV and WWVB in Fort Collins, Colorado, USA, which can be found at http://nist.time.gov, and different shortwave frequencies, synchronised to the local hour of León, (GMT -6, U.S. Central Time Zone).

12.8. Re-start after retirement - Rally 2

Restart after retirement is permitted as stipulated under Art. 46 of the 2018 WRC Regulations.

12.9. Power Stage

There will be an 80 minute regroup before the start of the Power Stage (SS 22), as live TV coverage will be carried out (WRC Regs Art 13.3.2).

12.10. End of Power Stage

For the purpose of Live TV there will be interviews at the STOP control of the stage. The Organizers, in conjunction with WRC Promoter, may stop any car and its crew on the road section after the STOP control of the stage, so that they can take part in media interviews and a made-for-TV podium ceremony. These crews will be directed by officials after the STOP control of the stage. If necessary, additional time for the road section to TC 22A will be given by an official at this location on the time card.

12.11. NACAM Classification

NACAM Championship classification will start at Time Control 0 up to Time Control 13A.

Specific regulations and eligible vehicles will be published in a bulletin.





12.12. On Board Cameras

As per article 65.1 of the WRC Regulations the entrant of any car, which carries an on-board camera, must have the prior agreement of the Promoter.

Authorized cameras will be identified by an adhesive decal and must be mounted in the car at the time of scrutineering.

Competitors wishing to use a camera must supply the following information to the Promoter (accreditation@wrc.com) at least one week before the start of reconnaissance: Entrant name, car number, entrant address and intended use of footage.

13. IDENTIFICATION OF OFFICIALS

Stage Safety Officer: Green Tabard / Yellow Reflective Tabard

Doctor/Medic: White overall with "Doctor" legend

Scrutineering: Purple overall

CRO: Red Jacket with "CRO" legend

Control Officials: Orange Tabard
Safety Marshals: Yellow Tabards

- FIA NACAM Rally Champ. Classification: 1st, 2nd and 3rd Two Trophies

- Class Classification as WRC Art. 4.4: 1st : Two Trophies

- Bernard Audibert Cup: Two cups awarded to the best all Mexican classified crew (driver and co-driver).

- Note: Other contingency prizes may be awarded.





15. FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

15.1. Final Checks

- 15.1.1. Post event scrutineering will be held on Sunday March 11th starting at 15:15 hrs in the Scrutineering Hall in Rally Campus.
- 15.1.2. Those crews selected by the Stewards for final scrutineering will be notified by the clerk of the course and are required to provide the proper equipment and technicians in the Scrutineering Hall in Rally Campus.

15.2. Protest Fees

The amount of the protest fee is: €1,000.

If the protest requires the dismantling and the re-assembling of different parts of a car, the claimant must pay an additional deposit.

The expenses incurred by the work and transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest is unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if the claim is upheld.

If the protest is unfounded, and if the expenses incurred by the protest (scrutineering, transport, etc) are higher than the deposit amount, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely, if the expenses are less, the difference shall be returned to them.

15.3. Appeal Deposit

Sum of the international appeal deposit: € 6,000.



All the entrants and drivers are reminded of the Appendix L to the 2018 FIA International Sporting Code, in particular regarding Chapter III – Drivers' Equipment (helmets, flame-resistant clothing, frontal head restraint (FHR) and safety belts).

Clothing comprising overalls, gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, balaclavas, socks and shoes must be homologated to FIA 8856-2000.

These regulations also apply to the Shakedown stage.

12 Volt Power Supply (Please read carefully)


RallySafe requires a reliable power supply from 9 to 28 volts DC. We recommend a 5 amp (Max) blade type or similar quality fuse is used at the battery supply end of the RallySafe power lead.

Zero volts or battery negative can be picked up at any suitable earthing point providing the isolation switch does not switch the negative side of the battery.

The RallySafe unit has an internal battery that is kept charged via the car's power supply. It acts as a reserve supply to power the unit in the case of an accident where a car's power supply is interrupted. i.e. car battery smashed or dislodged.

In the yellow power loom there are 5 wires. White blue and grey must be stagger cut and heat shrinked or taped back so they can't short to ground or to each other. Red and black are used as follows:

Unit Mounting & Dimensions

For mounting the RallySafe unit is a RAM style 50mm x 75mm flat base with ball, bolted through the tunnel with 4 M6 Bolts. It should be in a central, protected location on the central tunnel in front of the seats and both easily visible and accessible by both the driver and co-driver/nav. Photographs of mounting and positioning can be seen below.


Here the 25mm rubber ball mount is securely attached to the tunnel.





The RallySafe unit then mounts to the 25mm rubber ball mount (connected through the RallySafe connector).


Base Dimensions:

Antenna Installation

All leads on both external and internal antennas must run on the inside of all roll cage bars. This is to stop cable crushing on impact. The preferred route is to go down from the antenna, underneath the closest part of the roll cage (roof cross or main hoop), follow that along to the roof hoop, then go down the inside A pillar to the unit. Any excess cable must be run so that the cable is not bent any tighter than a 100mm radius. We recommend running it across the underside of the dash and back (do not coil in tight loops). Cables must be tied neatly along the whole installation all the way to the unit so they can't be accidently caught or dislodged. All this will be checked at scrutineering and you may be required to fix it before your car can pass.


External Antenna:

The antenna is mounted through a 12mm hole in a central location on the ROOF of the vehicle, rear of the main roll bar hoop, allowing the cabling to pass through the roof and follow the cage bars back to the RallySafe unit location. The antenna is a fully watertight unit which seals against the roof surface.









Antenna leads are connected as follows (There may be variations with the type and number of leads).

- The 2 UHF leads, colour-coded Blue, is connected to the terminal labelled "UHF" on the RallySafe unit (Right Hand Thread). Terminals are located of the rear of the unit and/or colour-coded Blue.
- 2. The Satellite Communication antenna lead is connected to the centre or rear terminal labelled "IRI" (Left Hand Thread). It may also be colour-coded Yellow (this may be not marked on the 2-in-1 antenna).
- The GPS antenna lead labelled "GPS", is connected to the terminal labelled "GPS" on the RallySafe unit (Right Hand Thread). Terminals may be on the side or rear of the unit and/or colour-coded Green.
- 4. GSM, has a small stick antenna supplied with the RallySafe unit, and is connected to corresponding terminal labelled "GSM" on the RallySafe unit (Left Hand Thread). The terminal is located on the rear of the unit and/or colour-coded Red.






Internal Antenna:

The Internal Antenna should be placed on the inside of the ROOF in a clear uncluttered area, with a 200mm radius clear of any bar work or solid metal object. The internal antenna has a magnetic base with double-sided tape for adhesion. The cable is then run to the RallySafe unit. Please keep cable on the inner side of the roll cage pipework so as not to be crushed in the event of an accident.



Here the antenna is stuck to the inside centre of the roof (Preferred)



Please note the internal antenna must be 200mm AWAY from any roll cage components
