3.0 Brief event history

Founded in 1900, Automóvel Club de Portugal (ACP) has always paid a very special attention to motor sport in Portugal, being responsible for the organization of the most important events from the international calendars.

It was no surprise that, in 1967, ACP had put on the road the first edition of the TAP Rally, a competition that in a short notice granted an enormous international prestige and, only six years later, it joined the first World Rally Championship.

TAP Rally, and later Portugal Rally, had been responsible for glorious pages of success in World Championship history, being crowned for five times "The Best Rally in the World" and has been considered in 2000 "The Most Improved Rally of the Year".

After being taken away by FIA from the WRC calendar, the new ACP's board, after President Carlos Barbosa's election, work very hard from 2004 to put Portugal Rally again in the WRC calendar, what has been achieved in 2007, with Algarve roads as scenery.

As a result of the events rotation in the WRC calendar, Portugal Rally has been out of 2008 Championship, but was back in 2009, receiving the unanimous applause from drivers, sporting authorities and Media.

3.1 Brief summary of 2009 edition

Vodafone Rally de Portugal was the fourth event in the 2009 WRC Championship, being eligible for the WRC, PWRC and JWRC Championships.

It was not surprising that it had been one the most entered rallies of the season, with 68 crews starting the event, that met FIA's President, Max Mosley, present at Algarve to watch part of the rally.

From the competitive side, Ford Focus drivers led the rally in the initial stages, first with Henning Solberg and then Jari-Matti Latvala, "star" of an amazing accident that didn't cause any injuries to the crew but cost the retirement of the Ford driver.

The reigning World Champion, Sebastien Loeb (Citroen C4 WRC), then took the lead and never lost it till the arrival, in spite of Mikko Hirvonen (Ford focus WRC) pressure, finishing second at 24,3 seconds, while Dani Sordo (Citroen C4 WRC) closed the podium places.

Portuguese Armindo Araújo (Mitsubishi Lancer Evo IX) won the PWRC, and Polish Michal Kosciuszko (Suzuki Swift) was the fastest among all JWRC entrants.

5.0 ENTRY DETAILS

5.1 Closing date for entries – 27th April 2010

Details concerning the co-driver must be sent prior to 3rd May, 2010, 14.00h

The entry application will only be accepted if accompanied by :

- The total entry fees or by a receipt issued by the competitor's National Sporting Authority
- Photocopies of the competitor and drivers licences as well as photocopies of the driver's passport or identity card
- One passport photo for each member of the crew
- Photocopy of the page of the car homologation form for the entered car

For foreign competitors the entry form must be stamped by the competitor's National Sporting Authority (International Sporting Code Art. 17 and 70) or enclose an authorization letter from their National Sporting Authority giving permission to participate in the Rally of Portugal 2010.

If the entry form application is sent by fax, the original must reach the Organiser at the latest one week after the closing date for entries.

5. FPAK (Portuguese ASN) priority drivers

No entry can be guaranteed before the entries closing date. The Organiser will inform the crews which entry form has been not accepted after this date.

6.0 SERVICE PARK – Algarve Stadium

6.1 Location

The large gravel car Park area in front of the Algarve Stadium has been chosen to host the rally Service Park. It is located only 8 km away from Faro. This will be the only Service Park to be used during the event.

Service Park Coordinates : **N 37° 05' 19.08"** **W 7° 58' 39.31"**

WRC manufacturers, Manufacturer teams, WRC S2000 Cup, J-WRC will have the space recommended by the FIA. Other competitors will have an area of 10m x 10m.

6.2 Access to the Service Park

WRC Teams will be able to access the Service Park from 15.00 noon on Friday 21 May 2010. Should any team need to access the park before this date or should they arrive at night, when the normal access is closed, please contact the Rally Organisers, by e-mail acpmotorsport@acp.pt or call + 351 21 942 91 87 .

From Monday 24th May to Sunday 30th May the Service Park will have a permanent security surveillance. Teams needing extra security surveillance, may use their own companies.

Service vehicles arriving at Service Park on Monday 24th May in the morning, i.e., before the teams have been at the administrative checks to get the corresponding documents and necessary vehicle plates, will be able to access the Park without a plate. From Wednesday 26th May at 12.00 P.M. all vehicles will have to be duly identified with the corresponding plates.

From that moment on there will be an exhaustive control in order to guarantee that all vehicles parked or trying to get access the Service Park carry the necessary plate.

6.3 Available Services

The following services will be available on different locations within the Park :

- General lighting in the whole Service Park
- Chemical toilets for public use
- Waste containers
- Containers for used oils
- General security in the whole Service Park
- Water
