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## 1. WELCOME: CLERK OF THE COURSE

Dear competitors and teams,

Croeso i Aberystwyth! It gives me great pleasure to welcome you to the fourth edition of Rali Ceredigion, Wales's original closed road rally.

The event is one of the most important motorsport events in Wales, in a territory steeped in British and world rallying history.

This year's rally, which is again based in Aberystwyth and supported by our partners Ceredigion County Council and title sponsor JDS Machinery, is a round of the FIA European Rally Championship.

The itinerary has been extensively reworked and developed, visiting new areas and stages, to ensure it meets the championship's high standards and provides an exhilarating challenge for domestic and international crews. Our focus is on offering an event which benefits from a high level of organisation, provides an unforgettable experience for competitors, teams and spectators and showcases classic Welsh scenery and local hospitality – all underpinned by our commitment to sustainable motorsport and ensuring a positive lasting legacy in the communities we visit.

Alongside the international event, which forms a round of the ERC and the Motorsport UK Probite British Rally Championship, we will also run a national event competing on all the stages and forming a round of the Protyre Asphalt Championship, JD Tyres Welsh National Tarmacadam Championship and the HRCR Stage Masters Challenge for Historic rally cars.

The ceremonial start and finish will be located on the promenade in Aberystwyth with Rally HQ, Media Centre and service parks situated in and close to the Ceredigion County Council properties in Aberystwyth.

Safety is of paramount importance to all of us organisers and competitors and we would ask everyone attending the event to always cooperate fully with the safety Marshals.

The host town of Aberystwyth is a university centre with a population of 18,000. On the coast of Mid Wales, it is surrounded by the beautiful Cambrian mountains to the east and the Irish Sea to the west. It has many bars, restaurants, hotels and family attractions which are gearing up to provide another warm welcome to the event.

## 2. ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

The organisers of Rali Ceredigion are committed to protecting the local and global environment by conducting our activities in a way which provides for a sustainable future for our sport, without unnecessary compromise of the environment.

In 2023 we offset 120 tonnes of CO2 through a responsible and certified rewilding project supported by our partners Carbon Positive Motorsport – one of the highest offsetting amounts of all rally events globally. Rali Ceredigion was the first UK rally to run under the FIA's new environmental management accreditation in 2022 and we achieved two-star status in 2023.

This year's event will continue to focus on sustainability and, under the supervision of a dedicated Environmental Manager, the two fundamental goals are to introduce initiatives which will minimise the event's overall impact on the environment and to use the event as a platform to deliver a longer-term legacy of environmental improvement by using local partners to help promote the adoption of lower-carbon transport alternatives.

Minimising vehicle movements associated with spectators, the provision of public transport options and waste recycling at all official spectator locations will also help reduce the impact on the environment.

Prioritising decarbonisation, the event will pioneer alternative low-carbon fuel options and spectators will be provided with the option to contribute towards responsible tree planting to offset their impact associated with the event.

It is Rali Ceredigion's aim to improve work to minimise the environmental impact of the event by implementing measures in accordance with the FIA's sustainability programme.

The organising committee will review its actions, behaviours, and the way it runs its event to ensure it remains consistent with this commitment by putting in practice the following actions.

- Comply with all applicable legal requirements which relate to environmental aspects and impacts. Image Measure and monitor our environmental performance to have full understanding of the environmental impacts of our event.
- Promote sustainability and environmental awareness and involve internal and external stakeholders in reaching the objectives.
- Evaluate the wider impacts of our activities through our suppliers, entrants, competitors and partners, and work with these stakeholders to achieve our sustainability goals.
  - Educate our teams, competitors, officials and volunteers about environmentally responsible behaviours.
  - Becoming a paperless event to help reduce CO2, deforestation, pollution and avoiding printing to save resources and energy.
  - Actively pursue ways to reduce our carbon footprint and use recognised carbon offsetting schemes with the goal of becoming carbon neutral by 2025.
  - Put measures in place to ensure our activities do not pollute, cause permanent damage to the ecosystem, or threaten biodiversity, wildlife and ancient species.
- Make efficient use of natural resources and seek to minimise our consumption of energy wherever practical.
  - Reduce our consumption of materials, minimise our production of waste and seek opportunities for re-use and recycling of any necessary waste materials.
  - Ensure any waste management companies comply with the specifications of any necessary environmental certifications.
- Consider the sources of the goods we use and consume, and wherever possible use sustainable supplies from ethical and environmentally responsible suppliers.
- Gain accreditation for our Environmental Management System as part of the Motorsport UK and FIA Environmental Sustainability Programmes and develop this system towards full compliance with the ISO14001 standard by 2025.

This policy will be communicated to all members, competitors, officials, sponsors, marshals, contractors, and suppliers, and will be published on the Rali Ceredigion website.

### 3. EVENT HISTORY

The inaugural running of the event on 8 September 2019, the first ever special stage rally to take place entirely on closed public roads in Wales, was a huge success.

Thousands of spectators watched as 120 crews tackled the demanding competitive stages around Aberystwyth with Welsh crew Osian Pryce and Dale Furniss coming out on top.

As the highest profile international rally event in Wales, the 2022 event counted towards the Motorsport UK British Rally Championship, the FIA European Rally Trophy, the Tour European Rally and the Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship – with New Zealand crew Hayden Paddon and Jared Hudson claiming victory.

With sustainability as a core focus, it was the first UK event to fully offset the carbon emissions of all competitors and was the first UK rally to achieve the coveted FIA Environmental Accreditation.

Osian Pryce returned to take victory in 2023, this time with co-driver Stéphane Prévot, and the rally hosted observers from the FIA European Rally Championship.

Another successful edition, which generated significant economic benefits to the region, it was announced that the 2024 event would be a round of the ERC, bringing the championship back to Wales for the first time in nearly 30 years.

## 14. USEFUL FACTS

Aberystwyth is a university and seaside town and the largest town in Ceredigion, Wales. It is situated on the coast of west Wales, has an extensive seafront promenade and is an ideal base to explore the landscapes of Ceredigion, the Cardigan Bay coast and the Cambrian Mountains.

### 14.1 Airports

Liverpool Airport:	178 km / 111 miles
Cardiff Airport:	181 km / 113 miles
Manchester Airport:	194 km / 121 miles
Birmingham Airport:	211 km / 132 miles
Bristol Airport:	213 km / 133 miles

There are direct train services from Birmingham Airport to Aberystwyth and indirect services linking Manchester Airport and Aberystwyth.

### 14.2 Driving in Wales

Many road signs will be in both the Welsh language and in English.

In 2023, the Welsh Government introduced a default 20mph speed limit on restricted roads across the country. Restricted roads are usually located in residential and built-up areas where there are lots of people. They often have street lights on them, placed no more than 200 yards apart.

The maximum speed limit on motorways and dual carriageways is 70mph, although the limit can be less in certain areas. Always pay attention to road signs, which will indicate the maximum allowed speed. All signs are in mph rather than kmph.

Speed cameras are common and anyone caught speeding will be prosecuted and could be fined, banned or arrested.

The use of front and rear seatbelts is compulsory.

The legal alcohol limit in Wales for driving is 80 milligrams of alcohol per 100 millilitres of blood or 35 micrograms of alcohol per 100 millilitres of breath. Driving while under the influence of drugs is also illegal. Offenders will be arrested and banned from driving and could face imprisonment.

### 14.3 Other Information

Power: 240 volts.

Plugs and sockets are of a three-pin design.

Smoking is not permitted by law in enclosed public places and workplaces.

The country code for Wales and UK is +44.
