



INTRODUCTION

Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these supplementary regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated bulletins issued by the Organisers or the Stewards.

3 ENTRIES

3.1 Entry procedure

Entries open on Saturday 16 February and close on Friday 4 April. A late entry levy of £300 will apply to all entries received up to 11 April. Entries can be sent by email, fax or post. Entries will only be acknowledged or accepted on receipt of the correct entry fee.

3.2 Numbers of entrants and classes

The maximum number of entries will be 80. Should there be more than this number; entries will be selected on a performance basis.

3.4 Payment details

Under no circumstances will entries be accepted or published until payment of the total entry fee is received or paid by a receipt issued by the competitor's National Sporting Authority. Cheques must be made payable to Cumberland Sporting Car Club Ltd.

3.5 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full to competitors whose entry has not been accepted or less a 20% administration charge if the rally does not take place

The organisers may refund 50% of the entry fee to those competitors who, for reasons of 'force majeure' (duly certified by their ASN) were unable to start the rally and notified to the Entries Secretary no later than 20.00 hrs on 13 April.

4 INSURANCE

4.1 Liability Insurance

The entry fees include the premium to insure competitors and other parties as necessary against Third Party risks whilst taking part in such parts of the rally as are held on private lands or roads specifically closed for the purpose. The indemnity provided under this special insurance is £30,000,000.00 (Thirty million pounds sterling), covering any one incident or occurrence. The insurance cover will come

into effect from the start and will cease at the end of the event or at the moment of retirement, disqualification or exclusion.

4.2 Road Traffic Insurance

Entrants and drivers must have valid insurance covering them against liability for both personal injury to and damage to the property of Third Parties on the public road parts of the event. It is the entrants and drivers responsibility to arrange such insurance and/or to extend or adjust existing insurance as necessary. Entrants and drivers will be required to sign and declare that they are covered by such insurance. Any failure to sign such a declaration may mean that the car in question will not be permitted to start. Competitors requiring Third party Cover to meet the Road Traffic Act requirements on the road sections of the event can apply for this through the scheme operated by Motor Sports Risk Services, a division of Lockton Companies International Ltd. This can be done at documentation where competitors will required to sign a declaration to indicate that they comply with the conditions of the scheme and will pay the appropriate premium.

The basic rate for an International event is £65 (up to 48 hrs duration)

The basic rate for National A and B event is £34 (up to 24 hrs duration)

All new applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Motor Sports Risk Services declaration:-

Over 21 and held a Full Licence for at least 6 months Not more than 1 fault accident in last 3 years

No more than maximum of 6 speeding points on licence No physical or mental disabilities

No other material facts

If able to comply with all above points simply sign on Signing-on form for Insurance

No letter of acceptance will be issued

If unable to comply with any of the above points, complete the Declaration Form itself and forward either to the club or direct to Motor Sports Risk Services prior to the event to allow sufficient time for Letter of Acceptance to be issued. Faxed copies are acceptable The organisers decline liability in any incident caused by or to competitors and the competing cars during the whole of the event. The organisers also decline any liability for breach of the laws and regulations of the UK as covered by the itinerary. Competitors shall be held responsible for any accident or breach of laws in which they may be involved. They shall declare to the organisers particulars of any incident from which liability may arise and shall have no claim against the organisers arising out of any action of the organisers, their servants or officials, during the course of rally.

Entrants and drivers will be required to sign the following declaration

I declare that

1 I have been given an opportunity to read the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association and, if any, the Supplementary Regulations for this event and agree to be bound by them. I declare that I am physically and mentally fit to take part in the event and I am competent to do so. I acknowledge that I understand the nature and type of the competition and the potential risk inherent with motor sport and agree to accept that risk. Further I understand that all persons having any connection with the promotion and/or organisation and/or conduct of the event are insured against loss or injury caused through their negligence.

2 To the best of my belief the driver(s) possess the standard of competence necessary for an event of the type to which this entry relates that the vehicle entered is suitable and roadworthy for the event having regard to the course and the speeds which may be reached.

3 The use of the vehicle hereby entered is covered by insurance as required by the law which is valid for such part of this event as shall take place on roads as defined by the law.

4 I understand that should I at any time of this event be suffering from any disability whether permanent or temporary which is likely to affect prejudicially my normal control of the vehicle, I may not take part unless I have declared any such disability to the ASN which has, following such a declaration, issued a licence which permits me to do so.

5 Any application form for a licence which was signed by a

person under 18 years of age was countersigned by that person's parent/guardian/guarantor, whose full name and address has been given.

6 If I am the parent/guardian/guarantor of the driver. I understand that I shall have the right to be present during any procedure being carried out under the Supplementary regulations issued for this event and the general regulations of the MSA.

7As the Parent/ Guardian/Guarantor 'I Confirm that I have acquainted myself with the MSA General Regulations, agree to pay any appropriate charges and fees pursuant to those Regulations (to include any appendices thereto) and hereby agree to be bound by those regulations and submit myself without reserve to the consequences resulting from those regulations (and any subsequent alteration thereof). Further, I agree to pay as liquidated damages any fines imposed upon me up the maximum set out in Part 3, Appendix 3 of the 2008 MSA Yearbook.

Note: Where the parent/guardian/guarantor is not present there must be a representative who must produce a written and signed authorisation to so act from the parent/guardian/guarantor as appropriate.

5 ADVERTISING

5.1 Restrictions

Competitors are allowed to affix any kind of advertising to their cars provided that:

It is authorised by the National laws, FIA Regulations, Championship and MSA regulations

It is not likely to give offence

It is not political or religious in nature

It does not encroach upon the space reserved for plates and competitors numbers

It is does not interfere with the crew's vision

It does not contain tobacco advertising

5.2 Organisers advertising

The organisers may provide optional advertising that is to be placed in a prominent side facing position on each side of the car. Refusal to carry the optional advertising – twice the entry fee

6 TYRES

6.1 Pirelli control tyre refer to Article 7 of the BRC regulations

7 FUEL

The only permitted fuel will be the Control fuel - refer to Article 8 BRC Regulations

7.1 Order Procedure

As defined in BRC Championship Regulations Article 8

7.2 Distribution during the Rally

See BRC Championship Regulations Article 8

All International competitors

Re-fuelling of the competing car may only take place in refuel zones designated by the Organisers as per Article part 12.6 of the FIA General Prescriptions. Only supply companies with BRC approved dispensing equipment and proof of insurance will be permitted in the re-fuelling area.

8 RECONNAISSANCE

8.1 Procedure for registration

Competitors must signify on the entry form their intention to take part in the Recce. Recce documentation (combined with Event Documentation) will be Rally HQ from 08.00 to 09.00 on Friday 18 April. A Road Book covering the Recce road sections will be issued with Final Instructions. The organisers strongly advise competitors to check with their Insurers that they have valid insurance cover to take part in the Recce. The organisers will also take details of the Recce vehicle.

8.2 Schedule.

Recce will take place between 09.30 to 16.30 on Friday 18 April. Recce will start at Rally HQ – 86/487605. The organisers may, at the discretion and with the agreement of the Stewards of the Meeting refuse a start to any competitor who is found to have carried out unauthorised practice or reconnaissance over the route of any Special Stage. Those living on or who may have cause to drive along a Special Stage for whatever reason should inform the organisers in advance

8.3 Specific restrictions

8.3.1 Cars to be used for the Recce must comply with Art 14.3 of

- the FIA General Prescriptions.
- **8.3.2** At Recce Documentation competitors will be issued with Recce Identification Plates, which must be fitted to the side windows of the vehicle. Failure to do so will be deemed to be a breach of Recce Regulations.
- **8.3.3** There is a speed limit of 30 mph (48 kph) on Special Stages during Recce. Calibrated Radar speed checking equipment will be used.
- 8.3.4 Vehicles will proceed through the Special Stages at intervals of approximately 20 seconds. This interval must be maintained through out each Stage. Competitors disrupting the flow of the convoy in a way which, in the opinion of the organisers, causes or could cause danger to other competitors will be penalised. Drivers may proceed through the Special Stages only when instructed by officials. Unless advised to the contrary each vehicle and competitor may traverse each stage only twice. Judges of Fact will be observing driving standards. Competitors are reminded that the roads to be used as Special Stages are not closed to other traffic during the Recce and that Forestry Commission operations will be in pr ogress in certain areas.
- **8.3.5** The penalties for contravention of the Supplementary Regulations regarding Recce are as follows;

First Infringement A verbal warning
Second infringement Fine of £200
Third infringement Start refused

Notification of penalties will be made to competitors at the earliest opportunity. All monetary fines must be paid before any competitor will be allowed to start the rally.

- 8.4 The carrying or fitting of Radar Detection devices during Recce is forbidden. No photographic or video equipment may be carried in Recce vehicles.
- 8.5 Shakedown

This will be **organised and run** by John Parker Associates on Thursday 17 April at a venue TBA in Kielder Forest.

9 ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

9.1 Documents to be presented

Competitors will be required to present their International Competition Licences, Competition Car Log Books and Insurance documentation, where applicable.

11 FEATURES OF THE RALLY

11.1 Ceremonial Start

Prior to the ceremonial start, competitors **must be** in the prestart holding area 30 minutes before their due start time.

11.2 Time card change during the rally

There will be a separate time card for each Day. These will be issued at the start of each Day and collected at the end of each Day.

11.3 Starting system of Special Stages

Each Stage Start will be equipped with an electronic system of lights and digital countdown supported by a manual back up system.

11.4 Early check in at the end of a day

At the end of a Day competitors are allowed to check in in advance of their due time. Competitors arriving early must have their due time entered on the Time Card; those arriving later than their due time must have their actual time of arrival entered.

11.5 Identification of Officials

Officials will be identified by named badges/coloured bibs.

11.6 Super Special Stage

Not used

11.7 Special procedures

Not used

11.8 Removal of car from post event Parc Ferme

Competitors may remove their cars from Post Event Parc Ferme before the declaration of the Final Results provided that they completed the Vehicle Release Form contained in the Road Book, forfeiting their right to defend any protest regarding the eligibility of the car in question. Refer to BRC regs 10.8.

11.9 Starting order and re-start

See BRC Championship Regulations Article 5.

5.2.2. The Damage Declaration and Retirement Form is contained at the rear of the Time Card Book.

12 GRAVEL CARS

Not permitted

12.1 Service Park

Refer to Article 6 of the BRC regulations for Servicing. The standard service area space is 8X8 metres per car for privateer entrants and 10x10 metres for BRC registered crews. **These areas will be strictly controlled.** Additional space is available by prior arrangement with the organisers at a cost of £10 per sq metre. Teams and/or competitors are required to inform the organisers prior to the closing date for entries of any special requirements to service adjacent to other competitors or teams.

13 PRIZES

13.2 Prizes and Cups

13.2.1 General Classification

First Overall Awards to driver and co-driver Second Overall Awards to driver and co-driver Third Overall Awards to driver and co-driver

NB: Winners of overall awards are not eligible for class awards

13.2.3 Additional awards TBA

13.2.4 IRDC Newcomers Award Award to driver and codriver and one year's membership of the IRDC to the driver and co-driver competing on their first International event.

14 FINAL CHECKS

14.1 The Entrant, Driver, Co Driver and one other person who is

expected to have knowledge of the competing car may attend.

14.2 Protest fees

Sum of the protest set by the ASN - £280.

- **14.2.1** If the protest requires the dismantling and re assembly of parts of a car, the claimant must pay an additional deposit of £200.
- **14.2.2** For a protest involving a clearly defined part of the car (engine, transmission, steering, braking system, electrical installation, bodywork etc) deposit of £300.
- **14.2.4** For a protest involving the whole car deposit of £500.
- **14.2.5** The expenses incurred by the work and by the transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest in unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if it is upheld.
- 14.2.6 If the protest is unfounded and if the expenses incurred by the protest (Scrutineering, Transport etc) are higher than the amount of the deposit, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely, if the expenses are less the difference shall be returned to them.

14.3 Appeal Fee

Sum of appeal to the Stewards - £525 Sum for a National appeal (ASN) - £945 Sum for an International appeal (FIA) - 6000 euros

APPENDIX 3

Assistance plates

- 1 All competitors will be issued with one Service plate per competing car. These plates permit access to the Service Area.
- 2 All competitors will be issued with one Auxiliary plate per competing car. These plates allow access to designated

parking adjacent to the Service Area. One additional Auxiliary Plate per entry may be purchased at a cost of £50. As per BRC Regulations 6.14, all Service and Auxiliary plates issued by the event organisers must be affixed to the front of the vehicle at all times during the rally. Any team/competitor that is reported to the organisers for failing to display the plates "affixed to the front of the vehicle" will be fined £500.

- Support plates may be purchased at a cost of £200. Vehicles displaying these plates are allowed into the Service Area only where space allows.
- A Guest Pack consisting of one vehicle pass and four personnel passes can be purchased at a cost of £50. This allows entry to all Special Stage Car Parks.
