Details concerning the co-driver can be sent in up to Tuesday 18 September.

- **3.1.1** The entry form must be sent either by registered letter or special delivery courier service dated not later than 15 September 2007.
- 3.1.2 Applications sent by fax will not be processed if there is no indication the original has been sent as well as the fees and the original does not reach the Sanremorally Office by Tuesday 18 September.

3.2 Number of entrants and classes

- 3.2.1 The maximum number of entrants accepted is 130 vehicles divided into:
 - FIA-Priority A drivers
 - FIA-Priority B drivers
 - ASN-Priority drivers
 - non-priority drivers
- **3.2.2** The vehicles are split up into the following cubic capacity classes:

Production cars (Group N)

- NO: up to 1150cc
- N1: from 1151cc to 1400cc
- N2: from 1401cc to 1600cc
- N3: from 1601cc to 2000cc
- N4: over 2000cc (Super 2000 cars included)

Touring cars (Group A - World Rally Cars are not admitted)

- A0 up to 1150cc. (cars homologated as Kit cars included)
- A5 from 1151cc to 1400cc (cars homologated as Kit cars included)
- A6 from 1401cc to 1600cc (cars homologated as Kit cars and Super1600 cars included)
- A7 from 1601cc to 2000cc

Car homologated as Kit cars, where the capacity is greater than 1.600cc are not accepted.

Cars homologated as Kit cars where the capacity is between 1401 and 1600cc, are

accepted if they also comply with Art. 255.6.2 of Appendix J - Weight

Two-wheel drive cars equipped with a super charged diesel engine with a nominal cylinder capacity less than 2000cc are accepted in Group A and N.

For Super 1600 homologated cars, it will be possible to use lapsed "errata" without any penalty.

- 3.3.3 The above amounts are doubled if the optional advertising indicated by the Organisers is not accepted.

3.4 Payment

If the payment is made by bank transfer, the entry fees shall be fully paid with no expenses at receiver's charge.

The amount paid shall be kept as caution money and the Organizer, Automobile Club Sanremo, shall issue the invoice relating to the entry fees.

- **3.4.2** The entry fees include:
 - n. 1 Service plate (2 plates for the competitors entered as a legal entity)
 - n. 1 Road Book
 - n. 1 Service Book
 - shakedown
- 3.4.3 The request for further documents and material (written on the specific form) must reach the Automobile Club Sanremo by Saturday 15 September 2007.

3.5 Refunds

The entry fees will be refunded:

- to entrants whose entry has not been accepted;
- in case the Rally will not take place.

4 INSURANCE

- 4.1 The entry fees include the insurance premium to insure civil liability of competitors against all third party risks whilst taking part in the rally and the shakedown.
- **4.2** The indemnity provided under this special insurance is Euros 5.164.568,99, unique for any incident or accident.
- 4.3 This cover will become effective at the start of the rally. It will cease at the end of the event or at the moment of retirement, exclusion or disqualification. In case of retirement, the cease hour will be considered as being the one of the next time control closing time.
- 4.4 Moreover, the insurance will cover the following itineraries:
 - from the shakedown service park (Via Ludovico Ariosto) to the start of the shakedown
 - the shakedown itinerary
 - the itinerary form the finish of the shakedown to the shakedown service park with covering from 09.00 to 15.00 on Thursday 27 September.

The insurance doesn't relieve competitors from liability towards any passenger, other than co-driver, on board the car.

4.5 The Organising Committee declines all liability due to consequences of any breach of laws or regulations by the competitors, who will be solely liable towards the competent Authorities.

The Organising Committee declines liability for any accident caused to competitors and competing cars during the whole duration of the event, even in case of floods, landslides, demonstrations, vandalism that could involve the competitors and their crews. Material, penal and sporting consequences will be charged to the competitors themselves.

- 4.6 Vehicles carrying Service and Auxiliary plates and/or any other special plate issued by the Organiser are not covered by the Event's insurance policy. These vehicles circulate under the sole responsibility of their owners and the organiser bears no responsibility for them.
- 4.7 Vehicles used by competitors during reconnaissance, even if bearing the event's specific stickier, should be insured by their owners. The organiser bears no responsibility for such vehicles.

4.8 Accident reporting

If a driver taking part in the rally is involved in an accident in which a member of the public sustains physical injury, the driver concerned must report this to the next radio-point as specified in the road-book and signposted on the route. If he fails to comply with this rule, the Stewards may impose to the responsible crew a penalty which may go as far as exclusion.

4.9 In case of accident in the rally or in the shakedown itinerary, the competitor or his representative must notify it to the Clerk of the Course within 24 hours.

5 ADVERTISING

5.1 Organiser's advertising

The organiser's advertising on the rally plates and on the competition number is compulsory and cannot be refused by the competitors; this will be specified in a bulletin one month before the start of the rally.

5.2 Organiser's optional advertising

Competitors who accept the organiser's optional advertising must reserve for it the spaces indicated in the Appendix 3 to the present regulations.

The optional advertising reserved for the organiser will be specified in a bulleting

The optional advertising reserved for the organiser will be specified in a bulletin.

5.3 Restrictions

Tobacco and smokers products advertising is forbidden in Italy.

5.4 Competition numbers, plates and advertising

The competition numbers, the rally official plates and the optional advertising must be affixed on the rally car (see Appendix 3) before scrutineering and must be visible throughout the whole duration of the rally, according to the 2007 FIA Rally General Prescriptions.

- 5.5 The name of the driver and possibly of the co-driver, together with their national flags, must appear either on both front wings or on the rear side windows of the car. Any entrant failing to comply with this rule is subject to a 150,00 Euros cash penalty.
- 5.6 The competitors failing to comply with these rules shall be penalized at the discretion of the Stewards of the Meeting.

6 TYRES - WHEELS

6.1 The inside of the tyre (the space between the rim and the internal part of the tyre) must be filled only with air. In other words, the use of any device allowing the tyres to maintain their performance at an internal pressure equal to or less than the atmospheric pressure is prohibited.

6.2 Tyres marking

The marking of the tyres is obligatory for all the competitors for the whole running of the rally.

7 FUEL

7.1 Fuel supply

- 7.1.1 Throughout all the rally (shakedown and competition), all cars shall use solely fuel supplied by the Company SOLDA' Vladimiro S.p.A., which complies with the technical requirements established by the FIA Appendix J and by the CSAI.
- **7.1.2** Two types of fuel are available:
 - "A" Wladogas 98Rally07 (RON 98,0) sold at the price of Euros 2,04/lt. + 20% VAT "B" Wladogas 102Rally07 (RON 102,00) sold at the price of Euros 2,75/lt. + 20% VAT Competitors with vehicles of classes N0 N1 N2 and N3 can use fuel "A" or "B". Competitors with vehicles of other classes must use fuel "B".

Complementary Deputations

SOLDA' Vladimiro Society will supply the necessary fuel for the technical adjustments of the engine, against payment and upon request.

7.1.3 Each competitor must fill-in the special order form requesting the quantity of fuel needed for the running of the rally and send it to SOLDA' Vladimiro Society - Via Pasubio, 30 - 36051 Creazzo (VI) tel. +39.0444.232300 - fax +39.0444.232323 - +39.0444.521795 - www.wladoil.com

The fuel request and a copy of the receipt of payment must reach SOLDA' S.p.A. no later than **Thursday**, **20 September 2007 at 18.00hrs**.

Within 15 days following the date of the running of the rally, SOLDA' Society will refund the amount corresponding to the non collected fuel.

7.2 Fuel distribution

- 7.2.1 SOLDA' Vladimiro Society will distribute the fuel for shakedown on Thursday 27 September, 07.00hrs to 09.00hrs in the refuelling area arranged in the service park. The fuel for the 1st and 2nd legs will be distributed exclusively and directly into the tank of the competition cars in the refuelling area arranged by the organizer at the exit of the service park and indicated in the road-book.
- 7.2.2 In order to optimise refuelling operations, during the pre-rally scrutineering a sticker 6 cm in diameter will be fixed to the top left side of the windscreen of the competition cars. The colour of this sticker will be:
 - green for the competitors using Wladogas 98Rally07
 - yellow for those using Wladogas 102Rally07.
- 7.2.3 In the refuelling area, competitors must observe the regulations provided by the rules of the 2007 FIA Rally General Prescriptions. They must comply with the instructions given by the Marshals and by the responsibles involved in the refuelling operations.

7.3 Fuel testing

In case of fuel sampling from the competition cars and subsequent testing, the results will be compared with those of the samples taken from the same SOLDA' tank lorry from which the car was refuelled.

7.4 Fuel autonomy

All cars must have a minimum fuel autonomy in order to drive at least 150kms, 60 kms of which in special stages.

8 RECONNAISSANCES

8.1 Running conditions

Reconnaissance of the itinerary and of the special stages must be carried out, in accordance with the Italian Traffic Laws, only after having collected the road-book and the reconnaissance documents (card and sticker).

Reconnaissance on the rally route are forbidden after the publication of the rally itinerary (5 July 2007).

- The drivers must have their "reconnaissance card" with them during reconnaissance and are required to show it at any time upon request by the officials or Police Authorities.
- 8.1.2 The sticker must be stuck on the windscreen of the car, in the top left position, driver's side.
- 8.1.3 During reconnaissance, all crews will halt their cars at the start of each stage. Rally officials will then sign the reconnaissance card in order to register the car's passage. Crews may only enter special stages through the initial control point.
- It is emphasised that reconnaissance is not practice. All Italian Traffic Laws are to be 8.1.4 fully respected and reconnaissance cars must be covered by insurance as required by the Italian Laws, no responsibility being imputable to the organisers.

8.2 Schedule

Reconnaissance must imperatively be carried out according to the following schedule:

Tuesday 25 September 2007

14.00-19.00 Reconnaissance SS 1/5 - 2 - 3/6 - 4 (two passages) 21.00-24.00 Reconnaissance SS 1/5 - 2 - 3/6 - 4 (one passage)

Wednesday 26 September 2007

09.00-18.00 Reconnaissance SS 7/9 - 8/10 (three passages)

Thursday 27 September 2007

09.00-09.30 Reconnaissance on the shakedown route, optional

The organiser may establish a different schedule for different groups of crews.

8.3 Restriction

- 8.3.1 Crews are permitted to drive a maximum of 3 passages over each special stage. In no case may crews drive over the itinerary in a direction opposite to that of the rally.
- Reconnaissance outside the schedule as set by the organisers is considered a very serious offence and will be reported to the Stewards who may apply penalties.

8.4 Reconnaissance cars

All reconnaissance operations may only be carried out using series production cars complying with the specifications defined in the 2007FIA Rally General Prescriptions.

Competitors with a CSAI or FAMS licence must use reconnaissance cars complying with the specifications of the NS11 – CSAI.

8.5 Controls

During reconnaissance Rally Officials will control the proceedings. All competitors must obey marshals instructions.

The itinerary will be surveyed by rally officials also during the period prior to reconnaissance.

The presence of a driver or his co-driver on a special stage, in any way whatsoever, is considered as reconnaissance.

8.6 Sanctions

All infringements noted will be posted on the Official Notice Board and submitted to the Stewards of the Meeting at their first meeting for deliberation and possible sanctions. Furthermore, the Stewards of the Meeting are required to consider applying further penalties under Art. 152 of the Code and, depending on the gravity of the offence, may report the competitors concerned to the CSAI and to the FIA for possible further sanctions.

In any case, organisers must forward to the CSAI the names of each competitor and driver committing an offence, in order to monitor regular offenders.

9 ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

9.1 Documents to be presented

The full crew must present itself to the administrative checks showing the following documents:

licence, driving licence, health certificate for the CSAI drivers, authorisation to compete abroad if necessary, rally car insurance documents, vehicle registration papers (original or copy: if a copy is presented, the original paper will be checked during scrutineering).

10 SCRUTINEERING - SEALING AND MARKING

10.1 Special regulations

10.1.1 Noise level

The maximum permitted noise level is 98 decibel. Cars not complying with this rule will not be allowed to start. The noise will be measured with a phonometer placed at a

distance of 50 cm from the exhaust outlet, with an angle of 45 degrees and with the car engine running at 3800 rpm.

10.1.2 Components sealing - non priority drivers

During scrutineering the transmission (fitted and spares) of cars non-priority drivers (if not entered in the Italian rally Championship) will not be sealed, however their turbos (fitted and spares) will be sealed.

For limitation of spare turbochargers see 2007 FIA Rally General Prescriptions.

10.1.3 Windows

Use of tinted windows is authorized in accordance with article 253.11 "Windows/nets" of Appendix J of the FIA Sporting Code.

11 FEATURES OF THE RALLY

11.1 Start park

Competitors (or their representative) must drive their cars to the start park organised near the start podium, at the time that will be communicated during the administrative checks.

The start park is under parc fermé rules.

Any delay will be penalized with a fine of 10,00 Euros per minute or fraction with a minimum of 50,00 Euros and a maximum of 250,00 Euros.

11.2 Time card change during the rally

The time card for the first section will be issued at TC0 and will be replaced by a new one at:

- TC 3A Sanremo regrouping IN first leg
- TC 4A Sanremo regrouping IN first leg
- TC 6C Sanremo Start second leg
- TC 8A Sanremo regrouping IN second leg

11.3 Special stages

11.3.1 Start procedure

Start of special stages will be given as follows: when the car with its crew on board has stopped in front of the starting control the Marshals will enter the time scheduled for the start of the car in question on the stage sheet, and he will hand this document back to the crew. The start of all special stages will be given by means of starting lights:

- 10 seconds before the start one red light is illuminated;
- 5 seconds before the start one yellow light and five LEDs are illuminated . The five LEDs turn off one by one each second;
- green light: start signal

Should the electronic timing appliance break down at the start of a special stage, the start will be given manually as provided by 2007 FIA Rally General Prescriptions.

11.3.2 False start

A false start, particularly one made before the lights has given the signal, shall be penalized as follows:

a) 1st infringement: 10 seconds b) 2nd infringement: 1 minute c) 3rd infringement: 3 minutes

d) further infringements: penalties left to the discretion of the Stewards of the Meeting

These penalties do not exclude heavier penalties being inflicted by the Stewards if they deem this measure necessary.

11.3.3 Timina

For special stages, timing will be to the tenth of a second.

Should the electronic timing appliance break down, times will be recorded manually, as provided for in the 2007 FIA Rally General Prescriptions

11.3.4 Use of flags

All along the special stages route the following flags will be used:

- red flags (only at the radio points) in order to signalise the stop of the special stage or of the rally
- the yellow flags in order to signalise a danger to coming crews.

If necessary, the use of the flags will be the following:

- a) yellow flags shall be available at each road marshals post;
- b) red flags shall be available at each stage radio point;
- c) the red flag will be displayed only on the instruction of the Clerk of the Course. It must be displayed at all radio points preceding the accident or the interruption. The

time of deployment of this flag will be recorded and notified to the Stewards by the Clerk of the Course.

d) on passing a displayed red flag, the driver must immediately reduce speed and follow the instructions of any marshal or safety cars drivers he encounters.

Failure to comply with this rule will entail a penalty at the discretion of the stewards.

A crew which has been shown the red flag will be given a notional time for the stage according to the FIA rules.

11.3.5 When a special stage is interrupted or stopped for any reason, the 2007 FIA Rally General Prescriptions will be applied.

11.4 Early check-in at the end of a leg

Only at the time control at the end of the first leg (TC 6B) crews are authorised to check-in in advance without incurring any penalty.

Identification of officials

Officials will be identified as follows:

- Post chiefs: red tabard

- Road marshals: yellow tabard

Traffic - infringements

Throughout the rally, the crews must strictly observe the Italian Traffic Laws.

Any crew which does not comply with these Traffic Laws shall be subject to the penalties set out below:

- a) 1st infringement: cash penalty of Euros 250,00
- b) 2nd infringement: a 5-minute time penalty
- c) 3rd infringement: penalty at the discretion of the Stewards of the Meeting

11.7 SuperRally

- 11.7.1 A competing car which fails to finish any leg of a rally will be permitted to restart the next leg.
- 11.7.2 This shall apply to any car which has been excluded on the grounds of exceeding the latest allowable limit or has failed to report to a control, but shall not apply where the car has been excluded for breach of eligibility requirements, traffic infringements or by a decision of the Stewards.
- 11.7.3 Any car which fails to finish a leg in accordance with the above may be repaired at the competitor's discretion. However, the car must report to the overnight parc fermé prior to the next leg, no later than 6 hours before the scheduled start of that leg. The entrant must advise the Clerk of the Course of the intention to have the car re-scrutineered prior to the start of the Stewards' meeting at the end of the leg which the car has failed to finish.
- 11.7.4 The car must retain its original body shell and engine block as marked at pre-event scrutineering.
- 11.7.5 Prior to restarting a leg, the car must pass inspection by the scrutineers.
- 11.7.6 The second leg will restart in the order of the partial unofficial classification published at the end of the preceding leg.
- 11.7.7 The Stewards may reposition drivers who wish to start under the Super Rally format and, upon the proposal of the Organisers or at their own discretion, any other driver.

Any entrant who re-starts under the Super Rally rules will not be classified in the final overall classification.

11.8 Removal of the cars from the final parc fermé

Cars must be removed from the final Parc Fermé once the results become final and the Stewards authorize it to be opened.

Drivers or their representative must present the receipt, issued by the Organiser, to the Marshal in charge. The receipt will be distributed to competitors when entering the final Parc Fermé.

Cars must be removed within 60 minutes after the provisional final results posting; beyond the time limits indicated, the organisers will no longer guarantee the security of the cars.

11.9 Competitors safety tracking system

For safety reasons, in order to verify the position of the crews during the running of the rally, all the car will be equipped with a tracking system.

The organiser will inform competitors about the assembly procedure of the safety unit and its use by a further communication.

This equipment is compulsory. A caution money of Euros 250,00 will be required.

12 GRAVEL CARS

Gravel cars are forbidden.

13 PRIZES

13.1 Prize-giving

The prize-giving will be held at the final arrival of the rally, at the podium on Saturday 29 September.

After having passed the final finish TC (10B - SANREMO SERVICE OUT/ARRIVO), the competitors will stop in a waiting area at the disposal of the marshals for the prize-giving procedure. This area will be considered parc fermé.

13.2 Prizes

The rally has the following prizes:

- General classification: cups to the crews classified from $1^{\rm st}$ to $10^{\rm th}$ - Group results: cups to the crews classified from $1^{\rm st}$ to $3^{\rm rd}$

- Class results: cups to the crews classified from 1st to 3rd

- 1st female crew cups- 1st team cup- all other classified crews awards

14 FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

14.1 Final scrutineering

The final scutineering will take place on Saturday 29 September 2007 from 16.20 at Officina Pertile - Sanremo – Via S.Francesco 107 – Tel. +39.0184.575277

- 14.2 ompetitors who will be selected for final scrutineering (Stewards' decision) are requested to provide proper equipment (including all sealed spare parts) and technicians at the final scrutineering venue.
- 14.3 Each selected car will be driven to and from the final scrutineering by a designated member of the team (who must be present at the finish), accompanied by an official.
- 14.4 In case of a protest, the involved car will be checked at same workshop.

14.5 Protest fees

Sum of the protest fee is Euros 350,00.

If the protest requires the dismantling and the reassembly of different parts of a car the claimant must pay an additional deposit that will be decided by the Stewards of the Meeting, upon proposal of Scrutineers.

14.6 Appeal fees

Appeal fees are as below

- for a national appeal (CSAI)

Euros 3.000,00



- 1 The competition numbers shall be awarded according to the following order: (within each series, priority or classes, the starting order is left to the initiative of the organiser)
- series 1 : FIA priority drivers priority A
- series 2 : FIA priority drivers priority B
- series 3 : all the other entrants, in the following order:
- drivers seeded by the NSA 1st and 2nd International lists as in the provisional classification of the 2007 Italian Rally Championship;
- drivers seeded by the NSA 1st International list not included in the provisional classification of the 2007 Italian Rally Championship;
- drivers seeded by the NSA 2nd International list not included in the provisional classification of the 2007 Italian Rally Championship;
- not seeded drivers entered with cars Super2000;
- all the other drivers in the following class order: Super1600 N4 A7 N3 A6 A5 N2 -A0 - N1 - N0.
- 2 All drivers seeded by their NSA will lose their right of priority should they drive cars of the classes: NO - N1 - N2 - N3 - A0 - A5 - A6 (except the drivers with cars Super 1600 and Kit Car 1401/1600cc).

Appendix 5 SHAKEDOWN

1 Participation procedure

All drivers are allowed to take part in the shakedown following the schedule established by the organiser and with no limit in the number of passages.

- **1.1** The shakedown will be carried out in collaboration with the local administrative authorities, under the same safety conditions as those provided for the rally.
- **1.2** For insurance reasons, the vehicles participating in the shakedown will have to be identified by their competition numbers, and the crews will have to wear the same clothing provided for the Special Stages.

2 Location

In Sanremo area, S.Romolo, SP 61 – SC Monte Ortigara (direction to Perinaldo/Coldirodi), about Kms 2.850.

3 Times

Thursday 27 September from 09.30 to 14.30

4 Speed limits

On the liaison stretches of the shakedown, the speed limit is 30 kph.

The organiser, in collaboration with the Police Authorities, will check the observance of this rule.

All infringements noted will be submitted to the Stewards of the Meeting for deliberation and possible sanctions.

Appendix 7 SERVICE PARK

Service park

1 - Location

Sanremo - Lungomare Italo Calvino and Piazzale Carlo Dapporto

2 - Technical Area

A technical area shall be allocated free of charge to each car inside the service park.

An area of 120 sq.m (8 meters wide minimum) shall be allocated to each priority driver and to each driver registered in the Italian Championship.

Priority drivers as provided by Annexe 4 - item 2, keep the right to have an area of 120 sq.m. available.

An area of 80 sq.m. (at least 6 meters wide) shall be allocated to each non priority driver.

If a service team works for more than one car, the area shall be allocated according to the following criteria:

Priority Drivers or drivers entered in the Italian Championship	120sq.m	100sq.m	80sq.m.	60sq.m.
Non priority Drivers	80sq.m.	60sq.m.	60sq.m.	60sq.m.

Not later than 15 September 2007 competitors have the obligation to give notice of:

- the name of the person/team in charge with technical servicing;
- the number and size of service vehicles;
- the possible sharing of the servicing cars with other competitors

Cumplementany Descriptions

Competitors who shall fail to provide the Organisers with these data will be entitled to use only a maximum surface of 80 sq.m. for priority drivers or drivers registered in the Italian Championship and of 60 sq.m. for all the other drivers.

3 - Working area

Once the necessary surface has been ensured and allocated to all the parties entitled to it, organizers shall have the faculty to make available the exceeding space also defined as "working area", free of cost or against payment. Any competitor shall make a request on registration for such area that shall be proportionally subdivided among all applicants.

In case of allocation against payment of the exceeding space, the maximum price is fixed as follows:

- priority drivers and drivers registered in the Italian Championship:
- 12,00 Euros (VAT excluded)
- non priority drivers and drivers non registered in the Italian Championship:
- 8,00 Euros (VAT excluded)

Promotional vehicles or sale structures are not admitted in the technical and working areas. These vehicles and/or structures/tents may be placed, on specific demand, in the Rally Village.

4 - Tyre-dealers area

The Organizer has allocated all tyre manufacturers and suppliers a specific area that is located in Sanremo - Lungomare Vittorio Emanuele.

They shall give notice to the Organizer of the surface they need and plates number of their vehicles not later than 15 September 2007.

Promotional vehicles or structures must be placed, on specific demand, in the Rally Village.

5 - Speed of vehicles in the service park

Vehicles in the service park must circulate at a walking pace.

6 - Access time for service vehicles

Service vehicles are allowed to enter the service park from 06.00 p.m. to 22.00 p.m. on Wednesday 26 September.

The service park shall be closed at night. It is forbidden to enter or exit the park during night hours without authorization.

Opening and closing time shall be announced by special notice.

7 - Other provisions

Other particular provisions concerning the operation (opening and closing time, ways of circulation, etc.) of the service park could be notified by means of bulletin.

8 - Auxiliary plates

The "Auxiliary" plates are to be requested to the Organizer by using the special form before September 15th. Their cost shall be Euro 124,80 (104,00 Euros + VAT).

Appendix 8 COMPETITORS' SAFETY

- a) All entered cars shall have on board a red reflector triangle to be displayed in case of halt during the running of a special stage. The triangle shall be positioned by a crew member in a visible location, at a minimum distance of fifty metres behind the car in order to signal the presence of the car to the subsequent cars in transit. Non-compliance with this rule will result in a penalty to be decided by the Stewards of the Meeting.
- b) In the event of an accident where no first-aid medical assistance is required, the "OK" yellow sign together with the competition number, provided for in the road book, must be clearly displayed to at least three following crews. Non-compliance with this rule will result in a penalty to be decided by the Stewards of the Meeting.
- c) In the event of an accident **where first-aid medical assistance is required**, the red cross signal, provided in the road book, must be clearly displayed to at least three following crews. Any crew which is able to, but fail to comply with this rule may be penalised at the discretion of the Stewards of the Meeting.
- d) Any crew retiring from the rally must report such retirement to the organisers as soon as possible. Save in a case of force majeure, any crew failing to comply will be liable to a fine at the Stewards' discretion.
