It is a pleasure to welcome you again to Rally Estonia!

Together with the FIA, the WRC promoter, the Estonian government, our good supporters and partners and the cohesive organising team, it is the third time for us to organise a World Rally Championship event here in small but innovative Estonia. 2021 was of significant importance to us, as the Estonian motorsport community celebrated its 100th anniversary and WRC Rally Estonia was run in full format for the first time. In 2022, it is a great honor for the Rally Estonia team to be in the official WRC calendar during the spectacular 50th anniversary season.

Our mission is to offer a high level of organisation, an unforgettable experience and extraordinary emotions to the crews, teams and spectators alike and we are excited that many innovations are waiting ahead in 2022 as well. At the same time, we are partly returning to our long-standing traditions. The Rally HQ, Media Center and Service Park are still on the territory of the Estonian National Museum, but after a two-year break, we have brought the Start and Finish Podium back to the heart of Tartu, to the Town Hall Square, which offers an unforgettable experience for both the audience and the competitors on the podium. The Powerstage is the legendary Kambja Special Stage, but in a slightly new format - the finish of the stage and the spectacular Powerstage podium are located inbetween the picturesque lakes of Leigo, where after watching the exciting finale of the the event, the spectators can applaud to the winners at the Powerstage podium ceremony.

In 2022 we are welcoming the Estonian Rally Championship drivers to join in at the rally weekend. Round 4 of Estonian Rally Championship will be run as a separate event where approximately 40 cars of the national classes will drive SSS1, SS4, SS5, SS10, SS11, SS12, SS13 after the first passage of the WRC rally participants.

Unfortunately, world peace is known to be extremely unstable at the moment, but in spite of that, we are doing our best to make the twelfth Rally Estonia an exceptional event full of adrenaline and unforgettable emotions to all participants.

RALLY GUIDE 1 HAS NO REGULATORY POWER – FOR INFORMATION ONLY

The information in Rally Guide 1 is subject to change due to COVID-19 restrictions.

1.1 ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

The organiser of WRC Rally Estonia 2022 promotes environmental awareness and makes every effort possible to ensure that the event causes as little ecological stress for environment as possible. We achieved the 2-Star Level of FIA Environmental Accreditation Programme in 2021 and will apply for the 3-star level in 2022.

WRC Rally Estonia takes responsibility about climate change and carbon footprint in our field and continues offsetting emissions via compensation. Our goal is to reduce the environmental impact by monitoring performance indicators and taking remedies in the main impact areas. Partners will be involved to fulfilling our vision through communication and training. Relevant stakeholders have been identified and we cooperate to achieve the goal.

Regarding the FIA Environmental Programme, evaluating and reducing the environmental impact of motorsport is playing an integral role. Based on the FIA's recommendations the event organisation has improved the training of marshals, formal documentation and monitoring of the environmental performance. We have improved the monitoring of the event carbon footprint and waste management system and want to be a good example in terms of environmental issues nationally as well as internationally.

WRC Rally Estonia considers important to participate in discussions of sustainable development together with scientists, other organisations and public. For that purpose we have joined the Rohetiiger (Green Tiger) programme as a founding member. Rohetiiger is a cooperation platform with an objective to become a representative organisation in sustainable development discussions, to lay down the foundation to balanced economy and to perform a green leap in Estonian society.

Key elements for WRC Rally Estonia 2022 will be to put effort into increasing the environmental awareness not only in the members of organisation and stakeholders but also among spectators, partners and teams. Environmental issues, such as selecting eco-friendly products and local services and reducing emissions are taken into consideration and uniquely identified with each partner company.

In order to promote environmental sustainability and enhance responsibility we aim to implement the following activities and ask our partners to follow them as well:

- Promote environmental awareness in all our channels and communication.
- Comply with all relevant laws and regulations, including environmental requirements and FIA Environmental Accreditation Programme.
- Require environmental responsibility from stakeholders, cooperative partners and suppliers
- Pay close attention to cooperating with all landowners, residents and road owners.
- Set environmental objectives and targets, and measure them.
- Concentrate on energy efficient and sustainable solutions, for example using renewable energy sources when possible.
- Reduce the number of documents printed on paper, preferring digital formats and printing only the documents required by the FIA.
- Reduce carbon emissions - use hybrid or electric cars as most of the organisational vehicles, enable free of charge parking of hybrid, hydrogen and electric vehicles for the spectators, hold online meetings.
- If the COVID-19 pandemic ends, search for ways to optimise transportations and logistics to decrease emissions as much as possible: carpooling, public transportation.
- Make a thorough plan for emergency situations and implement it actively.

1.2 COVID-19 INFORMATION

Due to the ongoing pandemic situation around the world, all of us need to consider that there may still be restrictions relating to COVID-19 at the time of the event. Please follow carefully any advice given by the organiser, as well as by the Estonian authorities and by those of your home country. Relevant updates will be published on our website www.rallyestonia.com and in further rally documents whenever necessary.

1.3 HISTORY OF RALLY ESTONIA

The idea to organise a new rally was born over 12 years ago when Silver Kütt, a co-driver with the experience of participating in seven WRC rallies, presented his idea to his good friend, a former WRC driver Urmo Aava. After sharing the idea with a “marketing mastermind” Tarmo Hõbe, who named the new rally “Rally Estonia”, first steps were taken.

The idea that first seemed unbelievable back in 2009, has grown year by year and now Rally Estonia has become a WRC event. The first Rally Estonia took place in 2010 and the first ever winner of the rally was the local hero Markko Märtin who won five World Championship rallies during his WRC career. The first two-time champion of the event was Mads Østberg, the winner of Portugal WRC Rally 2012, who was fastest at Rally Estonia in the years 2011 and 2012.

The high level of competition, having Märtin, Østberg and Latvala family participating among others, raised the bar high for the organisers to keep. From 2014 until 2016 Rally Estonia was part of the European Rally Championship (ERC) and in 2014 it was voted as the best ERC rally of the year.

In 2019, Rally Estonia hosted the first ever WRC Promotional rally. In June 2020 Tarmo Hõbe received a call from WRC Promoter CEO Oliver Ciesla who offered Rally Estonia to organise the first ever World Championship event in Estonia.

Estonia became the 33rd country in WRC history to host a WRC event. After a half year break in WRC calendar due to the COVID-19 virus, the first ever official WRC Rally Estonia and the 600th event in the history of WRC was run from 4-6 September.

The first winners of WRC Rally Estonia were the local heroes and 2019 World Champions Ott Tänak – Martin Järveoja.

On 11th of January 2021 Rally Estonia organising team won the ASAHI KASEI TEAM SPIRIT AWARD and two days later Rally Estonia organisers and the WRC Promoter announced that Rally Estonia will stay in WRC calendar for the years 2021 and 2022. In 2020 Rally Estonia celebrated the 10th anniversary and in 2021 Estonian auto- and motorsport celebrate 100 years.

Besides local stars Rally Estonia has welcomed many world top rally drivers over the years, such as WRC drivers Sébastien Ogier, Elfyn Evans, Thierry Neuville, Esapekka Lappi, Jari-Matti Latvala, Teemu Suninen, Craig Breen, Hayden Paddon, Yazeed Al-Rajhi, Martin Prokop, Toni Gardemeister and ERC Champions Alexey Lukyanuk, Kajetan Kajetanowicz and the rising young guns Kalle Rovanperä and Oliver Solberg.

The only crew who has won Rally Estonia three times in a row are the local heroes and 2019 World Rally Champions Ott Tänak and Martin Järveoja.

In 2021 Kalle Rovanperä and his co-driver Jonne Halttunen took the first win of their WRC career at Rally Estonia. With that achievement Rovanperä made WRC history becoming the youngest WRC Rally winner of all time at the age of 20 years and 289 days.

➤ **Participation in reconnaissance only** 1000 EUR + 20% VAT

NB! VAT is payable by all Competitors, except those Competitors from another EU member State who supply their VAT number with their entry.

5. SERVICE PARK

5.1. LOCATION AND SERVICE SPACE

The Service Park is located at Raadi airfield, Tartu.

GPS coordinates: N 58° 23.821 E 026° 45.110

Surface: concrete/asphalt

Manufacturers and other championship competitors will be allocated a designated space in accordance with 2022 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

Other legal and private competitors will be allocated an area of 12 m x 10 m.

In agreement with the Organiser, competitors may order additional service space with the price of 20 EUR/m² + 20% VAT, in case there is still additional space available in the Service Park.

If a competitor has multiple competition cars to be located together in Service Park, the application for consecutive Service Areas must reach the Organiser by Tuesday, 14 June. After the entry closing date, the layout of Service Park displaying service space designated to each competitor will be published on Official Notice Board.

NB! For all competitors the driving way and access to each individual service space is on the rear side of the allocated areas.

5.2. ACCESS TO SERVICE PARK

NB! Only vehicles with Team and reconnaissance plates issued by the Organiser are allowed to access the Service Park. The vehicles must be clearly identified by designated sticker plates affixed on the windscreen. Removal of the sticker is prohibited until the end of the rally.

Auxiliary plates will be issued according to the entry packages.

» Parking in the Service Park

A designated parking area inside the Service Park will be set up behind the teams' service spaces. Cars carrying Team and recce plates are allowed to park in this area.

» Trailer Parking

It is possible to park trailers at the end of the Service Park in the designated area.

» Auxiliary Parking

Auxiliary parking is located near the Service Area.

5.4. RESTRICTIONS IN SERVICE PARK

It is forbidden under any circumstances to drill holes in the concrete surface at the Service Park. Teams and competitors are asked to bring weights for tents and other items that need to be fastened.

Teams and competitors are responsible for the occurrence of no leakage of fuel or other liquids on the ground. Any detected fuel leakage may force the teams to dismantle their units and tents during the rally.

Waste will be collected from behind the service bays each night. Please leave your garbage bags at the back of your area to be removed.

5.6. ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

- All competitors are obliged to have a liquid-proof tarp of minimum 3x5m under competition cars.
- During the rally a car wash facility will be available near the Service Park. Washing cars within the Service Park is prohibited at any time. Spare parts must be cleaned in designated containers.
- After the rally, the Service Park has to be handed over in tidy condition.
- All waste material must be disposed of in the facilities provided at the Service Park.
- A special container for hazardous waste will be available in the Service Park.
- The waste must be sorted and placed in the designated containers.

Teams may use PMR446 (Personal Mobile Radio) compliant radio stations and equipment for communication within the team without the permission of the Consumer Protection and Technical Regulatory Authority.

- Competitors coming from the European Union do not need to make any special custom clearance for temporary import of cars and equipment with the purpose to participate in Rally Estonia.
- Competitors from outside the European Union have to report to the customs at arrival in Estonia.

CLIMATE AND WEATHER

The weather in Estonia is largely dictated by its closeness to the Baltic Sea. In the summer the skies are blue and temperatures can reach 30° C. The summer average is a very pleasant 16.4°C. The weather forecast in Estonia is available via weather.ee.

TRAFFIC

- Estonia has right-hand traffic and an extensive road system, the quality of which varies.
- Visitors need driving license, provided it is valid for the class of vehicle they wish to drive.
- The maximum speed limit is 90 km/h, in residential areas 50km/h, unless otherwise indicated. In the summer, the speed limit is 110km/h on some highways. A driver who has exceeded the speed limit can be punished with a financial penalty, an arrest, suspension of the right to drive or vehicle confiscation.
- Estonian highways tend to be narrow, therefore it's important to pay attention to the speed limits and to pay extra attention when overtaking. Speed cameras are common in Estonia and speeding is rarely tolerated.
- The use of front and rear seat belts is compulsory.
- The blood/alcohol limit in Estonia is 0,2 milligrams of alcohol per litre of blood. Driving while under the influence of drugs and alcohol is prohibited and strict penalties are in place for anyone caught doing so.
- It is illegal for drivers to use a mobile phone without a hands-free device and holding a telephone in hand while the vehicle is moving.
- Headlamps must be on at all times while driving.
- When moving on the road in poor visibility or at night-time, a pedestrian must use a reflector or a light source.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Water: Tap water is safe for drinking.
- Power: 230 V (volts).
- Plugs and sockets are of a two-pin design.
- Smoking is not permitted by law in enclosed public places and workplaces.
- The country code for Estonia is +372. So when you call from home its +372 followed by the local number.
- When calling home from Estonia, put 00 or + in front of your country code.
