1. INTRODUCTION

This rally will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code including appendices, the FIA World Rally Championship Sporting Regulations including appendices, the ASN Regulations which comply with the FIA regulations, the WADA/NADA Codes and the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations, as amended from time to time.

The National Road Traffic Regulations shall apply. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated Bulletins (issued by the organiser or the Stewards).

1.1 Brief event history

Rally El Corte Inglés | Rally de Canarias | Rally Islas Canarias

1977 | The story begins: Rally El Corte Inglés

The history of the Rally Islas Canarias begins after the summer of 1977. Its first edition was held in early November and its name was the same as that of a department store: the Rally El Corte Inglés. This is how it was called for 25 editions.

The Canarian driver Medardo Pérez together with Juan J. Alonso had the honour of being the first winners of the event aboard a BMW 2002 Alpina with which they repeated the victory in 1978. They were the first steps of an event that the fans were beginning to consider.

1979 | Spanish Championship

In 1979 the Rally El Corte Inglés took its first qualitative leap and became part of the Spanish Championship, and the international label began to have a presence. Marc Etchebers-Christine Etchebers, like their predecessors, won the event in 1979 and 1980, always at the wheel of a Porsche. In 1981 for the third time a Porsche won the race, but this time driven by Beni Fernández-José Luis Salas.

1982 | European Championship

In 1982 the rally became part of the European Rally Championship but also remained part of the Spanish Rally Championship. Eugenio Ortiz with Guillermo Barreras in 1982 and then with Ramón Mínguez in 1983 won the rally and brought the Spanish colour back to the championship, just when world motor racing was entering the Group B era.

In 1984: A lot of rain and exhibition by Terry Kaby

The 1984 edition was undoubtedly one of the most outstanding according to motor racing fans. They call it the best edition of the rally. Terry Kaby-Kevin Gormley with the Nissan 240 RS put on a generous show on roads completely flooded with water and mud.

Carlos Sainz, record man

In 1985, the most important Spanish driver of all time landed in Gran Canaria for the first time. He won the rally five times in a row and is the rally's record man. Antonio Boto first and Luis Moya later, accompanied him in a series of successes that they shared in cars such as the Renault 5 Turbo Tour de Corse, the Renault Maxi 5 Turbo, the Ford Sierra RS Cosworth and the Toyota Celica GT-Four. The latter vehicle was used by Carlos Sainz in the World Rally Championship to prepare for the most important WRC events. To this day, Carlos Sainz is still the most victories in the history of the rally and with the best times in the special stages.

Meanwhile, during those five years (from 1985 to 1989), Carlos Sainz was challenged by drivers of the caliber of Antonio Zanini, Bruno Saby, Salvador Servià and Jimmy McRae (Colin McRae's father).

This invited a good number of international teams have been involved in the Canarian rally. Josep Bassas-Antonio Rodríguez won in 1990 after Carlos Sainz's departure to the WRC. Fabrizio Tabaton-Maurizio Imerito won in 1991, Piero Liatti-Luciano Tedeschini in 1992 and Gustavo Trelles-Jorge del Buono in 1993. All three used different generations of the Lancia Delta to achieve success. All of them fought with drivers such as Alain Oreille, John Bosch and Patrick Snijers.

Canarian triumphs

After 17 years, a team from the Canary Islands once again enjoyed a triumph. Luis Monzón-Nazer Ghuneim with the Ford Escort RS Cosworth won in 1994, a very celebrated triumph. The following two years a Canarian driver won again: José María Ponce-Gaspar León took the victory in 1995 with the BMW M3 fighting with Enrico Bertone and in 1996 won with the Toyota Celica GT-Four. That same year Miki Biasion (world champion in 1988 and 1989) was in charge of the zero car and drivers such as François Delecour and Yves Loubet (European champion in 1989) also took part in the rally.

Chus Puras and the era of the Kit Cars

At the end of the 1990s, the Kit Cars burst onto the scene and the speed of Jesús Puras, better known as Chus Puras, with his co-drivers Carlos del Barrio and Marc Martí won three times: in 1997 with the Citroën ZX Kit Car and in 1999 and 2000 with the Citroën Xsara Kit Car. In 1997, world-class drivers such as Juha Kankkunen (world champion in 1986, 1987, 1991 and 1993) and Bruno Thiry took part in the rally. Gwyndaf Evans (father of current WRC driver Elfyn Evans) also took part.

The 1998 victory went to Gilles Panizzi-Hervé Panizzi. The French pair gave Peugeot its first victory in this event thanks to the performance of the 306 Maxi Kit Car. That year, Armin Schwarz (European champion in 1996) took part in the rally and drove the same stages as Toni Gardemeister.

2002 - 2008 | Rally de Canarias

2001 was the 25th anniversary of the rally and Salvador Cañellas-Alberto Sanchís won that year with the Seat Córdoba WRC.

In 2002 the rally was renamed Rally de Canarias - Trofeo El Corte Inglés. This and the following year they moved the base of operations from Las Palmas de Gran Canaria to the south of the island. Jesús Puras-

Carlos del Barrio (Citroën Xsara WRC) and Miguel Campos-Carlos Magalhaes (Peugeot 206 WRC) were the most effective in 2002 and 2003 respectively.

In 2004 Las Palmas de Gran Canaria regained prominence and has done so to date. At that time, it coincided with the prominence of the S1600 category. Enrique García-Ojeda-Raquel Fernández won in 2004, Joan Vinyes-Xavier Lorza in 2005 (each with Peugeot 206) and Miguel Fuster-José V. Medina climbed to the top of the podium in 2006 and 2007. In 2008 Luis Monzón-José Carlos Déniz (Peugeot 207 S2000) took the victory.

2009 | Rally Islas Canarias

The event changed its name in 2009: Rally Islas Canarias - Trofeo El Corte Inglés. That year, Mitsubishi achieved its first victory thanks to Armide Martín-Alejandro Rodríguez with the Lancer Evo IX, but it was in 2010 that the rally entered a new dimension.

2010 - 2012 | A new dimension: IRC

El Rally Islas Canarias - Trofeo El Corte Inglés in 2010 became part of the Intercontinental Rally Challenge (IRC), which brought vehicles and teams with enormous potential to the Canary Islands. Skoda Fabia S2000s took the glory until 2012, first it was Jan Kopecky with Petr Stary, Juho Hänninen with Mikko Markkula and again Kopecky with Pavel Dresler. In 2011 the rally was renamed Rally Islas Canarias - El Corte Inglés.

2013 | Return to the European Championship

In 2013 the Rally Islas Canarias - El Corte Inglés returned to the European Rally Championship but only was on time. Jan Kopecky-Pavel Dresler again took the win in the Skoda Fabia S2000. However, the sensation of the year came from Robert Kubica (Citroën DS3 RRC), who was the solid leader until his accident on the tenth stage.

2014 - 2015 | A short break

A short break outside the European Rally Championship came in 2014 and 2015. It served to see the triumph of a world champion: Didier Auriol with Denis Giraudet and the Citroën Xsara WRC. They took victory in the first of those years. A year later, Miguel Fuster-Ignacio Aviñó brought Porsche back to the top, something that had not happened since 1981.

2016 - 2024 | Return to the European Championship - Rally Islas Canarias

In 2016 the rally returned to the European Rally Championship, this time called FIA ERC (FIA European Rally Championship). The return to Europe was won by Alexey Lukyanuk-Alexey Arnautov in the Ford Fiesta R5. In 2017 Alexey Lukyanuk won again. That year the rally was renamed Rally Islas Canarias, a name it has retained to this day. In 2018 Alexey Lukyanuk won again for the third consecutive year. In 2019 Pepe López-Borja Rozada in the Citroën C3 R5 won the rally. Two of the Russian driver's (Alexey) main rivals were Kajetan Kajetanowicz and Nikolay Gryazin, WRC2 drivers in 2024.

The rally has always been celebrated between March and May, but in 2020, the Covid-19 health crisis prompted a change of date to November. It was reminiscent of the 1984 edition because of the changeable weather. That year, Adrien Fourmaux with Renaud Jamoul drove his Ford Fiesta R5 MKII to the top.

2021 was marked by the absolute domination of Alexey Lukyanuk-Alexey Arnautov, this time with the Citroën C3 Rally2. The Russians took their fourth victory in Gran Canaria, which brings them within one of

Carlos Sainz's record. Second place went to Efrén Llárena-Sara Fernández, who with this result became the runners-up in the European Rally Championship in our rally.

In 2022 Nil Solans and Marc Martí won by driving the Volkswagen Polo GTI R5. It was a surprising edition, with the top three teams within seconds of each other. For Solans, it was his first win in Gran Canaria, but not his first participation. His famous feat was to drive the car on three wheels in the rain.

Yoann Bonato and Benjamin Boulloud took a solid victory with the Citroën C3 Rally2 in 2023. Hayden Paddon-John Kennard, in the Hyundai i20 N Rally2, landed in Gran Canaria at the top of the FIA ERC and took second place ahead of Efrén Llárena and Sara Fernández in a Skoda Fabia RS Rally2.

In 2024, Yoann Bonato and Benjamin Boulloud claimed victory for the second year in a row, again in the Citroën C3 Rally2. The French driver explained to the rally organisers that it was the best tarmac rally in the world. "I am Yoann Bonato, and I am very happy to be here again, on the best tarmac rally in the world", were the words of the two-time Rally Islas Canarias winner.

2025 - 2026 | A new era: WRC

Several WRC drivers have already been part of our history. But other drivers are worth mentioning:

Dani Sordo has only competed once in the Rally Islas Canarias. That was in 2005 with the Citroën C2 with which he was crowned Spanish champion and won the Junior World Championship that same season.

Thierry Neuville landed in Gran Canaria in 2010 and 2011 and those two years he competed in the rally at the controls of the famous yellow Peugeot 207 S2000.

Craig Breen competed twice in Rally Islas Canarias. In 2013 he finished second in the official Peugeot 207 S2000 and seven years later, in 2020, he was in the Hyundai i20 R5 for Team MRF Tyres.

Andreas Mikkelsen joined the rally in 2011 as an official Skoda driver who lost out on victory on the final loop. His last participation was in 2020.

Adrien Fourmaux won the rally in 2020 and **Gregoire Munster** finished 19th. In 2024 both were in the M-Sport team in the WRC. In 2020, **Oliver Solberg** was crowned ERC1 Junior champion in the Volkswagen Polo GTI R5. A championship he contested that year with Munster. Solberg raced in 2024 in WRC2 with Skoda.

Hayden Paddon, Hyundai's 2016 factory driver in the WRC, took part in the rally in 2023 where he finished on the second step of the podium. In 2024 he finished sixth. The Kiwi driver is a two-time consecutive European Rally Champion (2023-2024).

2025 marks the start of a new challenge that we at the organisers are looking forward to with a lot of enthusiasm. We love motorsport. We are going for the WRC.

1.3 Rally Islas Canarias 2024

Yoann Bonato wins the Rally Islas Canarias again.

The Frenchmen Yoann Bonato and Benjamin Boulloud won the 48th Rally Islas Canarias with the Citroën C3 Rally2. They achieved their second consecutive victory in Rally Islas Canarias. Mathieu Franceschi and Andy Malfroy finished second with the Skoda Fabia Evo Rally2 and the third step of the podium was occupied by Alejandro Cachón and Borja Rozada with the Toyota GR Yaris Rally2. Cachón and Rozada made a comeback and finished third. They punctured a tyre, but still finished the rally in third position.

Diego Ruiloba and Ángel Vela finished fourth with the Citroën C3 Rally2, while José Antonio 'Cohete' Suárez and Alberto Iglesias closed the top five in a Skoda Fabia RS Rally2. The Power Stage scratch was for Cachón and Rozada.

The European Rally Champions, Hayden Paddon and John Kennard, dropped from third to fourth and from fourth to sixth position in the afternoon section of Rally Islas Canarias. The New Zealanders failed to match the pace and finished the rally in sixth place in the Hyundai i20 N Rally2. After the Rally Islas Canarias, Franceschi took the lead in the FIA European Rally Championship (FIA ERC), but after the next few rallies, Paddon-Kennard were able to move back into the lead in the European Rally Championship. At Rally Silesia in Poland (the final round of the FIA ERC), Hayden Paddon and John Kennard were crowned European Rally Champions. Their second consecutive FIA ERC title.

Behind Paddon and Kennard on the 48th Rally Islas Canarias were Jon Armstrong and Eoin Treacy in the Ford Fiesta MKII Rally2. Mads Ostberg-Patrik Barth (Citroën C3 Rally2) finished eighth, Simon Wagner-Gerald Winter finished ninth and Efrén Llárena-Sara Fernández finished tenth.

General Information

Driving in Gran Canaria

The road laws in Gran Canaria are the same as for the rest of Spain. Motorists can rent a vehicle by presenting their driving license and valid passport / ID, as well as a credit card.

Handling the GPS while the vehicle is circulating is stipulated as a serious offense and using the mobile phone is totally prohibited, even if the vehicle is parked. To use it, they must park on the shoulder and stay away from traffic.

The speed limit on motorways is 120 km / h, while in towns and cities it is 40 km / h, unless otherwise indicated. Parking in areas with white or yellow lines is prohibited. The blue line indicates a restricted parking lot, where you will have to pay for the ticket at the vending machine. Parking in an area reserved for the disabled is against the law and carries a fine.

Breathalyzer tests are carried out very often and non-residents may be subject to on-site fines. The blood alcohol limit is 0.5 milligrams per milliliter of blood (0.05% alcohol in each sample). For drivers with less than 2 years of license, the limit is 0.01%. Helmets are mandatory to drive motorcycles or mopeds and the use of headphones while riding is strictly prohibited. Cyclists must wear a helmet and the bicycle must have lights to circulate in the dark.

In Gran Canaria you drive on the right, as in continental Europe, and the gearbox is to the left of the car's steering wheel. The use of a seat belt in both the front and rear seats is mandatory. Children under 12 years old cannot ride in the front seats unless they are taller than 150 cm.

Driving through the mountains can be challenging as the winding and narrow roads demand extreme concentration. So be sure to plan your trip in advance. The only fast roads on the island are Highway GC-1 from Las Palmas to Mogán and Highway GC-2 from Las Palmas to Agaete.

Safety during watching the rally

What can happen?

- In accidents, there is no logical path. A competition vehicle moves a mass at high speed and in case of an accident it is impossible to guess the trajectory
- Any breakage or mechanical failure can cause an accident without logic
- Only in the high areas and in the areas enabled by the Organiser will you have total security
- The bad attitude of the public and its incorrect position in the prohibited areas are grounds for cancelled the stage
- A few uncivil spectators can make you not enjoy the show. Do not let that happen!

What should be done?

- We will be punctual. We must arrive at the stages with enough time to park our vehicle correctly in the areas designated for it. The road is usually closed to traffic at least two hours before the first vehicle starts, and we can find traffic jams
- We will always park our vehicle outside the route. We may find that the crane has removed it, with a fine, or with a dent
- It should also give us time to move on foot to a safe place before the race starts. Moving along the route with the race already started is a danger. The vehicles compete at the limit and an accident can happen at any moment, since they expect to find the road completely clear
- We must be prepared for the cold, for the heat, for the rain, since we will not be able to leave the route once the stage has started
- The organisation sets up bins and containers along the route. Respect the environment
- Children must be under the supervision of adults at all times
- Excessive consumption of alcoholic beverages or other products can make you irritable, unconscious, and uncivil. Do not lose control. Let's enjoy a good atmosphere in our sport, and we will all have a good time
- Remember that the breathalyzer and speed controls are intensified in the vicinity of the race
- Always follow the instructions of the marshals, volunteers and organiser. Treat them with respect and education. Without them, this sport would not be possible
- We must know what we are going for, since for safety reasons, they will not let us move our vehicle until the race is over. Delays may occur in the event in case of accident. Do not despair
- We must always place ourselves in high places, avoiding potentially dangerous areas
- The areas marked with red tape are prohibited areas for the public, both in front of them and behind them
- The areas marked with yellow tape are areas allowed to the public
- The areas marked with green tape are exclusive areas for Media and accredited TV
- You must remember that not all curves and dangerous areas can always be marked, so we ask that in areas not marked with tape, use common sense, and listen to the members of the Organisation. They work for your safety

What should never be done

- Stand in dangerous places
- Invade the course to see better, cheer or encourage the drivers
- Throw objects to the path
- Recklessly moving around the course with your vehicle, before or after the race
- If you want to compete, do it properly. become a driver
- Ignore the instructions of the Organisation's staff
- Stand in prohibited places
- Light bonfires
